President's Message

Hi everyone--

This month I have several topics to cover that don't necessarily depend on each other. But I want to discuss them.

Collectively as a guild, we have forgotten a very important part of our favorite "work." We didn't make anniversary quilts for our 20th and 25th anniversaries of the guild. We have quilts from the 10th and 15th years, which we display at our quilt shows and various other functions. With our next show being August of 2009, it would be wonderful to see two new quilts exhibited that belong to the guild. So consider this a challenge – produce these two by next August! The one for the 25th can already be designed if you use the design for the show pin. With so many talented quilters and small groups in the guild, this should not be a hardship on anyone. Let the board know which one you want to make. I'll contact Cheryl Morschauser about bringing the two quilts we have to the December meeting so everyone can look at them to see what we already have.

Preparing for the anniversary pins this last meeting brought up the discussion about the quilts. It was wonderful to have so many people receiving the pins. Wouldn't it be great to add as many new members from the 2009 show year as we added back in 1999 and 1995 show years? Please invite your friends to join. Encourage former members to come back and join the fun. We have some great programs lined up. Also, if you were not at guild to receive your pin, I will have them again in November. Or you can contact me about getting yours.

I don't know how many of you watch Fons and Porter's *Love of Quilting*. I record it and then watch whenever I have time. The show from this past weekend was about reproduction fabric made for all the antique quilts stored at the museum in Williamsburg. So, of course, it brought to mind my request for people to come forward to work with the guild to record the quilt history of our area. I haven't heard from any of you, but I'm still hopeful that some of you will want to get involved in this activity.

The board has been addressing items from the survey at our meetings. And I want to keep you informed. One of the main points listed was the meeting place for the monthly meeting. Joan Wilson has worked on this one a great deal, contacting many places to see if we could fit into their schedule of use of their buildings. A number of them don't have room for this size group, or they charge too much for us or the second Thursday night is already booked. Some didn't return multiple calls. It turns out that we still have a pretty good deal at our current location. We only pay \$50 a month for set up. They provide the sound system. And as long as we are out of the building by 9:00 pm, they are pretty happy with us. If anyone else wants to look for another place, please let us know, but at this point, we look to be staying put.

September TAQG meeting was about community service. Several guilds reward members for volunteer hours with pins, etc. Donna would like for Plano to do something. Motion passed, but rules will need to be firmed up before we go forward.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

Note-taking supplies are all you need. If you are interested in knowing how to improve your sewing skills, this is the class for you! *All Skill Levels Welcome*

Pieced Baskets

Time: 9:00 to 4:30 with a break for lunch

This class will focus on precision sewing, quality workmanship and multiple half-square triangle techniques to create a lovely basket block in two different sizes (1-7/8" and 3-1/8"). Students can choose either one or both sizes, depending on their skill level. Class time is spent between lecture, explanation, demonstration and student sewing time. A handout for the project is included. *Skill Level: Very Confident Beginner and Beyond*

JANUARY: In January Linda Reynolds of the East Texas Research Center will share with us her knowledge about the history of east Texas quilts. 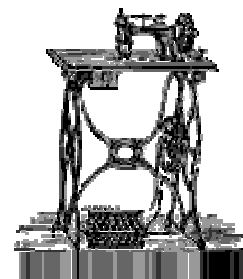

Block of the Month

November Block

Knotty Girls

Batik Basket Bonanza—Basket #5

All the blocks this year will be pieced baskets made of a good quality batik and white-on-white as the background. All blocks will be 10 inches finished and 10 1/2 inches unfinished. Be careful with your 1/4 inch seams and your pressing so that the blocks that are won are uniform in size. In this block, add the G pieces after the E/F are assembled in the large triangle.

