I'm going to keep it as very simple, big large print blocks so that he can participate in the process as much as possible. This one will also probably be a pillow-cased quilt so there won't be a need for binding it. He's picked out a fleece backing for it. I may even see if he can help me tie it. That's one I look forward to bringing to Show and Tell!



COMMITTEE REPORTS

Retreat – Gail Schwartz announced that approximately 60 members have signed up for this year's Retreat and that this was the last night in which to sign up.

Quilt Show 2009 – Kemberly Wilshire announced the first quilt show meeting will be held this coming Sunday at her home. She is looking for two volunteers – one to head up Quilt Angels and one to organize the sale of raffle tickets. The show quilt is already in progress.

Community Service – Vice President Sheri Smith announced a sewing day at Schimelpfenig Library on Saturday, February 2nd, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Kits will be provided and the quilts will be given to the Linus Project.

Small Groups – Rhonda Kuntz announced that she is starting a daytime small group and had invitations for several members who attended the New Members' Tea.

Treasurer – Tina Connally gave the Treasurer's Report (for details, see the article in the newsletter) and announced that

there is a raffle quilt that is nearly complete for 2008 ticket sales.

Fat Quarter Lotto – Marla Bradberry announced the winners of this month's drawing: Marlene Dreyer won the black & white fat quarters; Mary Lou Worthen won "Nostalgia" fat quarters; and Eva Tusa won "anything goes" fat quarters. The three categories for next month's lotto are "Spring," "shades of green" and "anything goes."

Newsletter – Tracy Spruell took a quick poll to see how many members would be willing to receive their newsletters electronically and print it themselves. It seemed that a majority of members would consider this cost-saving measure.

Block of the Month – Tracy Spruell announced that the winner of the teapot blocks was Diane Crandall. Next month's block is a pieced martini glass block.

Texas Association of Quilt Guilds – TAQG rep Aggie Meszaros announced that Rally Day '08 would be held on Saturday, July 12th at the Mimosa Lane Baptist Church in Mesquite. She asked that members consider making a mini quilt to donate for their fund-raising efforts. She also said that she would be discussing with the Board an appropriate gift item for the "goodie bags" that are handed out to each attendee.




Block of the Month

Blocks due at the February 2008 guild meeting



Martini Block

12.5" block (12" finished)



Cutting Instructions

White on White

A-1.5" x 6.5" - 4

B—2" x 2" - 8

C—2" x2" - 8

D-3.5"x3.5"" - 8

Martini Rims and Bases

E—1" x 6.5" - 4

F—2"x3.5" - 4


Martini Glass

G— 3.5"x6.5" - 4

Piecing Instructions:

Flying Geese units for the Martini Bases

Place a 2x2 background piece on a 2x3.5 base piece, right sides together. Draw a line down the center of the background fabric. Sew on the line. Cut 1/4" away from the sewn line and press, Repeat for the other side.



Martini Glasses

Repeat steps for the Bases but with the 3.5 x 3.5 squares of background and the 3.5 x 6.5 pieces of martini glass.



Optional Embellishments Ideas: Appliqué an olive or onion in the center or in each glass. Use embroidery floss to create toothpicks.

This month is the Martini block. The colors can be done in your choice of colors with all blocks using a white on white background. All blocks for this year measure 12.5" x 12.5" (12x12 finished). This block is made up of 4 smaller blocks that are put together to form a friendship gathering of martinis!
