President's Message

Hi everyone--

I was so excited to see that so many of you completed the guild survey. Thank you for your participation. The results are 49 pages long as it contains lots of comments. Tina Connolly has done a great job of summarizing the results and will have the summary in this newsletter. In the future months, we will be addressing the different aspects of the results.

One of the first things we are addressing is the length of the business portion of meeting. We certainly want to have plenty of time for the speaker. Therefore more of our business and activity notices will be posted in the newsletter instead of verbalizing them at the meeting. I hope all of you are already reading the newsletter monthly, but it will become more important as we move business notices to it. Your opinion counts. Let the board know if this works.

Of course, as with all surveys and polls, we have both extremes of opinions. Knowing that we have over 200 members to please, we will do our best to meet the expectations of as many of you as we can. We received a good number of constructive suggestions for the guild. Plus, a number of comments were made on the improvement in welcoming guests. Terri Mendelow and others have done a wonderful job with hospitality. Remember that hospitality belongs to all of us. Help make each other feel welcome at the meetings.

Another major element of the survey was the meeting location. A good number of you would like to see us move back towards the middle of Plano instead of being on the west side. Some of you may not remember that the Pitman Creek Church of Christ wanted us out of their building and raised our rent to \$300 a month. That said, the church has since split up and may again be receptive to outsiders meeting there. We currently pay \$50 a month which helps cover set-up cost. Joan Wilson has been looking for new sites, but it is a slow process. She would certainly appreciate help in finding a new location. Let her know if you are willing to help out.

There was one section of the survey that is very hard to address. A number of comments were made about people saving seats for their groups, asking people to move and generally excluding others. In the past we have asked that you not save more than one extra seat.........didn't work. People come to guild to be with their friends. All I can do is ask that you be aware that others want to sit close also. Maybe they don't know anyone at the meeting. Ask them to join your group for the evening.

Again, thank you for taking time for the survey. Continue to let us know how we can better serve the guild. You don't have to wait for a survey. You can always call me.

Board Meeting HighlightsJulie Schaefer

The August 11th board of officers meeting was called to order at 7:20 PM by President Donna Petrick in the Haggard Library. There were 7 members present only 4 of which were voting members. No quorum existed. With the addition of another executive officer at 7:25 PM a quorum was established.

The vacant position of Historian was again discussed. The position requires someone with photographic/editing skills.

Tina Connolly VP-Media suggested that ad rates for the newsletter be lowered and that a column of classified ads (3 lines free) be included in the newsletter. The concept of classifieds was accepted but not that the ad rates be lowered.

Alex Anderson will be a solo speaker at a special seminar on Tuesday evening, Sept. 16th at the Richardson Civic Center. Joan Wilson will be selling the tickets for \$20.00 through the guild starting this coming general meeting on the 14th. Individually the tickets can be bought at either of the Bernina stores for \$25.00.

Tina Connolly reviewed the guild member survey. The total survey – 49 pages – can be obtained through the guild web site. Tina presented the results. The results were discussed and ideas were presented. The board determined that it would be beneficial for the total membership to have access to the survey analysis through the newsletter. We will continue to look for a more convenient meeting place as well as addressing other concerns of the membership. The results will be ongoing points of consideration. Another recommendation for the newsletter was that the form for "Show and Tell" be included. This will give members an opportunity to be prepared instead of rushing at the meeting. Having a Yahoo Plano Chat Room for the benefit of the members was another suggestion.

Terri Anderman discussed the upcoming retreat that is presently planned for Tanglewood. We continue to have issues with electricity at Tanglewood and Terri is concerned with the bad economy that we may not have at least 30 double rooms (60 people) as per agreement in the contract. The price has gone up \$10 again this year. The cost is now \$335.00 per person for food and lodging during the retreat. We have until Aug. 19th to cancel the contract. Jan. 19th is the guarantee date for number of reserved rooms. Terri discussed other places that the retreat could be held such as Our House in Milford. After discussion it was generally decided that we should keep the contract with Tanglewood as is. It might be beneficial to see a raise of hands as to how many people present at the general meeting are planning on attending retreat. Helen Wilems will be the new VP-Membership along

Raffle Quilt: Tina Connolly spun all the tickets in the basket and with visitor Kim Carder picking; guild member Sara Lee won the quilt.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:35 for the program.

