She joined the guild in 1988, was president from 2000 – 2002, started the Lone Star Awards back in February 2001; she has held a number of different positions in the guild; was the bee keeper years ago when I was looking for a new bee and we had shops in Plano where we could meet. She is currently the editor of the newsletter.

**Joan Stevenson** – joined the guild in 1999, has held a number of positions and is currently sharing the VP of membership position with Helen Wilems. She does a great deal of the guild work in the background, such as keeping up with the membership statistics, selling ads, and printing most of our literature.

**Marla Bradberry** – joined the guild in 2005. She was in charge of the library for two years and has run the fat quarter lotto for the past two years. Also, she is one that is always willing to help with the different projects that we have in the guild.

**Marvel Link** – Joined the guild in 1996 and has worked as an assistant to the VP of Programs for several years. Without her doing all she did, we would not have had the workshops running so smoothly. She is a member of the Plain O Piecers, a small group that has done a number of the raffle quilts and special projects.

**Rhonda Kuntz** – joined the guild in 2006. She did a lot of photography for the guild as historian for several years. Took pictures of our last quilt show and put into a CD format. (which I'm not sure we have gotten into the library, but need to.) Currently, is working as an assistant to programs. Very talented in beading and has won awards in that field.

**Sherry Worley** – joined the guild in 1993. She's one of those people who are always helping out with various projects. We wouldn't get nearly as much accomplished without her helping, especially active in community service sewing. She's very active in TAQG, four different guilds and is going to keep Plano, Frisco, Allen and McKinney guilds going in the right direction for our Rally Day 2010.

**Tracy Spruell** – joined the guild in 1995. She took care of the newsletter for several years, when we printed and delivered to the post office bulk mail. That in it self should get her jewels in her crown. She led her group, Sewciety Women, in last year's block of the month and is on the current show committee.

All you have to do is mail in the completed form which you can download from the web site. We will also have forms available at the meeting.

We need everyone's participation to make this the best show ever. Not only do we need your beautiful work to show off but we also need you to volunteer to help during the show. There are some very easy "sit down" jobs such as admissions or hospitality and also some jobs that require a little more effort such as quilt angels but then you get to touch all the quilts! If every member would enter one quilt and work 4 hours we would have a truly memorable event.

#### NINE-PATCH NEWS - Terri Anderman

It's time to get our 9-patch bin filled, Quilters! We need 9-patches made with the new Guild muslin which is Unbleached Moda Muslin. If you have the old, Rangefinder, muslin please don't use this for future 9-patches. You can purchase the Moda muslin from me (\$2.00 per ½ yard) or it can be found at JoAnn's. If you can't make it to a meeting to purchase the muslin from me I can mail the muslin to you or you may pick it up at my home. We will be losing 2 members, Diane Crandall who is moving to Arkansas and Barbara Martinez who is off to Tennessee. The Nine Patches are sent as a reminder of the friends they are leaving in Plano and the Guild Muslin is what will give a "scrappy 9-patch quilt" some uniformity.

Please review the 9-patch directions on page 36 of the Directory and make sure your block is 6 1/2 inches (unfinished) in size. In the past we've received blocks that REALLY vary from that size and they just can't be used. Let's send our friends "the best of the best". And, if you want to sign and date your blocks (use a Micron pen, please) it will make the gift that much more memorable.

#### **GRANT AWARD INFORMATION - Donna Petrick**

It's time once again to start applying for grants from various organizations to help supplement our guild income. Joan Wilson had originally started the process in 2006 with the City of Plano to help offset the cost of our 2007 quilt show. At the time, I wondered if it would be worth the effort. Obviously, I've decided it is since I'm now in the middle of it.

The money comes from the hotel tax assessed to visitors who stay in Plano. The money has been allotted by the city council to the Arts Council to further the promotion of Plano by awarding grants to deserving non-profit organizations. The city takes this very seriously and has guidelines that must be followed. One guide-line being that organizations must attend the grant workshop. This past weekend, Shirley Weaver, Karen Hawkins and I attended the workshop for the next year's grants. We have started work and must turn in the grant application by May 8<sup>th</sup>.

We are currently receiving Plano grant money that helps to pay for guild insurance, programs and show publicity. We had applied to a couple of other organizations for grants. One rejected our bid and another has delayed awarding their grants until later this year. So we are still hoping to receive some help there. If you know of any company that awards grants to organizations such as ours, please let me know, so that we can tap into that stream also.

#### COMMUNITY SERVICE – Sheri Smith

Lots of finished quilts were turned in at our April 9 guild meeting. You still have one more month to turn in finished 'quilted' quilts as the drawing for the 3 prizes will be at the May meeting. Thank you, everyone for helping with this project. The next Sew Day at the Plano Sewing Center will be on May 12. Again it will be an 'open' sew day where you can come and sew as long as you want and leave when you need to between 10 am and 4 pm.

#### MEMBERSHIP - Joan Stevenson

Once again the price of postage is going up so we will be trying to do annual membership renewal using email. Please watch for an email from me - plano.quilter@verizon.net - sometime during the month of May. It will have all your current information in it along with instructions on mailing in any changes to your information along with your check. It would be fantastic if we could finish this process and get the Directories out with record speed. I would like to aim for everything to be done by the end of June!

If you would prefer to have a printed copy of the newsletter mailed to you, we are offering subscriptions for \$20 per year in addition to the normal dues. The subscription will cover the cost of printing and postage. Just let me know when you mail in your check.

#### MINI QUILT & PURSE RULES -Germaine Reconnu

Mini quilts and purses are being accepted now for auction at Quilt Plano 09. This is a major fund raiser for the guild. Please consider participating.

Mini quilts:

- Must be no longer than 24" on any side
- · Must be hand or machine quilted
- May be any shape, color or pattern
- May be pieced, appliquéd, embroidered or all three
- A 2" sleeve is required
- Attaching a label with the Guild name and show date is preferred
- Holiday quilts sell really well
- Landscapes, portraits, still life and "artsy" quilts also sell well
- A pieced mini-quilt should consist of multiple blocks 4" or smaller

#### Purses/Totes:

- May be any size
- May be pieced or appliquéd
- Decorative stitching, beading and quilting is preferred
- Make your purse have "purse personality"
- Make your design irresistible
- Be creative and have fun!

#### Batik Basket Bonanza—Basket #11

All the blocks this year will be pieced baskets made of a good quality batik and white-on-white as the background. All blocks will be 10 inches finished and 10 1/2 inches unfinished. Be careful with your 1/4 inch seams and your pressing so that the blocks that are won are uniform in size. Questions? Call Brooks Wilson or Diane de-Freitas


#### Cutting instructions:

Basket (batik—your color choice) F—cut 4 squares 2 7/8" G—cut 1 square 2 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal H—cut 1 square 6 7/8" - cut in half on the diagonal

#### Background (white-on-white)

A—cut 2 rectangles 2 1/2" X 4 1/2" B—1 square 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" C—cut 1square 4 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal D—cut 1square 6 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal E—cut 4 squares 2 7/8"

To make E/F half-square triangles: layer E + F squares, right sides together. On back of lighter square, draw a diagonal line. Stitch a scant 1/4" on both sides of drawn line. Cut in half on drawn line. This will yield 2 half-square triangles (or you may use triangle paper or any other technique to yield 8 total half-square triangles that are 2" finished). Follow the diagram below to assemble the block.
