FEBRUARY 12, 2009 MINUTES - Julie Schaefer

President Donna Petrick called the general meeting of the Quilters Guild of Plano to order at 6:55 p.m. Brooks Wilson moved to approve the minutes of the December 2008 meeting as written in the guild newsletter and Debbie Skorepa seconded. The motion passed unanimously. The Treasurer's report as written in the newsletter was approved with a motion by Sheri Smith and second by Donna Lobelson.

Old Business: There was no old business discussed.

New Business: The next board meeting of the guild will be March 9th at the Haggard Library on Coit, north of Park Boulevard. Everyone is welcome to attend. Anniversary pins that have not been picked up can be obtained at the membership table at the entrance or by calling Helen Wilems. Service bars will be awarded in December of this year. Members must have at least 30 hours of volunteer time spent working for the guild beginning in January of this year. There will be no carry-over hours from last year. You must log in your hours monthly in the binder kept by Karen Christoffer. Today over 200 fabulous guilts were delivered to Fisher House by seven guilds in the Dallas area. Beverly Geise is working hard at changing the appearance of our web site. The Katy Quilters Guild is having their show, "Threads in Time" on February 20-21. The Quilter Bee fabric store in Princeton will give a small amount of refund to our guild for any purchases made by our members. TAQG Rally Day will be held Saturday, July 11th at the *Mimosa Baptist Church* in Mesquite. Sharon Schamber will be the speaker and will also be giving 3 classes with 20 enrollees per class. Use the home page web address of the TAQG of www.texasassociationofguiltguilds.org. Download the enrollment form for any class that you are interested in taking and mail it in. There will be a lottery for the 20 peo-ple accepted into each class starting March 15th. Seven members agreed to be on the nominating committee: Brooks Wilson, Diane Crandell, Debbie Skorepa, Karen Hawkins and Margaret Schafer will be regular members, Nanette Gaskey and Germaine Reconnu will be alternates.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Plano Quilt Show 2009: Kemberly Wilshire announced that the raffle quilt is finished. It was pieced by the *Binding Friends* friendship group and quilted by Karen Nelson. The title of the quilt is "Indigo Friendship." We will be asking bees and members to go to various guild meetings and fabric stores in the area to show the quilt and sell raffle tickets. Every member will be sent through the mail a packet of 24 raffle tickets. Each ticket will cost \$1.00. If someone buys 5 tickets they will get a 6th ticket free. Each member has the responsibility to 1) sell the tickets and either send the money (in the form of a check to QGP) along with any unsold tickets and filled out ticket stubs to QGP or hand them in at the general meeting. No money will be accepted without the stubs; 2) buy all the tickets yourself for \$20.00 and return money and stubs or 3) return all tickets back to the guild.

Fat Quarter Lotto: Marla Bradberry announced that there was a "Free for All" since we had not had a lotto the last 2 months. Julie Schaefer, Rhonda Kuntz and Janet Plotkin each won many fat quarters. The categories for March are "pastels and baby animals," April categories are "floral and shades of yellow," May categories are "bright colors and fruits and veggies." Each month there will also be the category of "anything goes."

Membership and Nine Patch: Terri Anderman announced that we had 58 members

present with two guests and three new members: Sherry Mitchell, Joyce Hill and Kim Hyatt. One hundred nine patches have been sent to Bobby Jean Scott who is moving to Kansas, Barbara Martinez moving to Tennessee and Diane Crandell moving to Arkansas.

Block of the Month: Sheri Smith won the December blocks, Debbie Skorepa won the January blocks and Diane Crandell won the February blocks. March's block pattern will be available in the newsletter and on the guild website.

Show and Tell: Door prizes were awarded and Karen Hawkins facilitated as members presented their quilts. Six of the quilts were those made during community service at the Plano Sewing Center on the second Tuesday of every month from 10:00 to 5:00. You can come and go, as you are able. If you want to attend this quilting group please tell Karen Christoffer at <u>karen.christoffer@tx.rr.com</u>. Everyone is welcome. The meeting was adjourned at 7:30. Donna Lobelson announced the shops that were present and the map that showed where they were located.





Undercover in a Material World. She has produced a "crazy quilt" in praise of the million Americans who devote endless hours to creating bedcovers or works of art from small pieces of fabric. Stitched together from her own discovery of the world of competitive quilting at the 2002 International Quilt Festival in Houston and her interviews with a spectrum of quilters, embellished with the frequent sewing pun, the book combines the exuberance of quilters with illustrations of some of their creations.

Elizabeth Patton Crockett's story begins with her father, Robert Patton, providing wagons and supplies during the American Revolution to the Overmountain Men on their way to the Battle of Kings Mountain. The book contains numerous photos and illustrations of battle scenes and every-day life of the time period.

As **Scraps of Life** moves you through the beautiful blocks and antique fabric galleries of Elizabeth's Original Quilt Top, you catch glimpses of the joys of frontier life and the sorrows and hardships that followed the deaths of each of her husbands.

