- 1. You should have 36 block sets (that's two squares with wrong sides together)
- 2. You may also have 36 batting squares that are 1 inch smaller than the other squares.
- 3. Place a batting square in between each block pair (if you have batting)
- 4. Sew diagonally through each pair, both directions. (Figure A)
- 5. Arrange in rows of 6
- 6. Sew together each row using a 1/2 inch seam allowance. (Figure B) Repeat until you have 6 rows of 6. Make sure you have all the seams on the same side!



- Now, sew these rows together, making sure to match seams. You can "nest" the seams or sew them open, whichever is easier for you. Just make sure to be consistent throughout! (Figure C)
- 8. To finish the quilt, sew 1/2 inch around the outer edge. (Figure D)
- 9. Now, fringe all the seams and outside edges by **carefully** cutting almost to the seam in quarter inch increments. Trim loose threads and wash!
