At 7:00 PM, Sheri Smith, Vice President Community Service, called the meeting of the Quilters Guild of Plano to order in the absence of President Donna Petrick. The minutes from the last general meeting as written in the newsletter were passed after a motion by Brooks Wilson and second by Germaine Reconnu. The treasurer's report as written in the newsletter was also accepted after a motion by Helen Wilems and a second by Aggie Meszaros.

Old Business: There was no old business.

New Business: The next board meeting will be Monday, April 6th at the Davis Library on Independence beginning exactly at 7:00 PM. Everyone is welcome; if you have something you wish to discuss please email Donna Petrick at mike.petrick@verizon.net prior to the meeting so she can put you on the agenda. Two volunteers were obtained to assist in auditing the books. They are Marla Bradberry and Dayna Ragland.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Nominating Committee: Debbie Skorepa announced that all positions for the board memberships have been filled. We still need six committee chairs: Block of the Month (a bee could take this on), Door Prizes (obtaining for the general meetings), education (a fairly untried job), facilities (meeting and storage places), guild products (what are the possibilities?) and Retreat 2010.

TAQG (Texas Association of Quilt Guilds): Aggie Meszaros reported that this group recently took 203 quilts to the now opened Fisher House. It took three cars loaded to transport all of them. The next general meeting will be March 31. Secondary meetings on this date will be on Publicity, Newspaper and Newsletter articles and websites. The yearly Rally Days will be July 11. The main speaker is Sharon Schamber. She had the 2008 "Best in Show" at the Houston Quilt Show. Rally Days will again be held at the Mimosa Lane Baptist Church, 1233 Belt Line Rd. Mesquite. Next month at the Plano Guilds general meeting Aggie will have lunch tickets for those attending this meeting. The tickets will cost \$7.00 for one of the following menu choices: chicken salad with mixed fruit, chicken fajita rollups, ham and turkey sandwich, and Cobb salad. Upcoming quilt shows to attend are Tyler's on March 28-29, Gun Barrel's on April 24th and 25th and Ellis County's on July 17th and 18th. There is a new fabric shop in Granbury called "Quilt Crazy".

Membership: Helen Wilems and Terri Mendelow announced that there were 41 members present with one new member, Emily Colquitt. Door prizes were awarded to winning ticket owners. The prizes were donated from Quilt Country, Quilt Asylum, Happiness is . . .Quilting, The Old Craft Store, Suzy's Quilt Shop, Quilters Workshop and an anonymous donor.

Plano Quilt Show 2009: Germaine Reconnu announced that there will be a new contest at the next meeting so bring in your mini quilts and purses that you have made for the show. She is also going to bring in the 23 mini quilts that have already been donated so you can see some examples. Did you know that ribbons are awarded for both purses and for the mini quilts? We need at least 80 mini quilts. This part of the show brought in at least \$5000.00 for the guild as people bid on both purses and mini quilts. Make sure your purses are something that you would buy. Julie Schaefer introduced herself as the person to turn in Raffle Ticket money with stubs, the tickets you aren't able to sell and more raffle tickets. You are welcome to phone her, email her for more raffle tickets at juliescha@sbcglobal.net and also welcome to mail to her your stubs and checks.

Community Service: Sheri Smith reminded members that there is still a contest for those that do the quilting of Community Service quilts that will be distributed to an

agency in need. Sheri showed what the winners would receive.

Block of the Month: Brooks Wilson from the Knotty Girls Quilt Bee announced that Debbie Skorepa for the fifth time this year won the Block of the Month. She reminded members to click on the website link for next month's block or read your newsletter and print off the directions to make a block for the April meeting. Show and Tell: Marla Bradberry assisted with the following members showing their quilts: Brooks Wilson, Cathy LaManna, Sharon Ellis, Teresa Knode and Dayna Ragland.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned at 7:25 PM with Donna Lobelson announcing that the program in April will be Valery Guignon speaking on Fabric Dyeing and Design. May brings Wendy Butler Berns speaking on machine quilting and June will be Alice Wilhoit who will be speaking on hand appliqué and crazy quilts. The speaker for the evening was Spike Gillespie, author of the book Quilty as Charged: Undercover in a Material World."

BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS – Julie Schaefer



QUILT PLANO 09—QUILT ENTRIES - Joan Stevenson

It is time to get your entries ready for our quilt show on August 14th and 15th this year. The deadline to enter is our July 9th meeting but that doesn't mean you have to have to quilt totally done by then. Quilt Plano is our home town show basically for our members and, hopefully, a few entries from other TAQG guilds. It is always fun to see what other quilters have thought up to do with fabric. We also hope there will be lots of entries from our two new categories - 207: First Show Quilt and 208: Quilt made by a person 17 years of age or younger.

To enter the show we just need the entry form, a basic picture and a correct finished size so that we can make sure to hang your quilt in the best possible location. Again this for show we will be available before the May and June meetings to take pictures. Then all you need to do is send in the entry form - we will print the picture and match it up with your form. We will have the camera at the July meeting but it is usually too busy to do anything but take in entries. If you take your own picture to put with the entry from, it can be printed on plain paper but it must show the correct colors. And remember we need the finished size, not the size it is when you take the picture - you laugh - I personally have been guilty of this!

We encourage you to enter more than one quilt. After all it has been two long years since our last show so you have had lots of time to finish projects. If you have any questions at all I will be happy to answer them preferably by email (plano.quilter@verizon.net) or give me a call at 972-618-8188 before 1pm. Lets make this show a really great example of our guild member's talent.

NINE-PATCH NEWS - Terri Anderman

It's time to get our 9-patch bin filled, Quilters! We need 9-patches made with the new Guild muslin which is Unbleached Moda Muslin. If you have the old, Rangefinder, muslin please don't use this for future 9-patches. You can purchase the Moda muslin from me (\$2.00 per ½ yard) or it can be found at JoAnn's. If you can't make it to a meeting to purchase the muslin from me I can mail the muslin to you or you may pick it up at my home. We will be losing 2 members: Diane Crandall who is moving to Arkansas and Barbara Martinez who is off to Tennessee. The 9-patches are sent as a reminder of the friends they are leaving in Plano and the Guild Muslin is what will give a "scrappy 9-patch quilt" some uniformity.

Please review the 9-patch directions on page 36 of the Directory and make sure your block is 6 1/2 inches (unfinished) in size. In the past we've received blocks that REALLY vary from that size and they just can't be used. Let's send our friends "the best of the best." And, if you want to sign and date your blocks (use a Micron pen, please), it will make the gift that much more memorable.

Batik Basket Bonanza—Basket #11

All the blocks this year will be pieced baskets made of a good quality batik and white-on-white as the background. All blocks will be 10 inches finished and 10 1/2 inches unfinished. Be careful with your 1/4 inch seams and your pressing so that the blocks that are won are uniform in size. Questions? Call Brooks Wilson or Diane de-Freitas

Cutting instructions:

Basket (batik—your color choice)

D- cut 2 squares 2 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

F—cut 6 squares 2 7/8"

G—cut 1 square 2 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

H—cut 1 square 6 7/8" - cut in half on the diagonal

Background (white-on-white)


A—cut 2 rectangles 2 1/2" X 4 1/2"

B-1 square 2 1/2"

C—cut 1square 4 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

E—cut 6 squares 2 7/8"

To make E/F half-square triangles: layer E + F squares, right sides together. On back of lighter square, draw a diagonal line. Stitch a scant 1/4" on both sides of drawn line. Cut in half on drawn line. This will yield 2 half-square triangles (or you may use triangle paper or any other technique to yield 11 total half-square triangles that are 2" finished). Follow the diagram below to assemble the block.