After laundering fabric, fold in half lengthwise;
then fold in half lengthwise again. Now accordion pleat in about 8" folds. This makes it
easier to cut from your yardage (without unfolding
all of it) and also gives you a quick way of gauging
how much yardage you have left
(each fold is about a quarter yard).

2009 Auction Guidelines

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Mini quilts:

- Must be no longer than 24" on any side
- Must be hand or machine quilted
- May be any shape, color or pattern
- May be pieced, appliquéd, embroidered or all three
- A 2" sleeve is required
- Attaching a label with the Guild name and show date is preferred
- Holiday quilts sell really well
- Landscapes, portraits, still life and "artsy" quilts also sell well
- A pieced mini-quilt should consist of multiple blocks
 4" or smaller
- Be creative and have fun!

Purses/Totes:

- May be any size
- May be pieced or appliquéd
- Decorative stitching, beading and quilting is preferred
- Make your purse have "purse personality"
- Make your design irresistible
- Be creative and have fun!

Programs & Workshops

Donna Lobelson

We have a change in program for September. Lisa Erlandson is going to be a new grandmother and decided to stay closer to home for the event. We'll reschedule her for next year, maybe September, if our meeting doesn't interfere with a "first birthday" party.

September meeting: we are going to work on Christmas stockings so come prepared.

There are numerous tasks to choose from, so pick your favorite, bring your tools and get ready to have some fun. If you want to sew, bring your machine. If you want to iron, bring your iron and an ironing surface. Pattern tracers will need permanent markers. Bring fabric scissors to cut out the stockings. Rotary cutter, ruler (12"x12" or 12"x 6") and matt are needed to cut the fabric before tracing the pattern. The guild will bring the extension cords and power strips used for classes, but you can never have too many, so if you have one handy bring it.

Workshop: Achieving Quality Workmanship

Friday, November 14, 2008 Location: Legacy Bank

Time: 9:00 to 4:00 with a break for lunch

This Lecture/No Sew class will focus on how to achieve quality workmanship and precision sewing in any size or scale based on my book, "Mastering Precision Piecing."

I will illustrate, explain and/or demonstrate my approach on choosing color and fabric as well as a variety of techniques including how to accurately rotary cut, accurate 1/4" seam allowance, template making, y-seam construction, various triangle techniques, how to measure and monitor your own work and more. Note-taking supplies are all you need. If you are interested in knowing how to improve your sewing skills, this is the class for you! Although this class is based on my book it is not required for class. *All Skill Levels Welcome*

Workshop: Pieced Baskets

Saturday, November 15, 2008

Location: Plano Chamber of Commerce Time: 9:00 to 4:00 with a break for lunch

This class will focus on precision sewing, quality workmanship and multiple half-square triangle techniques to create a lovely basket block in two different sizes (1-7/8" and 3-1/8"). Students can choose either one or both sizes, depending on their skill level. Class time is spent between lecture, explanation, demonstration and student sewing time. A handout for the project is included.

Several guild members recently participated in the Children's Medical Center pre grand opening by working on a crayon quilt project with employees of the medical center. The function was an open house for the hospital's employees prior to the grand opening for the public. It was a wonderful turnout and everyone enjoyed the event. We have enough colored blocks to make 5 quilts to be hung in waiting rooms and offices at the hospital. A big thanks goes out to the 2 daughters of LaDawn Dalley and Juanita Desplas who helped for over 2 hours tracing figures on the muslin for the hospital employees to color. These programs would not be possible without our members volunteering. Thank you all so much.

Our summer Night Owls program is continuing for one more month. On Tuesday Sept. 9, 2008, we are having a Christmas Stocking workshop. Space for sewing is limited, but we also need help with cutting and pressing. Please contact LaDawn Dalley or Teresa Knode if you are interested in attending this function at the Paar Library.

