There were no changes or corrections to the prior meeting minutes or to the treasurer's report so they were accepted as printed in the newsletter.

OLD AND NEW BUSINESS:

The next board meeting will be Jan. 11, 2010 at Tino's Restaurant in Collin Creek Mall. Dinner will be at 6:00 p.m. and the meeting starts at 7:00 p.m.

The refreshments tonight were provided by the board and the piano was played by new member Sheryl Stith.

Our books were recently audited by Joan Wilson and Beverly Almaraz and found to be in good order.

Donna announced that our guild will give a donation to the church and anyone wanting to add to that donation can leave their money in the basket on the table behind the podium.

Donna introduced the Lone Star recipients and gave those in attendance their award (see list following the Minutes). She also handed out anniversary pins and service award bars. Donna explained that any service to the guild qualifies, not just Community Service. These hours are also used for the grant application.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Programs: Donna Lobelson announced that Bonnie McCaffery will be the guest speaker in January. Donna also announced that rooms 153 & 154 at this church will now be used for our classes.

Stockings: LaDawn Dalley announced she has 722 filled stockings with over 200 stockings appropriate for women, thanks to a large donation from J.C. Penney's. COMMUNITY SERVICE – Julie Schaefer

If you attending the regular meeting this last Thursday you heard that I am just so pleased at how you have jumped in and made Christmas Quilts for Collin County Children's Advocacy Center this last month as well as the previous months. This includes those that piece, quilt and bind them. What a combined effort! I've always felt that I have been blessed and to give back to others always warms my heart as well as helping those that are less fortunate than I. I'm just so glad there are so many in the guild that feel the same way. I am planning on setting up a tour of the Children's Advocacy Center sometime in February. Of course we wouldn't be seeing the children, but would be able to see what goes on and get some interesting information on exactly what CAC is all about. Please email me juliescha@sbcglobal.net if you would like to go and have a time that would be convenient for you. I know there are a lot of you that work during the week but might like to tour the Center on Sat. Let me know or I will be setting the visit during a morning of the week.

Last month I took 61 blankets, quilted, crocheted and fleece, to the Children's Advocacy Center since my last reporting and also 6 to the Rape Crisis Center. After the Guild meeting on the 10th, I have many more to take to Children's Advocacy Center. Y'all need to pat yourselves on the back. June Austin, Tina Connolly's mom, also needs to be thanked for her crocheting of so many afghans. What a lovely lady.

LaDawn will be taking **2 vans** full of stockings to Parkland and the total figures will be out soon. Now you must understand why we want to get started making them in September. September may sound early to get started on our Christmas stockings, but actually this is one of those projects that we could be working on all year so that we aren't pushing at the last minute. I'm thinking about having kits with me for all the meetings for 2010 and some of you will then have joy throughout the year.

We have been asked by the Curator of Education for the North Texas History Center in McKinney to do a trunk show on the 9th of January. Joan Wilson has graciously accepted the task of doing the presentation. Has anyone noticed there are some people who always seem to pull us out when we are in a ditch and need help? Well one of those people that ALWAYS will work with the Guild doing anything is Joan Wilson. (Well, to be honest, when I first talked to her about it I believe there was a bit of a

whine in my voice.) That is why Teresa was asking for help in obtaining older quilts along with their history so that Joan could use them in the trunk show. Now I have mentioned many times before so I know you do remember that the basis for the Guilds nonprofit eligibility is we qualify under "Community Education" and that is what we are really all about. (Bet you thought it was just a bunch of us whippersnappers that like to sew with friends.) I need to video Joan and share it with y'all. Wouldn't that be fun to set up before a meeting?

This month of course we don't have our Sit and Sew day at the Plano Sewing Center however January starts a new year for not only sewing with a group of friends but learning new patterns and donating more quilts. The next sew day is January 12th. We meet at the Plano Sewing Center which is on the southeast corner of Custer and Spring Creek starting at 10:00. You can come and go at your own schedule. Karen Christoffer organizes these days and always has a kit to work on by yourself or with another. The one requirement that she asks is that you contact her if you are coming. Karen.christoffer@comcast.net She needs to set up the seating and have kits ready. If you forget to call she will probably fit you in anyway if you come. She will be there until 5:00 so if you want to come at 2 or 3 and work a couple hours that's great. Oh, if you want to sew you will need to bring you portable sewing machine. However, you can always iron, put stuffing in pillows if we are making cough pillows, cut if we are making stockings or help put backs with pieced tops. There is always something for everyone to do. For those of you that work or for another reason can't come on that day and would like to sew, at every regular meeting Karen or I will be at the "Community Service" table and there will be kits for you to take home if you want to piece a top. The kits are usually pretty easy because we want every quilter from newbie to experienced sewing. Most of the time Karen will put a pattern inside the plastic bag to follow but if you take a kit, you may always do whatever pattern you wish. There are also tops that have been pieced and need to be quilted and of course then binding needs to be done. That's where Aggie Meszaros and a bunch of us really shine. We are great binders. (Don't ask about my appliqué.)

Next year we will also be collecting service hours for 2010 bars for our pins. Get started in January by putting down any hours that you have worked in doing anything for the Guild including transportation time and you will be amazed at how fast they accrue.

