MINUTES OF APRIL 8, 2010 - Sheri Smith, Secretary

The meeting was called to order by president Donna Petrick at 7:00 p.m. She asked everyone to please turn off their cell phones. There were no corrections or additions to the Minutes of the March meeting or the Treasurer's Report, so they stand as printed in the newsletter. There was no old business.

NEW BUSINESS:

The next Board meeting will be at Tino's Restaurant on May 3, 2010. Dinner is at 6:00 p.m. and the meeting will begin at 7:00 p.m.

Donna told the guild that she, MJ Fielek, Pat McCarroll and Sherry Worley have spent many days on a large donation of fabric given to us by a family. COMMUNITY SERVICE – Julie Schaefer

Thanks to everyone that has completed a quilt top, quilted and/or bound quilts for donation. Then you even remembered to bring them in to the guild. In March, we donated 12 quilts to the *Collin County Children's Advocacy Center*, and while I was there I noticed there were what seemed like around 75-100 candy filled Easter baskets on the floor in the foyer. Thinking to myself that I still had bright Easter themed pillowcases in the back of my SUV (*ConKerr Cancer* had not responded to my emails regarding delivery) I asked if they could use the pillowcases. The response was an energetic unanimous "Yes," so of course I walked out to the parking lot and returned with 66 pillowcases. We also donated six quilts and five afghans to *The Turning Point* better known as the *Rape Crises Center of Collin County*. The afghans were once again crocheted by June Austin. Last year we had received three huge plastic bags full of yarn in all sorts of colors and June has been using this yarn to make the afghans. Now we know how her daughter, Tina Connolly, got her sense of color coordination. It's those pesky genes at work again.

Maria Eakin and her mother, Enriqueta Benavides, who is also a guild member, made 45 cough pillows and delivered them to *Medical Center of Plano*. Well, Maria said that her mother made most of them. A huge "Thank You" goes out to both of them. This hospital has around 25 surgeries a day and many of the surgery patients can use them. These pillows are about 9" x 15" (measuring my abdominal area for whatever use that is) and stuffed with polyester fill or leftover poly batting. If you have some poly batting cut from the sides of a completed quilt (what is that?) bring it to Karen Christoffer. We need stuffing for the cough pillows that we will be making. Don't forget that June 22nd will be a sew day at *The Plano Sewing Center* to make only cough pillows. Put this date on your calendar. Everyone is invited and it's a fun way to build up service hours. BTW if you don't know what a cough pillow is, just ask.

LaDawn Dalley was at the general meeting with a table having kits to make Christmas stockings. She was surprised at the number of kits people took to make stockings at this time of year. I do believe that if we start early we won't be in a panic right before the winter holidays. Need I remind everyone that takes a kit to bring the finished stockings back ASAP and not leave the kit on a shelf waiting until November. There were kits taken at March's meeting; did they come back in April? LaDawn is still planning on a sew day to make only Christmas stockings on July 27th. This is also scheduled to be at *The Plano Sewing Center*. Everyone come.

I mentioned at the general meeting an interesting article from *The Wall Street Journal* titled "Truckers Pick Up Stitching: With Less to Haul, Drivers Try New Hobbies; Quilting in the Cab." You get the main idea from the headline. The gist of the article was that truckers, many independent, have more spare time because of the economy (loads of goods delivered by truckers fell 15% in 2009) and what is labeled "miniaturization" (it takes less space to move flat-screen TVs and iPods than the clunkier predecessors.) During down time on the road many drivers struggle to find a hobby that will keep their minds busy without being routine. Kevin Banks, a driver from Sioux Falls, South Dakota (my hometown) learned to knit. "Creating something tangible beats sitting around the truck-stop talking about who has a bigger radio." Dave White, a semi driver from Walcott, Iowa, after a suggestion from his quilter wife, outfitted his truck's sleeper cabin with a sewing machine, supplies and quilt patterns. His employer started a loosely organized "sewing club," and encourages drivers to show off their handiwork at headquarters. "Quilting gives you a little bit of ownership. You've actually accomplished something with your time off."

Karen Christoffer wants to remind everyone that the Tuesday sew day for the Guild is always the second Tuesday of the month at *The Plano Sewing Center* which is on the southeast corner of Custer and Spring Creek Parkway. The time is between 10:00 and 5:00 and everyone is invited to come and go at their convenience. She always has kits ready for us to work on. Email Karen at karen.christoffer@tx.rr.com to let her know you are coming. This is another way to build up your service hours. Always remember to get your hours down in Karen's black three-ring service hour binder. The reason we document the number of service hours is to use them in providing information when we apply for a grant as well as to substantiate our existence as a non-profit organization. Of course service hours also help members to earn charms for quilt pin bars. We need to start wearing those pins to all our meetings.

I'm going to help Debbie Skorepa with a Red Work Workshop at a retirement facility, Pioneer Place, this com-

ing Monday from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. I know a bunch of quilters, like Karen R. Wood, are really good at Red Work because I watched them help at the hand sewing table at "Quilt Plano 2009." I hope that we will have some other helpers tomorrow, the 12th. I have two sizes of a French Knot, almost nonexistent and loopy. Maybe I will find a solution for my knots. I will let you know how it went next month.

Now I have to tell you an experience that I had recently. My husband and I went to a charity benefit dinner and silent auction at our tennis/golf club. I was very pleased to have "won" two wooden framed portions of very old quilts, both hand quilted. One sampler was a Flying Geese pattern and one English Paper Piecing. On my way to "pay up" for my winnings I passed a man who made a facetious comment to me of the effect that he was going to bid on "those" because they would have gone really well in his garage. Needless to say I took great umbrage at his comment and asked him if he knew what was inside the frame. "Some old used quilts." Since the chap didn't have a clue about quilts, how they are made and the expense and time involved nor historical significance or about the Guild's donations, I stopped to give a very brief explanation during all of which the wife sat staring at my face intently. When I was through, the gentleman thanked me for taking the time to give them a "quilt education." Now the *pièce de résistance*, the "pony tail wife" (young, skinny, very long hair, 4" heels) said, "Ya know, I just love your earrings! Are they brass?" She hadn't listened to a word I had said.


