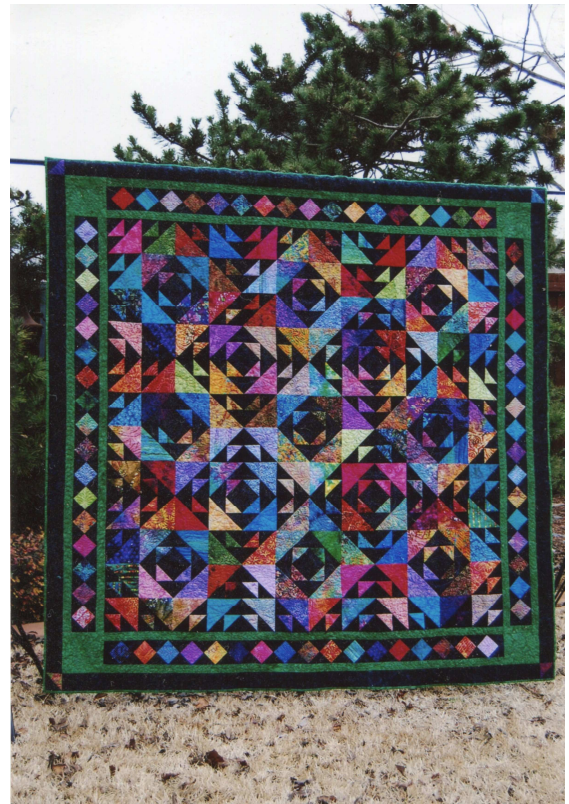

COMMUNITY SERVICE - Julie Schaefer

What busy months June and July were. We worked on cough pillows at the Plano Sewing Center on Tuesday June 22nd. Rita Potter, Barbara Collins and Terri Mendelow sewed the precut fabric (Karen had enough fabric cut for 300 cough pillows.) Ruth Shriner, Enriqueta Benavides and I stuffed the sewn fabric pieces. In the afternoon Enriqueta and I stuffed pillows and Sheryl Stith finished the pillows off by sewing the opening closed. We made 65 cough pillows which is a good start. However, we need to complete at least 100 to donate to the surgical center of the Plano Medical Center, so the fourth Tuesday of August we will again be working on cough pillows. If we could get enough volunteers to stuff and sew we could be done with them after August.

We will be doing Christmas stockings with LaDawn Dalley the fourth Tuesday of this month. LaDawn will lead us at the Plano Sewing Center. I will have to get back with you on the results of that. We will also be sewing Christmas stockings at the next general meeting which will be August 13th. We need to do at least 1000 stockings so bring your sewing machines to the meeting. It is really a lot of fun. Two years ago we had a meeting where we just sewed stockings. Some people prepared the fabric to be sewn (stocking and cuff) which is already cut and some sewed. Actually we had a competition going with another table. What a hoot. Remember all you that have taken stocking kits home, we need them back ASAP.

I wasn't at the gathering on July 8th because I was in a class all day with Cynthia England sponsored by the TAQG (Texas Association of Quilt Guilds). I learned a unique way of piecing similar to paper piecing but not sewing on the paper. Cynthia is just a little hyperactive and very humorous to work with so we really enjoyed ourselves. It was raining when we drove home late in the afternoon from the Mimosa Baptist Church in Mesquite, and for some unknown reason I got lost twice driving around highways 30, 80 and 635. Guess it has been too long since I worked for DISD and traveled that area often. Anyway, when I finally arrived home I was exhausted and just crashed. Saturday was the official Rally Day for TAQG and we exhibited our raffle quilt along with about 25 other guilds. We sold 65 tickets. I can't remember how many we sold last year but I felt we did well. TAQG is always a wonderful experience and fun to meet and greet other guild members from around the state. If you've never attended a Rally Day keep it in the back of your mind to go next year.

Every second Tuesday of each month we have a sit and sew day for Community Service. Karen Christoffer has quilt kits ready to be sewn. We work at the Plano Sewing Center which is on the SE corner of Custer and Spring Creek from 10:00 – 4:00. We had two new people joining us this last Tuesday, and we invited them to join our Guild. If you want to be a part of this fun group that takes time to sew for others we welcome you with open arms and warmth. Remember you may come and go as you wish. The only 2 requirements are that you email Karen Karen.christoffer@tx.rr.com telling her that you will be there so she has enough kits ready, and that you bring your traveling sewing machine and kit.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH - Connie Litfin

Sawtooth Sampler Block of the Month

We will be doing a 12" finished Sawtooth Star with a different 6" block in the center. There will be 12 blocks in all, two blocks a month.

For the star you will need: (You can work ahead on the star part if you wish.)

Star points – 1 yd.

Background – 1 ½ yd.

The surprise blocks are 6" finished and will fit in the center of the star. They can be done with scraps or fat quarters.

