PROGRAMS & WORKSHOPS - Donna Lobelson

Cathy Bradley began collecting moles 30 years ago to help teach design in her high school art classes. She found molas in antique malls, garage and estate sales, gifts from friends, and ethnic craft shops. With the invention of the computer, acquisition became easier and her collection has expanded. Cathy began quilting in 1998, and has shown locally since 2003. Pursuing a love of old quilts led her to work with Lisa Erlandson for a year, and she is now repairing quilts to help pay for her mola collecting.

At our July meeting Cathy will use her mola collection and anecdotes from 30 years of collecting to inform us how complex, thought-provoking, and humorous the Kuna women are in their choices of design, color, and

subject matter in mola making.

A mola is the most famous form of art produced in Panama. It is incorporated into a woman's clothing, usually with one panel on the front of the blouse and a matching or related one on the back. Each mola is traditionally hand stitched, using tiny stitches and layers of different colored material. The fabric is cut out and tucked under, revealing selectively each layer beneath and forming the designs through a process of reverse appliqué, appliqué, and embroidery.

The Kuna create their mola artistry by drawing on ideas or narratives from their history, culture, and beliefs. They usually portray native flora and fauna, family life, spirits and cultural designs. Their contemporary moles may include biblical themes, cartoon characters, politics, or product labels. The mola making tradition is in jeopardy today due the transfer of family income from agriculture to mola making, influenced by tourist demands.

QUILT PLANO 09: Volunteer Opportunity Teresa Knode

Karen Christoffer has put together some kits made from bumper fabric and coordinating fabric so we can teach the kids how to sew a strip quilt. And the Plano Sewing Center has donated 6 Babylock Grace Model sewing machines for our use (which will then be discounted after the show for anyone interested in purchasing them). What we need from our volunteers is for you to go up to the Plano Sewing Center so you can learn these machines. Just tell them you're with the Guild and are there to learn the machines for the Youth Sew Program. If you go to the Community Service Sew Day, it's that much easier for you to just take a few minutes to learn these machines. We will have redwork and crayon quilt blocks as well, but it would be helpful if at least 1 person per shift knew the machines for bobbin changes and anything else that might come up. And the only way to ensure that is to get as many of us to learn the machines as possible. Thanks for your help.

SEWING BEES - Donna Petrick

We need help keeping up with all the bees now. For a guild this size, it seems that we have a larger number of bees than other guilds. That's wonderful. I hope we keep it up. It's time to list all the bees in the directory again. So we need updated information on who is the main contact. AND we need to know if you are accepting more members. As we get new members in the guild, it would be helpful if we could point them to a certain group with like interest.

It seems like a couple of new bees have started up this year. Please contact Cathy Lamanna with all your information to add to our list. See her phone number and email in the current directory to send in your information.

It's amazing that we take so much for granted about all that goes on at the meeting, but it's confusing to someone new. Please say you will help. COMMUNITY SERVICE – Julie Schaefer

Teresa Knode recently sent an email out to many people reminding them that at the "Quilt Plano 2009" Show there will be the opportunity to volunteer in the Youth Sew Program. There will be a separate area where children may use a sewing machine to experience piecing or sit and color with a crayon on a blackline picture such as those found in a coloring book. Children may also try hand-sewn redwork. Karen Christoffer has put together some kits made from bumper fabric and coordinating fabric so the volunteer may teach the children how to strip piece. The Plano Sewing Center has donated 6 Babylock "Grace" Model sewing machines for our use in this area. The machines can then be purchased at a discounted rate if you are interested. There is a caveat to helping the children sew on these machines. You have to know how to run these machines (bobbin change, direction of threading needle, bobbin threading). Therefore you will need a short explanation. If you are not familiar with these models and want to volunteer for the Youth Sew Area you need to contact the Plano Sewing Center, tell them that you are with the Quilters Guild of Plano and want a short lesson. They are most willing to help you. You may just drop by (SE corner of Spring Creek and Custer) or you may call them ahead of time (972-527-7400) to determine if there is a convenient time.

Karen Christoffer tells me that 48 quilts, 8 knitted afghans and 39 knit baby caps were donated to the Guild. From those, we will be delivering 12 quilts and the 39 knit baby caps to Newborns in Need; 29 quilts will be delivered to the Collin County Children's Advocacy Center; 7 quilts will be delivered to the Collin County Rape Crisis Center and the 8 afghans will be delivered to Operation Quilted Comfort.

