Have I mentioned that I hate being in Texas the three months of July, August and September? Thank heavens we are going to be gone up north most of September. It should be cool at least at night in: Aspen where oldest daughter lives, Sioux Falls, SD where my 50th high school reunion will be and then on to The Naval Academy in Annapolis for some class meeting of one sort or another. In the meantime in July I delivered 9 children's quilts to the Collin County Children's Advocacy Center. Turning Point – Collin County Rape Crisis Center received 5 quilts and 6 afghans. Every month I am just amazed at the number of quilts people bring in that they have pieced, quilted and/or bound.

At the last board meeting I presented the list of agencies we will be donating to this year. The list was approved by the board at that time. Thank you, thank you, and thank you to all the people that stayed and worked on Christmas Stockings after the general meeting on the 12th. I have already put the service hours on the spread sheet. I think that LaDawn Dalley (Chair of the Stocking Project) counted at least 100 stockings that were finished that night. Terri Mendelow and I had the additional pleasure of sitting with 2 new members and they are "long armers". That is a word isn't it? Remember we will be bring-ing kits to make stockings at the general meetings and hope that everyone remembers to bring the completed ones back quickly. Barbara Collins, Sally Martin and Rhonda Kuntz all brought bags full they had finished at the Second Tuesday Community Service Sew Day on the 10th of this month. Don't forget to bring any items that can be put inside the stockings (women's health or children's items).

Sawtooth Sampler Block of the Month

We will be doing a 12" finished Sawtooth Star with a different 6" block in the center. There will be 12 blocks in all, two blocks a month.

For the star you will need: (You can work ahead on the star part if you wish.) Star points – 1 yd. Background – 1 ½ yd.

The surprise blocks are 6" finished and will fit in the center of the star. They can be done with scraps or fat quarters.


For each star block you will need:

Star points – cut 8 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares Background – cut 4 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares cut 4 (3 ½" x 6 ½") rectangles

On the back of the star point squares, mark a diagonal line. Place a star point square face down at one end of the background rectangle (right sides together). Sew on the diagonal line (Fig. 1). Press, then trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig.2). Press toward point (Fig. 3).

Sew another star point square on the other end of that same rectangle (Fig. 4). Make sure the diagonal line is going in the right direction. Sew on the diagonal line. Press and trim leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance (Fig. 5). Press toward point (Fig. 6).

Sew a background square to each side of two star points (Fig. 7). Press toward points. Sew a star point to each side of the 6" block (Fig. 8). Press toward points. Sew sections together. Your block should measure 12 ½".

BLOCK OF THE MONTH, September 2010 blocks— Connie Litfin

Block Three—Churn Dash

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A – 1st Color Cut 2 (2-7/8" x 2-7/8") squares in half on diagonal

Fabric B – 2nd Color Cut 1 (1¹/₂" x 10")

Fabric C – 3rd Color Cut 2 (2-7/8" X 2-7/8") squares on diagonal Cut 1 (1-1/2" X 10")

Fabric D—4th Color Cut 1 (2 ½" x 2 ½")

Assembly:

Make half square triangles with fabrics A and

C, press to dark. Sew the 1 1/2" X 10" strips together using 1/4" seam allowances, press to dark and cut into 2 1/2" sections. Use block diagram for layout positions and sew together as shown. This block will be inserted in the center of the Sawtooth Star.

Block Four=*Tail of Benjamin's Kite*

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A - Bsckground Cut 2 (2-7/8" x 2-7/8") squares in half on diagonal Cut 1 (1-1/2" X 15") strip


Fabric B ~ 2nd Color Cut 1 (1-1/2" X 15") strip


Fanroc C—3rd Color

Cut 2 (2-7/8" X 2-7/8") squares in half on diagonal

Assembly:

Make 4 half square triangles with fabrics A and C. Press to dark. Sew 1 1/2" X 15" strips of fabrics A and B together. Press to dark and cut into 1 1/2" pieces. Makes five 4-patches. Sew together a shown in diagram. This block will be inserted in the center of Sawtooth Star.