It's not too early to start thinking about volunteering for the International Festival, Saturday, October 4, 2008. We need help in 2 hour shifts to help with the crayon project and redwork blocks. We will have signup sheets at the guild meeting, or you can contact Teresa Knode or Sheri Smith directly.

In July we donated 21 quilts to The Children's Advocacy Center and 17 quilts to the Rape Crisis Center. In August we donated 19 quilts to the Rape Crisis Center, 6 quilts, 6 afghans, 1 flannel receiving blanket and 25 crocheted caps to Newborns in Need, and 12 quilts to the Children's Advocacy Center. Survey Analysis Tina Connolly

The survey is 49 pages long and represents the opinions of 150 guild members, 75% of our current membership.

Who took the survey? 89 of you only belong to the Plano guild. 58 of you belong to 2 or more guilds with 3 of you belonging to 5 or more guilds. Many of you are highly educated and work outside the home in professional positions. You have many hobbies and interests besides quilting. 87 of the people who took the survey are 55 and over. Two of you are male. 65% of you have been quilting for more than 10 years and you consider yourselves to be intermediate to advanced quilters.

What do you like? Most of you love the guild just like it is. You chose the QGP for the national speakers, to learn more about quilting, to meet people, and for friendship in that order. 50 of you joined for an outlet for community service. Most of you think the guild is very friendly. Our small groups are good and bad. They are good because you have your friends with you at the meetings. They are bad because it appears we have cliques to new members and visitors. You believe that everyone has personal responsibility in the area of making friends (it goes both ways). A few of you think smaller guilds are friendlier and have speakers that are more to your liking. Some of you really love alternative programs like having a community service sewing night instead of a speaker. Some of you wish our meetings were more organized. Most of you think that the number (6-9) speakers a year is about right. And you like having a quilt show every other year which most of you happily participated in.

Why don't members come to meetings? 91 responses

- You are incredibly busy with your families, your jobs and your seeking higher education
- You don't like to drive the long distance to the meeting or drive that distance at night
- You find the meetings too long/boring or you aren't interested in the speakers

Where would you rather meet? 53 responses

- Closer to Central Expressway
- Closer to Preston or Coit Road

How can we maintain a friendly atmosphere?

- Be friendly yourself
- Continue with the greeters/hospitality
- Wear nametags
- Do fun things like icebreakers, etc.

How can we facilitate small group formation?

- Have a Bee table at every meeting (this answer was overwhelmingly #1)
- Join a community service group or education

What would make you feel more welcome?


- Assign a buddy to new members

- Have drinks or snacks
- Have a calendar in the newsletter

The bottom-line of the survey, in my opinion, is that we are a diverse and opinionated group bound together by the love of quilting and the desire for friendship. The Quilters Guild of Plano is doing a good job meeting the needs of its members. We can always improve and this survey will help us do that.

Thanks to everyone who took the survey because without your opinions we would not know our weaknesses and our strengths in such a way that is productive to our guild. And thanks to Beverly Geise for her hard work putting the survey on the web and collating the answers.

Batik Basket Bonanza—Basket #3

All the blocks this year will be pieced baskets made of a good quality batik and white-on-white as the background. All blocks will be 10 inches finished and 10 1/2 inches unfinished. Be careful with your 1/4 inch seams and your pressing so that the blocks that are won are uniform in size. In this block, add the G pieces after the E/F are assembled in the large triangle.

Cutting instructions:

Basket (batik—your color choice)

F—cut 5 squares 2 7/8"

G—cut 3 squares 2 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

Background (white-on-white)

A—cut 2 rectangles 2 1/2" X 6 1/2"


B—cut 1 square 2 1/2" X 2 1/2"

C—cut 1 square 6 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

D—cut 1 square 4 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

E—cut 5 squares 2 7/8" X 2 7/8"

To make E/F half-square triangles: layer E + F squares, right sides together. On back of lighter square, draw a diagonal line. Stitch a scant 1/4" on both sides of drawn line. Cut in half on drawn line. This will yield 2 half-square triangles (or you may use triangle paper or any other technique to yield 8 total half-square triangles that are 2" finished). Follow the diagram below to assemble the block.




