Hello Everyone

Glorious Spring has finally arrived. The flowering trees are beautiful. Doesn't all this reawakening of spring make you want to start a new project? And then seeing all the beautiful quilts at the Dallas Quilt Show was also inspiring. Maybe this is the inspiration you need to get started on your quilt for our show in 2011. I have mine well started. Just need to keep on track to have it ready.

I'm happy to see that so many of you have also been earning your service hours that will get you your 2010 service bar. You still have plenty of time to earn the bar. Anything you do in the service of the guild counts toward your 30 hours. One of the best things you can do is to take the raffle quilt to different places to sell tickets. Kemberly Wilshire, Margaret Schafer and I are working on the scheduling for showing the quilt. We are particularly interested in anything "outside the box". There are so many raffle quilts offered by all the guilds in the area that any place different we can show the quilt will be helpful in selling tickets. The raffle tickets and the quilt show are how we fund bringing in our national speakers. Please do your part to show the quilt and sell tickets. Let one of us know if you know of a different venue to sell tickets.

There are also other ways to earn your service bar. Your community service time sewing of quilts and Christmas stockings certainly counts. The time you spend doing your committee work, the hours you spend helping with education projects, the time you spend making 9 patch blocks for members who have moved away... all count in earning your service bar. Be sure to let Karen Christoffer and Julie Schaefer know about your hours. We also need to record the hours to maintain our tax exempt status and to complete grant filings.

That leads into another area of thought. It's time to complete the grant filing for the City of Plano Arts Grant. If anyone is interested in helping with this, please contact me. I can certainly use the help in getting all the information and pictures together for the presentation. I have copies of most of the letters we have received from people and organizations that receive our quilts. But if you have received one you would like included in our presentation, I would love to have a copy. The arts grants from Plano are funded by the money collected from hotel and motel use tax. Due to the state of the economy, that tax money is smaller than it has been in the past. In order to receive part of that money, we need to present a full description of what we do for the community. I'm also interested in filing for other grants. If you know of companies or organizations that give grant money to non-profit organizations, please contact me so that I can find out about it.

Remember that TAQG 2010 Rally Day is July 10th. QGP is one of the sponsoring guilds this year. Plan to attend and enjoy the program presented by Cynthia England. Her workshops are offered on Thursday, July 8th for Pansy Table Runner and Friday, July 9th for ½ Day Design and ½ Day Sewing. Learn how to turn one of your favorite pictures into a pictorial quilt. Hope to see you at Rally Day.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

<u>Quilt Show 2011: Kemberly Wilshire</u> showed the raffle quilt hanging on a stand and passed out tickets for members to sell. She challenged members to step outside the box and take the raffle quilt to different places (like businesses, banks and grocery stores). Her goal is to sell \$10,000.00 worth of tickets which has never been done before. Margaret added that she needs members to take the raffle quilt around and sell tickets. Kemberly also said that for the 2011 quilt show she needs 3 chairpersons: quilt angels, publicity and admissions.



All members receiving emails about the guild newsletter will notice a new format for the email this month. This new format is very user friendly, and will quickly take you to the information you want to see, be it the newsletter, upcoming events, block of the month, or workshop registration. Passwords are no longer required! If you do not receive the email near the beginning of each month, please let me know at webmaster@quiltersguildofplano.org.

To keep in good standing with the internet service providers (ISPs), it is helpful if you click on the "Confirm" near the top of the email you receive, to let our email service know you are okay with being on our mailing list. It will say "You're receiving this email because of your relationship with Quilters Guild of Plano. Please Confirm your continued interest in receiving email from us." This will help us resolve any problems with ISPs thinking we are spam.

Also, our website is being moved to a new service provider. This will take 1-2 weeks, during which time our website will be down. I plan to start the move immediately after our guild meeting in April. Newsletters, block of the month, and anything else online will not be available during this time.

PROGRAMS & WORKSHOPS - Donna Lobelson

April's program will be given by Helen Ogden Widener, author of "Scraps of Life." You may have seen her lovely reproduction 1850's Postage Stamp on Point quilt at the Dallas show.

When the Alamo granted Helen, an avid history buff and author, permission to document and photograph Elizabeth Patton Crockett's fragile quilt top, Helen knew that her story had to be told. With no prior quilting knowledge, Helen focused on selecting just the right fabrics, learned the fine art of quilt-making and brought Elizabeth's story to life.

Elizabeth Patton Crockett's story begins with her father, Robert Patton, providing wagons and supplies during the *American Revolution* to the *Overmountain Men* on their way to the *Battle of Kings Mountain*. The book contains numerous photos and illustrations of battle scenes and everyday life of the time period.

As *Scraps of Life* moves you through the beautiful blocks and antique fabric galleries of Elizabeth's Original Quilt Top, you catch glimpses of the joys of frontier life and the sorrows and hardships that followed the deaths of each of her husbands.

Elizabeth's story ends with her own death, after a morning walk on January 31,1860, in Acton, Texas. Helen and her husband James live in Irving, Texas, and have six children and twelve grandchildren.

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<u> COMMUNITY SERVICE – Julie Schaefer</u>

I know that some people don't read past the first paragraph of a newsletter column, which is better than not reading the Newsletter at all, so right off the bat I am going to mention that you need to block off a couple dates on your calendar to do some heavy duty sewing. Since Carrie Oransky's "Piecing Goodwill" group doesn't meet during the summer months, our fearless leader Karen Christoffer has delegated two of that group's meeting days (4th Tuesday of every month) at the *Plano Sewing Center* to work on cough pillows and Christmas stockings. June 22nd, we will be working only on cough pillows for the *Medical Center of Plano*. For those of you that worked on them last year you know that we will need sewers, ironers and stuffers. We try to get at least 100 completed at a time. "Cough pillows" are firm small pillows that post-surgery patients place on their upper abdomen when they have to cough in order to alleviate fragile muscle strain. A little birdie told me that someone* had been sewing some pillows on her own and had over 40 of them completed

which doesn't lessen the amount that the guild still needs to make. The *Medical Center* performs around 25 surgeries a day so the pillows are used quickly.