Cutting instructions:

Basket (batik—your color choice)

C—cut 1 square 6 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

F—cut 4 squares 2 7/8"

G—cut 1 square 2 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

Background (white-on-white)

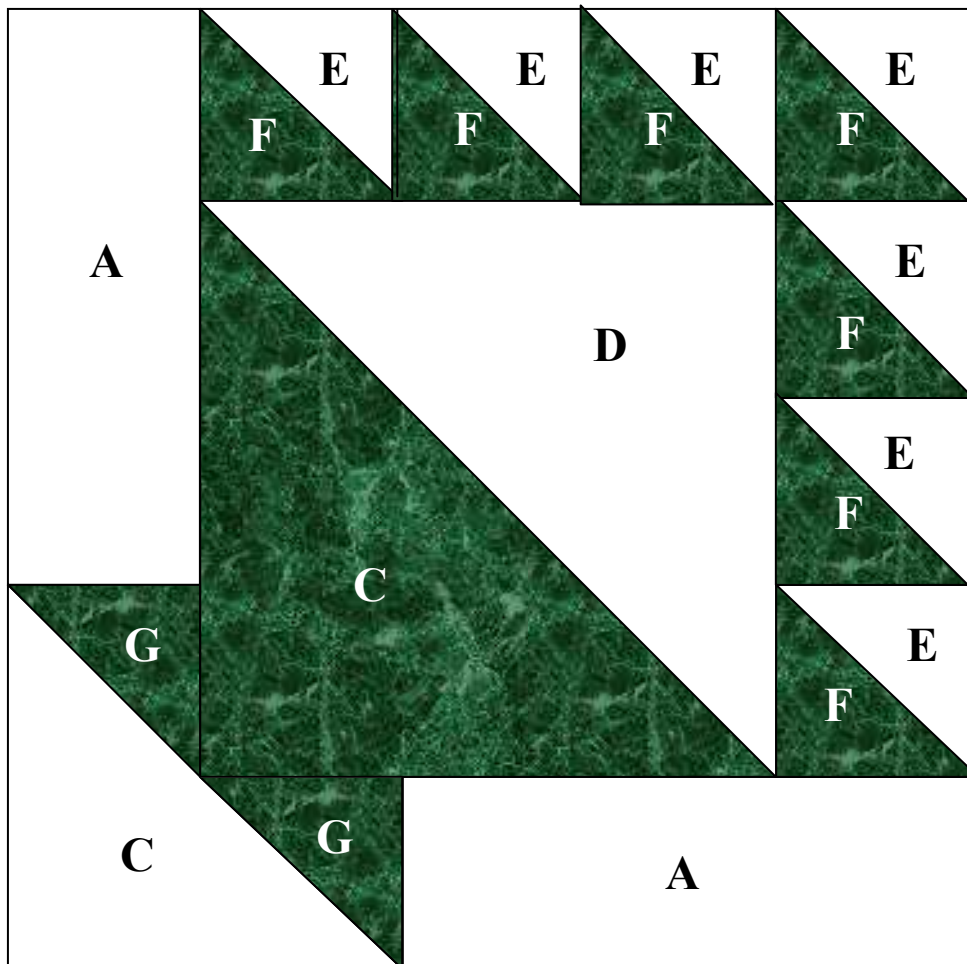
A—cut 2 rectangles 2 1/2" X 6 1/2"

B—cut 1 square 4 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

D—cut 1 square 6 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

E—cut 4 squares 2 7/8" X 2 7/8"

To make E/F half-square triangles: layer E + F squares, right sides together. On back of lighter square, draw a diagonal line. Stitch a scant 1/4" on both sides of drawn line. Cut in half on drawn line. This will yield 2 half-square triangles (or you may use triangle paper or any other technique to yield 8 total half-square triangles that are 2" finished). Follow the diagram below to assemble the block.

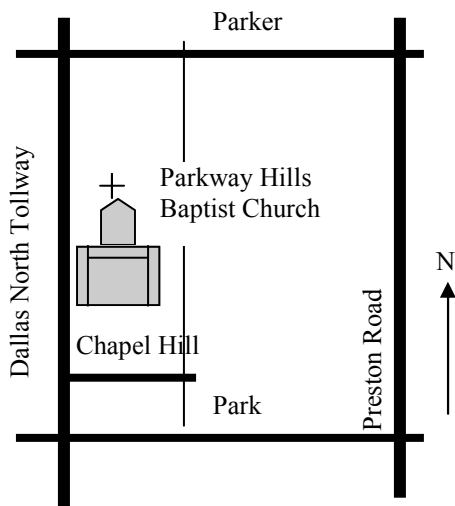
