Donna Petrick, President, called the Quilters Guild of Plano General Meeting to order at 7:00 PM. Everyone was welcomed and asked to turn off their cell phones. The minutes of the April 9<sup>th</sup> general meeting as written in the newsletter, were approved after a motion by Germaine Reconnu and a second by Donna Tomenga. With a slight change from the newsletter, the treasurer's report was approved after a motion by Karen Hawkins and second by Sheri Smith. The grant we are bidding for has been sent to the City of Plano. We have received funds through their grant application process the past 2 years. Donna recognized the addition to our meeting of raffle quilts and members from both the Allen and McKinney Guilds. There was no old business to discuss.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

The next Board Meeting will be a "change-over meeting". It will be on May 23<sup>rd</sup>, at 11:00. The past board will serve lunch. The first meeting of the 2009-2010 board will be at Davis Library on Independence on June 8<sup>th</sup>. Parkway Hills Baptist Church, where the guild usually meets for their general meetings will be having Vacation Bible School during the June week that we have our general meeting. Therefore, on the 11<sup>th</sup> of June, our next general meeting will be held at the Plano Medical Center's auditorium that is on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the new medical offices building on the northwest corner of 15<sup>th</sup> and Coit. Dayna Ragland, Marla Bradberry, Joan Wilson, Shirley Weaver and Donna Petrick audited the Treasury books on April 26th. The books are reported to be in good order. Having read the newsletter, Barbara Collins noticed that her name was mentioned under "Prez Sezs" and received her fat quarter from Donna Petrick. Nominees for the 2009-2010 Executive Board as presented in the May 2009 Newsletter were voted on and accepted by acclamation after a motion by Helen Wilems and second by Sue Moore.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Quilt Plano Show 2009: Kemberley Wilshire announced that the registration deadline to enter a quilt is July 15<sup>th</sup>. The registration form can be found on the Guild website www.quiltersguildofplano.org. Your registration form must have included with it a picture of the guilt to be entered. Both can be done over the Internet by scanning/sending the information to Joan Stevenson at plano.guilter@verizon.net. The guilts do not have to be completed, but must have a picture of the guilt top. There are presently 12 quilts entered, and we are looking for 300. Included in the categories to be judged is a "Kid Quilted" section. There will also be a kid workshop area where the children may sew a block on 1 of 6 Babylock Grace sewing machines graciously donated by the Plano Sewing Center. For everyone belonging to a Home Owner's Association, we ask that you contact your Newsletter Chair and/or Board to see if we can publicize our show in your newsletter. Since we are a nonprofit agency (501c3) we would like to do it free, however if there is a cost, please find out what it is and send the information to Tina Connolly at guiltytina@msn.com. Helen Wilems announced that she was selling Quilt Show advance admissions tickets. She challenged everyone to sell at least 10 admissions tickets.

Retreat 2010: ADOS quilt bee will be organizing the retreat. Representing them, Janet Plotkin announced that this year we would be requiring a deposit to be paid by the July meeting in order to reserve a space for you. The deposit will be \$50 per night, per person, non-refundable, unless the guild cancels the retreat. Start saving now. Janet will be getting information out to everyone soon.

<u>Programs:</u> Donna Lobelson announced that there will be a workshop tomorrow on machine quilting taught by tonight's speaker, Wendy Butler Berns. People can still sign up for it tonight. Next month Alice Wilhoit from McKinney will be our speaker

and also have workshops. People may sign up for the workshops with Alice by going to the guild website. More information on the programs link is available. There are packets of material to be used for crazy quilts if you sign up for that workshop.

The next TAQG meeting will be May 26<sup>th</sup>. The secondary meeting that is presented along with the general meeting will be on "Fund Raising and Grants" for anyone interested in attending.



#### PROGRAMS & WORKSHOPS - Donna Lobelson

The June meeting will be held at the *Medical Center of Plano*. We will meet in the *MCP Auditorium*. The Auditorium is located on the third floor of the Medical Office Building III at 4001 W. 15th Street, Suite 315 (on the west end of the Coit Street Sky Bridge).

Alice Wilhoit will present a trunk show of her beautiful quilts at our June meeting. Alice is a nationally recognized quilter and a Texan. Many of us are familiar with her "Texas Our Texas" pattern. What some of you may not realize is that her first book was published last month.