<u>July 27th</u>, is designated for sewing Christmas Stockings. We are trying to get away from that awful push during October and November to complete over 1000 stockings. This won't of course stop me from nagging during those two months to sew more of them. Which reminds me that if you have any kits at home that haven't been sewn bring them to the Community Service table at the guild meeting and someone will snatch them up and finish them. I brought about 5-6 kits for a single sock this last meeting and they were the first to go. I have a bet with another quilter whether they will come back at the next meeting. We will also continuously be collecting any items to fill the stockings. Cynthia Weisz has said that she has left-over freebies from the retreat at *Tanglewood*. I do too but have just been moving them around from room to room not selecting a spot for accumulation. Did/do any of you bring home toiletries from hotels? Susan Mankus brought a bag full last year that her husband, Steve, had brought home. From now on, I will have a basket at the table to put those items in so you won't have to move them around your house.

OK, so "piece work" which both of the two above are, isn't a lot of fun, but think of the *camaraderie* and good deeds you are doing.

If you were at the general meeting this last Thursday you know that I didn't have any quilts to deliver between February 11th and March 11th. Not having a guild meeting for whatever reason really interferes with collecting completed quilts. Well, everyone made up for it at this last general meeting. I received **17 quilts**. Thank you! Thank you! When I got home and brought them into my garden room (where I collect and sort items to deliver), the couch was once more piled high. Now, I have to put labels on them and get them out. Oh, I haven't mentioned that June Austin, our crochet fairy, donated another 4 afghans. Seems that Tina Connolly, June's daughter, recently bought her a huge book filled with different patterns for crocheting and June has been trying them out. The knitting world also has samplers. Anyway, they are exceptionally beautiful and we will be taking those to either the *Children's Advocacy Center* or *Rape Crises Center of Collin County*. I will report to you specifically in the next newsletter.

At every meeting I have many people ask if there are quilts to bind. I had many to quilt but none ready for binding at the last meeting. Remember that when you take a top et cetera to quilt you don't have to do the binding if you don't want to. There are more than enough binders in our guild. We really need people to quilt. Most of the "quilt rounds" that Karen sets up are small enough for your home machine to accommodate. Dayna Ragland, a long-armer, has graciously recently taken 5 packages of the larger top, back and batting to alleviate the backload of unquilted. Sandy Vinzant and I responded to my podium urgings to "take one home." Needless to say, I am only going to do "stitch in the ditch" which tells you how much I have progressed in my quilting skills.

<u>April 1st</u> is another date we need your help. Teresa Knode, our Education Chair, will be presenting two back-to-back workshops for after-schoolers at *Sigler Elementary* (1400 Janwood Dr.) which is south of 15th and just west of Alma. We need your help to assist students in making paper 4-patches or whatever Teresa decides will be done. They may be able to work up to a 9-patch. Email Teresa at <u>bearhugquilts@yahoo.com</u>.

Debbie Skorepa will be doing a Red Work Workshop at *Pioneer Place* (a retirement facility, 1928 Avenue K in Plano) on the afternoon of <u>April 12th</u>. I can help, but you know we need more than me (jack-of-all-trades master-of-none) so email Debbie <u>dskorepa@hotmail.com</u> that you will help out.

With all of these dates previously mentioned I don't want anyone to forget that we will be doing our Tuesday Community Service Sew Day on April 13th (the second Tuesday of every month). You may come and go as you like between 10:00 and 4:00 (Karen is there until 5:00) at the *Plano Sewing Center* which is on the SE corner of Spring Creek and Custer. Bring as many friends as you like. They don't even have to be members of the guild. Email Karen that you are coming Karen.christoffer@tx.rr.com. Bring your sewing machine and accoutrement or just tell her that you want to iron.

Before I send this off to Brooks Wilson, editor *extraordinaire*, I also want to remind everyone that if you have a pillowcase at home in kit or completed form, bring it to the guild. I know there are 20 out there floating in the breeze.

Don't forget to get the number of hours you have worked on something into the black 3-ring binder Karen keeps or email me juliescha@sbcglobal.net so I can get them on the computer.







Cut 2 @ $6\frac{1}{2}$ x $6\frac{1}{2}$; with right sides together, place a dot $2\frac{1}{2}$ " from the left at the top; draw a diagonal line from this dot to the other lower right corner, and cut on this line. See diagram "C". These 2 will be sewn to the cone.


Ice cream scoop: any color! Cut 1 template "A" and 1 reversed "A". Pin the edges and center (and more if needed) of "A" to "B" at the curve; sew, being careful not to stretch the fabric as you sew. Go slow and you can do these curves! Press. Sew these 2 units together; press.

lce cream cone: 1 @ 6 ½ x 5 ½; fold the 6 ½ in half as shown, diagram "D"; it will measure 3 % x 5 %. Cut diagonally from one corner to the opposite corner. Unfold and this is your cone! Sew cone to backing, starting at cone top for both sides; the bottom edges will not match; press. Sew your ice cream scoop to your cone, matching the centers. Note that the edges of the ice cream overflow your cone, as in real life! Press. Cut block to 10 % x 10 %.
