Block of the Month



We would like to thank everyone for their dedication and commitment to the success of our Guild by accepting these nominations. In addition, we need to thank those guild members who are either returning to or have volunteered for a committee chair position.

<u>We do however, have two officer positions needing to be filled</u>. One is that of **TREASURER**. As Tina Connolly says, "This is the best job in the guild! Everyone loves you because you have the money\$\$\$." Anyone with a knowledge of or a willingness to learn Quicken is someone we want to hear from. According to Tina, she had "no idea how to use the program when she started as treasurer, but it was real easy to learn." Tina is staying on as Assistant Treasurer to help train the new treasurer and be back-up whenever necessary, however, according to our By-Laws, she can't serve another term as she has already served two years as treasurer. With great support like Tina, an easy computer program that is provided to you, a position that can be done in the comfort of your own home and a minimal amount of meeting time, *what better opportunity to serve your Guild could you ask for*?

The other position needing to be filled is that of **VP OF PROGRAMS.** Sounds overwhelming doesn't it. But let's take a moment to break this down. First, we already have programs scheduled into 2009 which means you don't have to scurry around trying to get someone for June, July, August, September, October, November and December is always our Christmas Program. It's my understanding that we also either have speakers or are in contact with speakers for programs through 2009. So what we're saying here is, there is a lot of lead time to get your feet wet. Joan Wilson has said that she will be more than happy to sit down with whoever volunteers for this position, to show them the ropes. Now, let's look at the rest of what is done with programs. There's the Guild Meeting where the Programs Table is set-up with speaker sales stuff and scheduling members for workshops. Typically the VP has help from friends or volunteers to man the table. The VP makes the introduction of the speaker and may set-up a slide show or something like that. The Guild owns and provides the slide projector. The VP also coordinates the arrival and departure pickup of the speaker at the airport, getting them to and from the hotel for the meeting and workshops, sets up the workshops and ensures the speaker gets fed. It has been our experience that there are lots of members who want to get up close and personal with the speaker and what better way to do that than to volunteer to help the VP with all these activities. As a matter of fact, this would be a GREAT OPPORTUNITY FOR A SMALL GROUP to take on the roll of Programs. Think about it. Your group likes getting together talking about quilting. You all have particular techniques you are especially fond of and love to share that information with your groups members. You like to eat....that's always an important part of your getting together. You like talking about the latest and greatest book you purchased. This would be a wonderful way to put your love of quilting to work for the Guild. One person with the help of your group, could contact possible speakers who you have always wanted to hear. That person would act as the VP handling the contracts. The rest of the group would be the helpers with all the transporting, workshop set-up, speaker table, etc. And to top it off, by doing this, one of your group would be getting that **month's free workshop**. So whether it's an individual with the help of membership volunteers, or a small group wanting to take on this position, let us hear from you! 


<u>AUGUST</u> – Cynthia England

<u>SEPTEMBER</u> – Lisa Erlandson


Quilt historian and appraiser from Greenville will talk to us about historical quilts and orphan blocks.

<u>NOVEMBER</u> – Sally Collins


The master of miniatures! Sally has published several books on precision piecing, miniatures and borders. We are very lucky to have this internationally-known quilter.

Ladybug Block 12.5" block (12" finished)



White on White (background)

A—4.5" x 4.5" - 2 B—4.5" x 2.5" -1 C-1.5" x 1.5" - 2 F—3" x 3" -4 G—2" x 8.5" - 2 I—1.5" x 3" - 2

Lady Bug Shell

G—5" x 8.5" - 2

Black (for ladybug body)

D-2.5" x 4.5" - 1 H—2" x 3" - 2

Lady Bug head

Place a 1.5x1.5 square on one corner of the 2.5x4.5 black. Draw a line down the center of the bg fabric and sew on the line. Cut 1/4" away from the sewn line and press. Repeat for the other corner.


Lady Bug body

Place a 3x3 background square on one corner of the 5x8.5 shell fabric right sides together. Draw a line down the center of the bg fabric and sew on the line. Cut 1/4" away from the sewn line and press. Repeat for the other corner

For the HI unit


Sew the H-I units together to make a 3x3 square. Place the square on the correct corner of the lady bug shell right sides together and draw a diagonal line on the back of the HI unit. Sew on the line. Trim 1/4" away from the sewn line and press to the shell fabric.

Optional Embellishments Ideas: Embroider antennae with pear cotton. Appliqué spots for the ladybug or use buttons!