Most of us have had the experience of becoming "all out excited" over a new hobby or activity only to cool once the "new" has worn off. Usually this leads to an unfinished project, or projects if the excitement was really great, being relegated to a forgotten box on some closet shelf. That was Alice's story until she took a class at the local quilt shop and found herself immersed in a world of infinite possibilities with fabrics. She has never "cooled" or even looked back. In this time, Alice has produced something over 250 quilts, many of them of her own design. Many have won awards in quilt shows and festivals. Her designs and patterns are sold in quilt shops around the country.

Although she designs both traditional pieced and appliquéd quilts, her true love, other than her husband, children and grandchildren, is teaching others the art of appliqué. Through her years of experience she has developed many labor and time saving techniques to aid in the preparation portion of appliqué. These she happily shares on **Friday June 12**, 2009 in the **Hand Appliqué Workshop**.

The Crazy Patchwork Workshop on Saturday June 13, 2009 is based upon her new book. In the morning the workshop teaches students how to assemble a foundation block by machine. In the afternoon you will embellish the block by hand using threads, silk ribbon, beads, lace, buttons and much more. Please not that the Saturday workshop in June will be at the Hobby Lobby at the corner of Alma and 15th Street in Plano. This is the first guild workshop at this location.

**Bonnie Browning** is coming in November. The supply list for The Xquisite Scrap Quilt workshop asks for the following fabric:

4" squares (at least 30 lights, 30 mediums, and 30 darks). Bring a wide variety and don't worry what color they are...this is a scrap class and they will all go together. If you have squares in another size (2 1/2" to 4"), you can use them but all of the squares need to be the same size.

Please let me know if you are interested in participating in a fabric exchange in preparation for this class.

The reason the guild offers the advance registration discount is because we want to know as far in advance as possible how many will attend the workshop. Many of our contracts with the speakers have a cancellation clause. In order to take the discount I need to have your check *in my hand* 35 days before the event. In this case the event is the monthly meeting. A postmark, an email or a phone call 35 days before the event doesn't count. You must "show me the money".



To make things as easy as possible, my husband and I will be at the next two meetings (don't forget that the June meeting is at Bldg III across the street from the main Plano Medical Center Bldg.), ready to take entries or photograph your quilt or both.

The quilt does not need to be finished to be entered. If you are going to photograph it, the quilt can be blocks laid out on the floor in the order they will be sewn together. You should indicate what the border(s) will look like. The photo does not need to be perfect but it does need to show the design and the true colors. If your printer refuses to cooperate, email the photo to me and I will print it and attach it to your entry when you send it. Entry forms are available on the web site.

Remember that there is a category this show for 1st time entries in a Quilt Show. We also have a category for young quilters. Also remember that this guild is not Houston and the judges know that. We just love seeing all that wonderful work that our members do during the two years between shows. So I am hoping for a really long line at the June meeting. See you then.

#### **BLOCK OF THE MONTH - June - Diane deFreitas and the Knotty Girls Small Group**

#### Batik Basket Bonanza—Basket #12

All the blocks this year will be pieced baskets made of a good quality batik and white-on-white as the background. All blocks will be 10 inches finished and 10 1/2 inches unfinished. Be careful with your 1/4 inch seams and your pressing so that the blocks that are won are uniform in size. Questions? Call Diane deFreitas

Cutting instructions:

Basket (batik—your color choice)

D—cut 1 square 4 7/8" X 4 7/8" " - cut in half on diagonal

F—cut 3 squares 2 7/8" X 2 7/8"

G—cut 2 square 2 7/8" X 2 7/8" - cut in half on diagonal

H—cut 2 squares 2 1/2" X 2 1/2"

Background (white-on-white)

A-cut 2 rectangles 2 1/2" X 6 1/2"


B—cut 2 squares 4 7/8" X 4 7/8" " - cut in half on diagonal

C—cut 2 squares 2 1/2" X 2 1/2"

E-cut 3 squares 2 7/8"

To make E/F half-square triangles: layer E + F squares, right sides together. On back of lighter square, draw a diagonal line. Stitch a scant 1/4" on both sides of drawn line. Cut in half on drawn line. This will yield 2 half-square triangles (or you may use triangle paper or any other technique to yield 5 total half-square triangles that are 2" finished). Follow the diagram below to assemble the block.

Congratulations if you have made every block in this series! I'll bet your half-square triangles have improved along the way. Hope you're a winner!!