Elizabeth's story ends with her own death, after a morning walk on January 31, 1860, in Acton, Texas.

The **Scraps of Life** includes complete instructions for making her 1850s Postage Stamp Quilt on Point, family genealogy and descendant photos of the Pattons, Patton-Crocketts and Crockett-Finleys.



TAQG is busy with preparations for Rally Day this year. Sharon Schamber will be the guest speaker and will also have three workshops. TAQG President's Meeting - Joan Wilson

One of the benefits of our TAQG membership are the bi-monthly meetings the organization has where there are "secondary meetings," which are established to cover a variety of topics that affect all Quilt Guilds. During the January meeting, they covered a session for treasurers, community service chairs, secretaries and presidents. Our TAQG rep was out-of-town, so Donna Petrick, President, filled in for her. Shirley Weaver, my Assistant Treasurer filled in for me, Sheri Smith covered Community Service, Julie Schaefer handled the Secretaries meeting and I filled in for Donna at the President's session.

What I discovered is that our Guild is doing a *really great job*. (Really I already knew this.)

Several of the guilds don't have insurance coverage. They weren't aware of why they need it or how to go about getting it. We have had coverage for years. It is required by facilities where we hold our meetings and quilt show. Naturally those of us who have been doing this shared our experience with them.

Many of the guilds are finding that publishing and mailing a monthly newsletter is a major financial drain on their funds. They are wrestling with how to develop an on-line version and how best to overcome objections of members who don't want to have it on-line. This was a really lengthy discussion and everyone agreed that we can't continue to publish and distribute newsletters unless we substantially increased dues. No one wanted to do that and everyone recognized the necessity to go on-line. To accommodate any members who feel they must have the hard copy mailed, the guilds charge whatever their printing costs and mailing costs would be. This varies between guilds as some have print companies who do this at a discount, but most have to charge for everything (paper, printing, envelopes and first class postage).

How information is passed from one officer/committee chair to the next and how new folks are trained was another question. Most of the guilds work really hard to ensure that complete information is passed on with written year end reports. Some have a person in training to take on the position they are going to be filling. What we do is to have a meeting between the outgoing and incoming board which includes all the officers and committee persons. Typically the joint meeting is the week after the elections in May. During this meeting, we get to know each other better, pass on our

year-end reports along with reports from years past, and discuss the responsibilities of the positions and typical guild expectations for performance. The outgoing officers/committee persons also make themselves available to assist if any questions come up. Some positions like treasurer have a lot of governmental forms that are required to be maintained and filed. This position has an assistant who works with the treasurer for a year before taking on those responsibilities.

Other topics ranged from how to handle raffles, finding meeting facilities, programs and much more. I left the meeting feeling as though we are doing really well. I am encouraged by the enthusiasm of our membership and their willingness to do whatever it takes to help us increase membership and educate the public about who we are. Of course we have our challenges from time to time, but with everyone helping, we can't help but continue to succeed.

TAQG Secretary's Meeting - Julie Schaefer

On January 31st six members of the Quilters Guild of Plano traveled to Mineola to share aspects of our guild's board positions with those of other guilds in Texas. I met many new quilter friends and found out that my guild is pretty much like the other guilds. Everyone said that the two best parts of being on the board were having a closer friendship with other guild members and knowing what is going on behind the scenes. In my group as secretaries, we decided that the easiest part of our job was all the time between printing the minutes of the board and general meetings. Taking minutes can be difficult because people have a tendency to quickly go through the agenda and not repeat member names so all the information is included correctly. Of course, the minutes need to be accurate as they are kept in perpetuity and members want "the facts." I am lucky because our President, Donna Petrick, always gives me a copy of the agenda prior to the meeting, doesn't mind repeating names and other chairs hand to me the written information I need to record. I was informed that there are two forms that I need to send in every year. Not bad for the secretary position of a large organization. We all decided that the secretary has the "easiest" position on the board (qualification of the word "easiest").


Batik Basket Bonanza—Basket #10

All the blocks this year will be pieced baskets made of a good quality batik and white-on-white as the background. All blocks will be 10 inches finished and 10 1/2 inches unfinished. Be careful with your 1/4 inch seams and your pressing so that the blocks that are won are uniform in size. Questions? Call Brooks Wilson or Diane de-Freitas

Cutting instructions:

Basket (batik—your color choice) F—cut 5 squares 2 7/8" G—cut 1 square 2 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal H—cut 1 square 6 7/8" - cut in half on the diagonal Background (white-on-white) A—cut 2 rectangles 2 1/2" X 6 1/2" B—1 square 2 1/2" C—cut 1square 4 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal D—cut 5 squares 2 7/8"- cut in half on diagonal E—cut 1 squares 2 7/8"

To make E/F half-square triangles: layer E + F squares, right sides together. On back of lighter square, draw a diagonal line. Stitch a scant 1/4" on both sides of drawn line. Cut in half on drawn line. This will yield 2 half-square triangles (or you may use triangle paper or any other technique to yield 9 total half-square triangles that are 2" finished). Follow the diagram below to assemble the block.