Karen also organizes the Community Service sew day which is held at the Plano Sewing Center on the second Tuesday of every month. The next one will be the 14th of July. Everyone is welcome to come and join a fun group of people. All you have to do is: email Karen Christoffer at <u>karen.christoffer@ts.rr.com</u> telling her you are coming and about what time you will arrive at the Plano Sewing Center (address above) after 10:00 am at a time convenient for you during the day; bring your sewing machine and basic sewing tools. Karen provides the material and directions. Last month we worked on puppy block quilts. The kits were ready for us and all we had to do was follow the oral directions with the design and cut material provided to us by Sherry Worley. What can go wrong? If all else fails we always have written directions.

Just because the winter holiday is 6 months away doesn't mean that we should stop making the stockings. If you would like a kit/s contact LaDawn Dalley, phone – 972-422-6449 or email <u>Isdalley@verizon.net</u>. Another project to give you a break from making mini quilts, purses and award winning quilts for the Show is the "cough pillows". If you want to make them go to the "President's Letter" in the June 2009 COMMON THREADS. You will also find out what they are used for.

Thanks to Sheri Smith who is the past VP-Community Service for brokering the Guild's way with the various agencies and loves being a quilt Santa. This starts a new position for me with the Guild. I'm feeling like this is a bigger challenge than I was aware of. I do know that I like working with people and I also like reading the comics in any newspaper. Tia Carmen from "Baldo" says, "A candle loses nothing by lighting another candle." I always have felt that I gain so much from giving to others and I never lose anything by doing it.

RETREAT 2010 – Count Me In! - Janet Plotkin

Our annual retreat at Tanglewood Resort will be February 18th or 19th through the 21st, 2010. There are only 60 spaces available. We are handling the financing a little differently this year. Instead of having to make one complete payment in November, we are offering a layaway plan.

Your \$50.00 deposit is due by July 1, 2009. Please make the check payable to Quilters Guild of Plano and mail them or drop them at 3116 Ipswich Drive, Plano, Texas 75025. Your check will be deposited and that payment will insure your space at retreat. I will accept the first 60 checks as deposit. After I receive 60 deposits I will return the check and add your name to the alternate list. If something comes up and someone cannot attend retreat they can access the alternate list to "sell" their space.

Beginning with August 1st 2009 you will have a payment due on the first day of the month, each month, through the January 1, 2010 payment at which point your spot at retreat will be fully funded. See the chart below.

If you choose not to participate in the layaway plan, you must still make a \$50.00 reservation deposit by July 1, 2009 and your final payment will be due November 1, 2009.

You do not have to be a member of Quilter's Guild of Plano to attend retreat so please invite people you would like to join you at retreat. While the majority of the group will be quilters; it is also fun to share time with our knitting and scrapbooking sisters. lease be sure to include on or with your check your name, correct address, phone number and your email address.

Mini quilts and purses are being accepted now for auction at Quilt Plano 09. This is a major fund raiser for the guild. Please consider participating.

Mini quilts:

- Must be no longer than 24" on any side
- Must be hand or machine quilted
- May be any shape, color or pattern
- May be pieced, appliquéd, embroidered or all three
- A 2" sleeve is required
- Attaching a label with the Guild name and show date is preferred
- Holiday quilts sell really well

- Landscapes, portraits, still life and "artsy" quilts also sell well
- A pieced mini-quilt should consist of multiple blocks 4" or smaller

Purses/Totes:

- May be any size
- May be pieced or appliquéd
- Decorative stitching, beading and quilting is preferred
- Make your purse have "purse personality"
- Make your design irresistible
- Be creative and have fun!


Background (cream colored fabric): A—2 @ 3 X 2 1/4 B—2 @ 2 1/2 X 2 3/4	Top Layer: H—1 @ 4 1/2 X 2 1/4
C—2 @ 1 1/2 X 3 3/4 D—2 @ 1 1/2 X 1 1/2 E—2 @ 1 7/8 X 1 7/8	Middle Layer: I—1 @ 6 1/2 X 2 3/4
F—2 @ 4 1/2 X 1 1/2 G—1 @ 10 1/2 X 1 1/2	Lower Layer: J—1 @ 8 1/2 X 3 3/4

Cake Stand: K—1 @ 6 1/2 X 1 1/2 L—2 @ 1 7/8 X 1 7/8

Sewing Directions:

Sew A to H to A; B to I to B; C to J to C. Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner on the back of E. With right sides together, sew E to L, sewing on either side of the drawn line. Cut on line, press. Sew 2 of these units to ends of K and sew 2 units together as shown on the bottom of the cake stand. Add D units and F units to the cake stand rows. Sew all horizontal layers together, as shown. (Adapted from "The Quilter" March 2009) Drawing is not to scale.
