- 1. You should have two pieces of flannel of equal size. Make sure that the right sides are together. (Figure A) Anywhere from 6 to 12 inches is a good size.
- 2. Pin short pieces of different colored and textured ribbon folded in half in between the layers of flannel. I usually cut the ribbon about 4 inches long and then fold in half, matching raw edges to edge of flannel.
- 3. Sew about 1/4-1/2 inch seam all around the outside, making sure to leave a 6 inch opening. (Figure B) You can curve the corners or not; it really doesn't matter.
- 4. When you've sewn all the way around, trim your corners and then turn the blanket right side out. The tags should all now be on the outside.
- 5. Press the seam all around. Use your fingers to gently "roll" it out so that the seam is all the way at the edge. (Figure C-A)
- 6. Sew about 1/8 to 1/4 inch from the edge all the way around. This will also close your opening. You can use a decorative stitch if your machine has some. (Figure C-B)
- 7. Mark the center of the blanket with a +. It doesn't have to be big or an exact size. Use white tailor's chalk or some other kind of erasable marking tool.
- 8. Now, sew on that +, making sure to backstitch at each end to lock the stitches. (Figure C-C). You could sew any shape you want in the middle. It just needs to hold the layers together.
- 9. Trim all the loose threads, and you're done! Stand back and admire your work
