President's Message

Hi everyone--

Do you read the fine print? Recently Joan Wilson and I went to a meeting on grant applications with the city of Plano arts group. It was really eye opening to see what is required of applicants and to see some of the other groups asking for grants. In reviewing the information we have to submit for the application, I started reading the fine print of our own organization. Did you realize we are incorporated for tax purposes as an educational organization? Our tax filing status is 501(c)(3)-----it's in our history section of the directory. I guess I had always thought we were associated as a charity organization since we seem to do so much more of that work.

Charity work is a wonderful part of our guild. We need to continue supporting as many groups as we can. However, we also need to be more involved with education—getting the public involved, letting others see the value of working together for a common cause, and letting others see the beauty of our heart's work. Teresa Knode joined the guild this past year and at the Newcomers Tea volunteered to take on the education chair. She may not have realized what she was walking into, but she has jumped in and is getting very involved. Teresa needs your help too. We need to find more educational opportunities. We currently do the Plano International and Blackland Prairie festivals, as well as some free demonstrations at several libraries. There have to be a lot more opportunities. We just need to find them; then step forward to help by displaying our talents.

While going through this grant exercise, I have discovered two things about myself that I'm not terribly happy about. First off, I don't pay enough attention to details. I was not aware of how many people in the guild are working to keep the guild moving forward. None of us should take that for granted. Secondly, I am not inquisitive enough. I should be asking more why's and how's. I'm working on that. I hope you will join me in asking why we aren't doing more for our community and how we can make the guild better. Let's all be part of the solution.

By the way, the grant money comes from the Plano hotel tax. It does not come from the general fund. The city has decided that the taxes paid for staying in hotels here should be used to help draw more people to Plano for as many events as possible. When the city found out how many hits our website was receiving and how many quilters are spending money around the country, they wanted to know why we had not asked for grants before. The city of Plano can see the value of our guild, so let's show them we can make a difference.

Ever wonder who runs for office in our guild? Well, this year you can know more about these talented women thanks to Joan Wilson, who took the time to write up a short bio of each one.

Donna Petrick, President: As a long time member of our Guild, Donna comes to us with a wonderful business and finance acumen. Donna is a recent retiree from Nortel, where she held the position of Project Management Financial Analyst for the past 12 years. Prior to working at Nortel, she worked as Controller as well as other financial positions, for two different companies. She holds a BBA in accounting from Angelo State University and is highly qualified to be President of our Guild. Donna is a resident of Plano and joined the Guild in 1996 after having started quilting in 1993. She has been the VP of Community Services and VP of Media. She is also active in the Quilter's Guild of Dallas and holds the position of Treasurer for the Allen Quilter's Guild.

Julie Brooks, VP Membership: A resident of McKinney and member of our Guild since 2002, Julie comes to us with a background in sales and management in the Pharmaceuticals and Healthcare industries. Julie Schaefer, Secretary: Julie classifies herself as a "lifetime sewer" who started quilting 3 years ago at which time she joined our Guild. 

Purse Bottom: On piece H, mark 2½" in from the left top corner. Cut from this mark to the bottom left corner. (Fig. 1) Repeat on right side. The shape should now be like Fig. 2.

Place the long side of G centered on the newly cut left side of H, right sides together. (Fig. 3) Sew and flip open. Press. Repeat on the right side. Trim to $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x $10\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew F's to sides of G-H.

Clasp: The clasp may be pieced in any manner, or use an embellishment such as a button, frog clasp, silk flower or other item. Use your imagination! To piece as shown, place a J on a K, right sides together, and sew starting at the right angle corner. (Fig. 4) Sew another set of J and K exactly the same way with the pieces oriented in the same direction. Press to the darker. Take the new J-K's, and sew the long sides together, butting the center seams. (Fig. 5) Press. Trim to 1½" square.

Purse Top: If you are not making a pieced clasp, just add E's to each end of piece I. For pieced clasp, cut I in half, to have two $3\frac{3}{4}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " strips. Sew one on each side of the pieced clasp. Press. Trim to $7\frac{1}{2}$ " long, centering the clasp. Add E's to each end. Press.

Handle: Place a D square on the end of M, right sides together. Sew from one corner to other of D. (Fig. 6) Flip open, press and trim excess fabric. Place a D square on the other end of M. Sew to the opposite corners than you did on the previous square. Flip open, press and trim. Once you are sure the triangle corners are going in opposite directions, trim excess fabric underneath the triangle corners to ½".