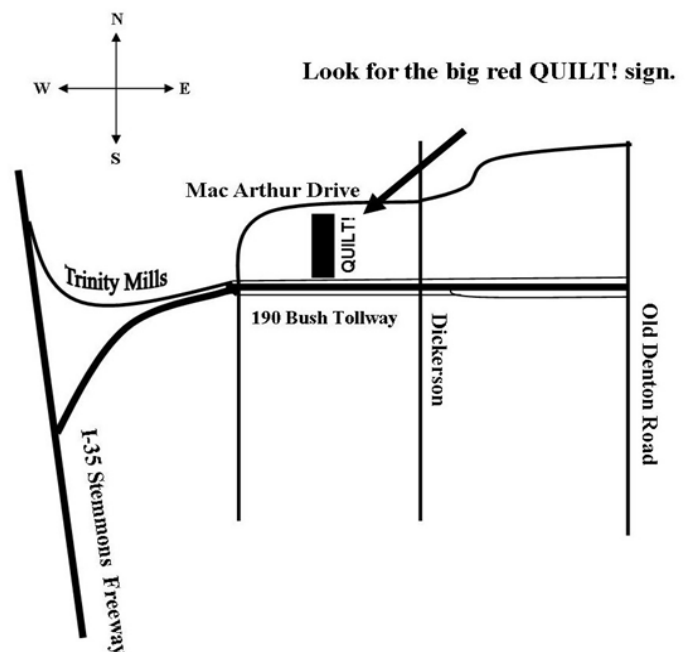

Background (cream):

A - 2 @ $1\frac{1}{2}$ X $10\frac{1}{2}$

B - 2 @ $3\frac{1}{2}$ X $1\frac{1}{2}$

C - 2 @ 2 X $7\frac{1}{2}$

D - 4 @ $1\frac{1}{2}$ X $1\frac{1}{2}$

Jar Lid: E - 1 @ $4\frac{1}{2}$ X $1\frac{1}{2}$

Jar Contents: F - 1 @ $7\frac{1}{2}$ X $7\frac{1}{2}$

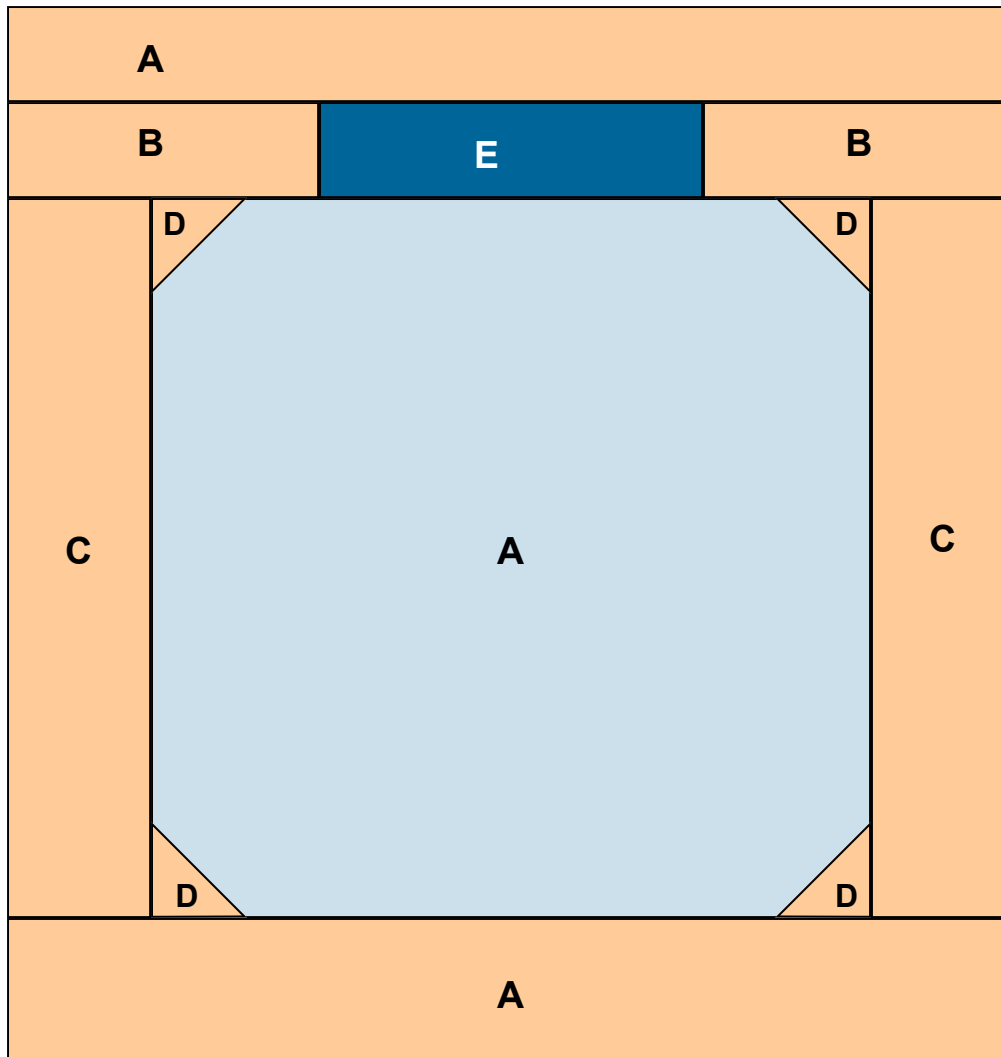
May be a jar of cookies, candy, jelly beans, jelly, jam, honey, donuts, peppermints, etc.

Sewing instructions:

Draw a diagonal line from one corner to the opposite corner on the back of each of the D squares. Place each on a corner of the F square and sew on the drawn lines. Trim and press. Sew C to the sides of F. Sew B to the sides of E. Press. Sew all together as shown, below, and press.
