COMMUNITY SERVICE - Julie Schaefer

I love manning the Community Service table prior to the general meetings. I not only am able to give handy helpers quilts to be bound and quilted but I also receive some in. Last Thursday evening I received 12 finished quilts and 9 pillowcases. The pillowcases will stay in my garden room until we finish up the pillowcases we will be doing on the fourth Tuesday of August which will be the 24th. I say the quilts were finished and after I sew on the labels of 7 of them all will be finished and ready to deliver. Last month I delivered 23 quilts to the Children's Advocacy Center and 10 quilts to the Rape Crises Center. On Tuesday the 8th, June Austin one of our most prolific new members delivered 3 more beautiful afghans to me. In May I delivered 3 afghans to the Children's Advocacy Center and 11 afghans to the Rape Crises Center.

June starts the count for the 2010 - 2011 year. I still have 6 very large quilts that need to be bound. I will have them with me on the 22^{nd} of this month at the Plano Sewing Center from 10:00 to 4:00, so if you would like to bind a quilt, instead of taking 3 small ones, why not take one large one. They probably are equal to each other.

As I mentioned, we will be working on cough pillows at the Plano Sewing Center (SE corner of Custer and Spring Creek) on Tuesday June 22nd. We have 8 members signed up to help but could use many more. If you don't want to bring your sewing machine, you can pull apart some of the poly batting and stuff the pillows after someone has sewn practically all around 2 pieces of fabric or you can help by sewing the open space closed. If we have enough sewing machines we can finish the sewing up on the machine which naturally is faster. Karen will have cut enough material for 100 cough pillows so I hope that we can at least get them sewn together and started stuffing.

On the fourth Tuesday of July (27th) we will be sewing Christmas stockings with LaDawn Dalley and the fourth Tuesday of August (24th) we will be doing Pillowcases with Karen. Thanks to LaDawn there were plenty of stockings to take home at the general meeting. Remember to work on them now and bring them back at the next meeting. Many members have found that an easy way to get rid of stash is to make pillowcases out of bigger pieces and cough pillows (9-12" x 13-16") out of smaller. We will use whatever you give us including old batting or polyfiber fill.

Don't forget to send me your hours that you have worked for the guild in any capacity. Either put them in the black 3-ring binder or email them to me. I 'preciate it and you of course. juliescha@sbcglobal.net
