

A vote was taken and the minutes were accepted as written. Karen Hawkins moved that the treasurers report be accepted as written in the last newsletter. Debbie Skorepa seconded the motion. A vote was taken and the treasurer's report was accepted as written

**Old Business:** Joan Wilson was available to give the prepaid tickets to Alex Anderson's presentation. Sheri asked for any old business that needed to be discussed. There was none.

**New Business:** The next board meeting will be Monday October 6<sup>th</sup> at the Davis Library on Independence. - Attaching a label with the Guild name and show date is preferred
- Holiday quilts sell really well
- Landscapes, portraits, still life and "artsy" quilts also sell well
- A pieced mini-quilt should consist of multiple blocks 4" or smaller
- Be creative and have fun!

#### Purses/Totes:

- May be any size
- May be pieced or appliquéd
- Decorative stitching, beading and quilting is preferred
- Make your purse have "purse personality"
- Make your design irresistible
- Be creative and have fun!

Workshop: Achieving Quality Workmanship

This Lecture/No Sew class will focus on how to achieve quality workmanship and precision sewing in any size or scale based on my book, "Mastering Precision Piecing." I will illustrate, explain and/or demonstrate my approach on choosing color and fabric as well as a variety of techniques including how to accurately rotary cut, accurate 1/4" seam allowance, template making, y-seam construction, various triangle techniques, how to measure and monitor your own work and more. However, the cruise, the quilting and the companionship were wonderful. I'll show you my finished projects at the next guild meeting. The adventure was in getting home.

Carnival took us to New Orleans, where everyone could make whatever arrangements to go home or stay on the ship and go back to Houston, arriving on Friday, Sept 19th. Our four night cruise turned into nine nights. A bunch of our group decided to fly back to Dallas from New Orleans. ## Spotlight: Marcí Baker Brooks Wilson

Marci Baker is known to quite a few of the Quilters Guild of Plano's "old timers." She is a former member of our guild who is co-owner (with Sara Nephew) of a quilting enterprise called "Alicia's Attic." She is known for taking complicated traditional blocks and breaking them down a new way so that new strip piecing methods can be used. Her series of books "Not Your Grand-mother's<sup>TM</sup> Quilts" all focus on traditional quilts made easy and fun.

Her newest book, shown on the front page, is "Not Your Grandmother's<sup>TM</sup> Log Cabin. Using a ruler that helps the quilter to easily cut the diamond shapes, she takes the traditional square log cabin block and turns it on its ear.

Marci is a native of Dallas and has been making quilts since she was nine. In high school, she sewed most of her clothes and is a self-taught quilter. She began teaching quilting in 1989 for her local quilt guilds and shops. In 1993 she started Alicia's Attic with the idea to combine her love of math (she holds two degrees in math) with her love of quilting. Marci's sewing skills and math abilities allow her to visualize the blocks in a new way - and the results are equally as stunning as quilts taking twice as long to make the traditional way. Thank goodness she's done the work for us!

Marci has also invented several tools to help make quilting easier. Her "Know Before You Sew<sup>TM</sup>" solution cards take common problems quilters encounter, and provide easy-to-understand solutions.

Enthusiasm and inspiration for quilting can be seen throughout her lectures, workshops, and books. She has been featured in numerous magazines and on Home and Garden TV's "Simply Quilts," on NBC's "The Jane Pauley Show."


# **Community Service**Sheri Smith

#### Batik Basket Bonanza—Basket #4

All the blocks this year will be pieced baskets made of a good quality batik and white-on-white as the background. All blocks will be 10 inches finished and 10 1/2 inches unfinished. Be careful with your 1/4 inch seams and your pressing so that the blocks that are won are uniform in size. In this block, add the G pieces after the E/F are assembled in the large triangle.

Cutting instructions:

*Basket* (batik—your color choice)

F—cut 6 squares 2 7/8"

D—cut 1 square 4 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

G—cut 1 square 2 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

Background (white-on-white)


A—cut 2 rectangles 2 1/2" X 6 1/2"

B—cut 1 square 2 1/2" X 2 1/2"

C—cut 1 square 4 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

E—cut 6 squares 2 7/8" X 2 7/8"

To make E/F half-square triangles: layer E + F squares, right sides together. On back of lighter square, draw a diagonal line. Stitch a scant 1/4" on both sides of drawn line. Cut in half on drawn line. This will yield 2 half-square triangles (or you may use triangle paper or any other technique to yield 8 total half-square triangles that are 2" finished). Follow the diagram below to assemble the block.




