Hi Everyone

It was great to see the ones who braved the weather Thursday night for guild meeting. We always need the rain, but I'm wishing for Camelot, where it rains when we are asleep. Several of us were pretty wet that evening after helping Sara Miller Moe bring all her beautiful quilts inside.

I told you that night that I had recently been asked what the \$25.00 membership dues pays for if not for the privilege of getting into the quilt show for free. If you had the opportunity to look at the annual financial report posted in a recent newsletter, you will see that we have certain on-going expenses dealing with the fact we are a business. Franchise taxes, storage building rental, post office box rental, liability insurance and bank charges have to be paid before we even start on directories, programs and workshops, plus education, community service and hospitality. Currently, we average 250 members a year, each paying \$25.00 in dues. That equals revenue of \$6,250.00. Our expenses last year on a fairly bare bones budget ran a little over \$31,000.00. Of that amount, programs and workshops cost alone were over \$8,800.00 while only bringing in \$3,600.00 in workshop fees. Remember also, that we have contracted out as much as 18 months for future speakers. We are obligated to pay those fees. As you can see, we barely cover our programs by membership fees. We certainly don't cover any of the other expenses.


We do try to supplement our guild income by the raffle quilts, grants and the quilt show. Our current raffle quilt made less than \$4,500.00. That amount is lower than in past years, due to the economy and the fact that there are so many other raffle quilts competing for dollars.

If not for the money from our biennial quilt show, we would not be able to afford the wonderful programs we enjoy. Our programs are one of the main draws of the guild. While I can't tell you exactly how your \$25.00 is spent, I can tell you that it takes all of us to make the whole guild work. Without each of you, we would not be the wonderful organization that is Quilters Guild of Plano. That part is priceless.

Just a short note about our websitewe must have been spammed on 9-11-09. Our website would take you to some other website that had nothing to do with us. Beverly has worked this weekend to get it recovered and has put in a service ticket on the problem, whatever it was. Hope that none of you were inconvenienced by the outage. Thank you, Beverly, for the additional work, getting us up and running again.




PREZ SEZ - Donna Petrick

She has performed at folk festivals, clubs and house concerts all across Canada and released five CDs of her music. She lives with her husband, John Bunge, in Victoria BC. Cathy travels the world, singing for quilting events, guild meetings and shows, and she is known as "The Singing Quilter". To date, she has performed for over 500 guilt guilds and events on three continents. That's an audience of over 40,000 quilters in all!!! The tales surrounding guilt history are fascinating, and tell a story of women's lives that don't often make it into the history books. Cathy delights in finding and writing songs about unusual and wonderful stories about quilts.

COMMUNITY SERVICE—Julie Schaefer

The Community Service group met in September and produced at least 300 stocking kits, which included fabric and ribbons. Three stockings are in each plastic baggie. Each member is asked to take at least one baggie at every meeting! LaDawn Dalley actually has large baggies with 15 and 20 kits per bag for the overachievers. At present, we only have 170 completed stockings and we have a goal of 1,000. We only have 2 months to complete them, since we donate them to Parkland Hospital in late November. Please, please, please bring items to put in the stockings: crayons, small books, small games, pads of paper, toothbrushes, toiletry items, lip gloss, combs, deodorant and school items for kids' stockings. Some of the stockings go to moms in the ante partum ward, so any lotions or toiletries, samples, etc. would be welcome. LaDawn will also take cash or checks (made out to "QGP"). She can also make out a receipt for IRS purposes. If you can't make it to the guild meeting, you may send a donation to the guild's address (last page of newsletter), attn: LaDawn Dalley.

Don't forget our second Tuesday regular sit and sew meeting at the Plano Sewing Center. We are there between 10 and 5, so come and go on your own schedule. The store is located on the southeast corner of Spring Creek and Custer. Karen Christoffer (karen.christoffer@tx.rr.com) asks that you let her know you are coming so she can have enough kits ready for everyone. Bring your friends - you don't need to be a member to sew with us.

We received 10 quilts at the September meeting and they are already committed to our charities. We are really in need of quilts, so if you have taken some that need quilting or binding, please finish them up and hand them in. If you have Christmas scraps and can do a top, bring that in now so that it can be finished in time for the holidays.

We now have 100 "cough pillows" for the Medical Center of Plano to be used for various surgery patients. We are committed to making 300 pillows since they perform about 25 surgeries a day. Not all need a pillow, but many do, so you can guess their need. If you have any "stuffing" for these pil-







Joan Stevenson, an active member of the Guild since 1999, passed away on September 4th. A memorial service will be held on Saturday, the 13th at 2:00 pm. The Guild will make a donation in her name to the TheraPets organization. If you wish to add to our donation, you may give a check or cash to Treasurer Shirley Weaver or any member of the Board. The directories are almost complete. They should be ready next month and will either be mailed to you or given to you at the next meeting.

Raffle Quilt ('tween" quilt) Sept 2009-Aug 2010:

The ADOS Bee would like the members of the Guild to help make this quilt. Packets with background fabric and instructions are ready for you to take home and make a block. To finish the block you will only need to add in your own favorite batik fabric. They are hoping that all the blocks will be returned by December so that the blocks can be sewn together and quilted in January. The quilt will then be ready to go out as a raffle quilt in February.
