



Tip of the Month

Here's a "bunny" that doesn't eat carrots: it's a small piece of fabric - maybe an inch square - used at each end of your chain piecing. Here's how you do it: cut a small scrap and fold it over. Start your sewing here. Feed all your like pieces through the machine and end with a second "bunny." This saves time, thread, and often helps your machine not to "bind up" and catch the thread in a wrong way. You can sew over it again and again and it just keeps working for you!

Block of the Month

August Block

Knotty Gírls

Batik Basket Bonanza—Basket #2

All the blocks this year will be pieced baskets made of a good quality batik and white-on-white as the background. All blocks will be 10 inches finished and 10 1/2 inches unfinished. Be careful with your 1/4 inch seams and your pressing so that the blocks that are won are uniform in size.


Cutting instructions:

- *Basket* (batik—your color choice)
- D—cut 1 square 4 7/8" cut in half on diagonal
- F—cut 4 squares 2 7/8"
- G—cut 2 squares 2 7/8" cut in half on diagonal

Background (white-on-white)

A—cut 2 rectangles 2 1/2" X 6 1/2" B—cut 1 square 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" C—cut 2 squares 4 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal E—cut 4 squares 2 7/8" X 2 7/8"

To make E/F half-square triangles: layer E + F squares, right sides together. On back of lighter square, draw a diagonal line. Stitch a scant 1/4" on both sides of drawn line. Cut in half on drawn line. This will yield 2 half-square triangles (or you may use triangle paper or any other technique to yield 8 total half-square triangles that are 2" finished). Follow the diagram below to assemble the block.