For each star block you will need:

Star points – cut 8 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares

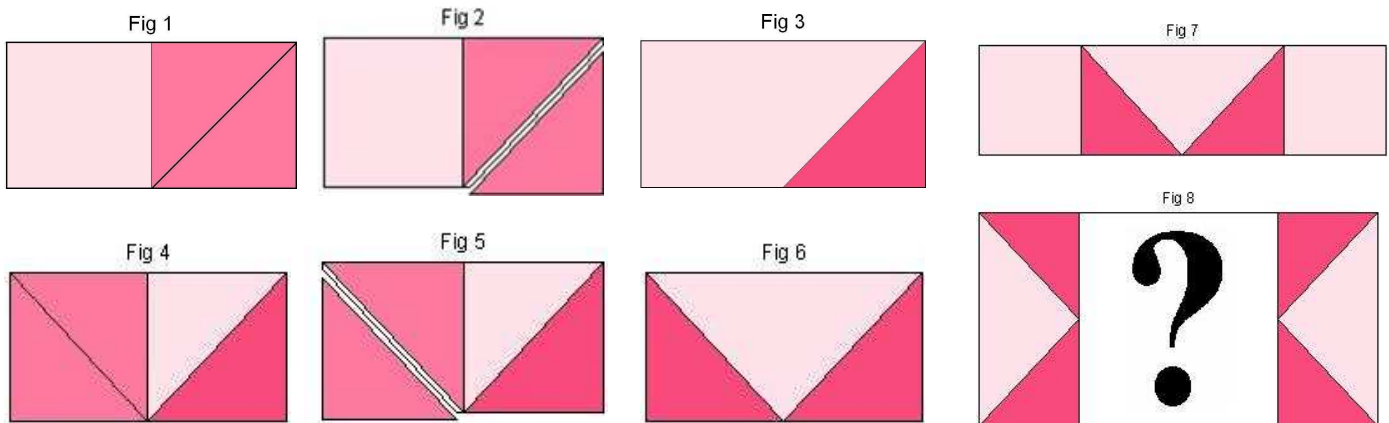
Background – cut 4 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares

cut 4 (3 ½" x 6 ½") rectangles

On the back of the star point squares, mark a diagonal line. Place a star point square face down at one end of the background rectangle (right sides together). Sew on the diagonal line (Fig. 1). Press, then trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 2). Press toward point (Fig. 3).

Sew another star point square on the other end of that same rectangle (Fig. 4). Make sure the diagonal line is going in the right direction. Sew on the diagonal line. Press and trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 5). Press toward point (Fig. 6).

Sew a background square to each side of two star points (Fig. 7). Press toward points. Sew a star point to each side of the 6" block (Fig. 8). Press toward points. Sew sections together. Your block should measure 12 ½".

BLOCK OF THE MONTH, August 2010 blocks— Connie Litfin

Block One—*Puss in the Corner Variation*

Fabric Requirements:

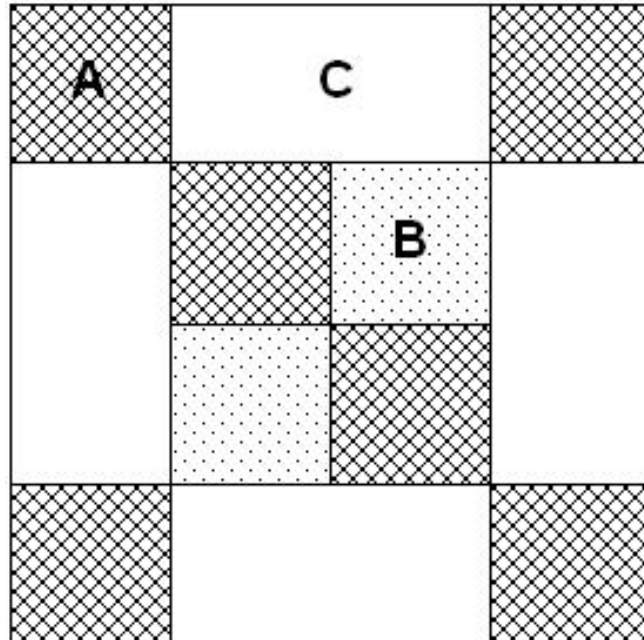
Fabric A – Main Color
Cut 6 (2" x 2") squares

Fabric B – 2nd Color
Cut 2 (2" x 2") squares

Fabric C – Background
Cut 4 (2" X 3 1/2") rectangle

Assembly:

Lay out pieces as shown in diagram and sew together. This block will be inserted in the center of the Sawtooth Star.



Block Two - *Carrie Nation*

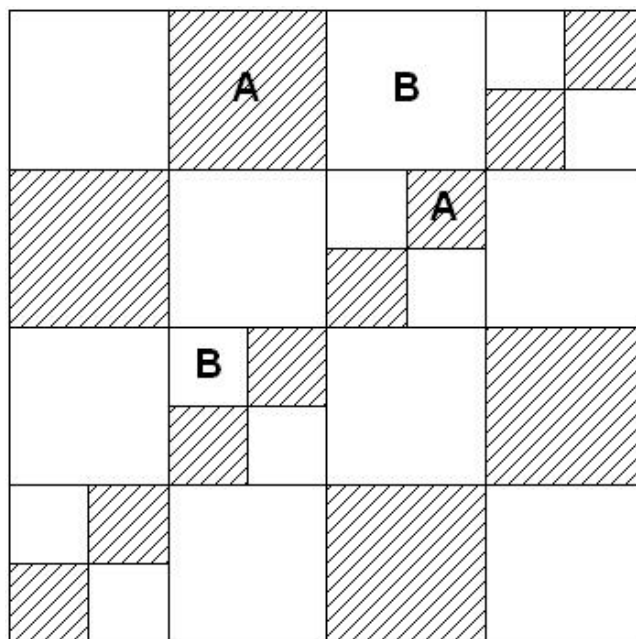
Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A - Main Color
Cut 4 (2" x 2") squares Cut 1 - 1" x 10" strip

Fabric B ~ Color
Cut 8 (2" x 2") squares Cut 1 - 1 W' x 10" strip

Assembly:

Put strips right sides together and sew length using 1/4" seam allowance. Press to dark color. Cut into 1 1/4" sections; sew into 4-patches. Using diagram sew block as shown. This block will be inserted in the center of Sawtooth Star.
