MINUTES OF August 2010 - Donna Lobeleon, Secretary

The meeting was called to order by President Sheri Smith at 7:03. She reminded everyone to turn off their cell phones. She welcomed the Mc Kinney and the Allen Quilt Guilds and invited members to purchase tickets for their raffle quilts.

The Minutes to the August meeting and the treasurer's report were accepted as printed. All members in attendance voted on the proposed by-laws change to allow annual quilt shows. There was no old business

The Next board meeting will be October 11, 2010 at Tino's restaurant. The business meeting will start at 7:00 pm; arrive at 6:00 if you would like dinner.

The membership directories were passed out at the September meeting and will be mailed to members not in attendance.

Committee Reports:

Margaret Schafer, education, asked for volunteers to assist with a quilting program at Prestonwood Court on Wednesday September 15, 2010 at 2:00 pm, and for the International Festival on October 2, 2010.

Teri Mendelow (for Julie Schaefer), Community Service, announced that Hope's Door would like six children's quilts, three for boys and three for girls, in December. Teri reminded everyone to log in their volunteer hours.

Cynthia Weisz, Mini Quilt Auction, thanked members for donating mini quilts, asked members to keep making them and mentioned the prize basket that one mini quilt donor will win.

Donna Petrick, Programs, showed samples for Mary Massey's in October class, "Not Your Grandmother's Log Cabin".

Connie Litfin, Block of the Month, participants showed their completed blocks. Sally Hamilton was the monthly winner.

Crisann Skinner, Membership, announced that 86 members, seven new members and 14 guests were in attendance.

Sheri Smith announced that that proposal to change to an annual quilt show did not pass. It was defeated by four votes. Discussion followed that members did not understand that the reason for wanting an annual show was to increase fund raising. It was suggested that we vote on this change again.

By-Laws Change – Quilt Show

Article 6.18.3 states: (Quilt Show Chair) Is responsible for the biennial quilt show and may appoint committees to carry out this function as necessary.

Proposed change to read: Is responsible for the annual quilt show and may appoint committees to carry out this function as necessary.

The above change in the By-Laws is requested at this time due to the timing of reserving the facility for producing future quilt shows. The complete By-Laws are under review by a committee and changes will be presented to the guild in total at a future date.

Congratulations to our very own Joan Wilson. One of her quilts, designed and made by her has been chosen to be published in a book that is to be released in the fall of 2011.

The book is to be the third in a trilogy of books about quilts made in Texas and is authored by Karey Patterson Bresenhan and Nancy O'Bryant Puentes. Their two previous publications are "Lone Stars, A Legacy of Texas Quilts, 1836-1936", and "Lone Stars, A Legacy of Texas Quilts, 1936-1986". In the formal notification, Karey stated, "There are only 200 quilts in the book to represent the last 25 years of quilt making in Texas, and you are one of the honored quilt makers." "Selecting the quilts was a huge challenge because of the number of extraordinary pieces that were submitted for consideration. It was certainly difficult to make the final selections since we were trying to include such a wide variety of quilts--original pieces, traditional quilts made from patterns, awardwinning quilts, mini quilts, mixed media quilts, group quilts, etc. We enjoyed reacquainting ourselves with quilt makers whose work we remember from the past and found it equally exciting to see how many new names can be found in the final list. Texas is truly a "hotbed" of quilt making!"

I want to thank everyone that brought in quilts pieced, quilted and/or bound. I will be taking them to the various agencies when I am back. Also, thanks for bringing back completed Christmas stockings. Now remember to collect soaps, shampoos, et al from your trips as well as any feminine hygiene items that we can put in stockings for the women at Parkland. Remember also that we will need small books, toys, pencils, crayons, candy etc. to stuff children's stockings. Kaye England Program and Workshop—Donna Petrick

It was wonderful to see so many of you turn out for Kaye England's program and to have a good number of you sign up for the two workshops. Kaye was full of information, techniques and funny stories. One of the best things about our guild is that we have been able to bring in such wonderful speakers. However, I don't think that most of you have any idea what it cost to bring in such talent. Most people look at the budget when we are done for the year and don't think about what it represents. Kaye England cost us \$2,250 plus airfare, lodging and food. Her lecture was \$450. Each workshop was \$900. If we had 20 people in each workshop, paying \$45.00, we would have paid for the workshops. Of course, we didn't, so the lecture, balance of the workshops and balance of her expenses have to be paid by the guild.

When you take into consideration that we bring in 5 to 6 speakers a year, you can see how quickly our money is spent. The money comes from the biennial quilt show. Without our quilt show, we could not have the programs we enjoy so much. For the national speakers, we have to get on their calendars as much as 2 years ahead of the program. We have to hold back money from the show to pay for those future speakers. Needless to say, it takes money to run this organization and provide the membership with fun, worthwhile programs. Please try to take advantage of the workshops and attend the lectures.

Sawtooth Sampler Block of the Month

We will be doing a 12" finished Sawtooth Star with a different 6" block in the center. There will be 12 blocks in all, two blocks a month.

For the star you will need: (You can work ahead on the star part if you wish.) Star points – 1 yd. Background – 1 ½ yd.

The surprise blocks are 6" finished and will fit in the center of the star. They can be done with scraps or fat quarters.


For each star block you will need:

Star points – cut 8 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares Background – cut 4 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares cut 4 (3 ½" x 6 ½") rectangles

On the back of the star point squares, mark a diagonal line. Place a star point square face down at one end of the background rectangle (right sides together). Sew on the diagonal line (Fig. 1). Press, then trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig.2). Press toward point (Fig. 3).

Sew another star point square on the other end of that same rectangle (Fig. 4). Make sure the diagonal line is going in the right direction. Sew on the diagonal line. Press and trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 5). Press toward point (Fig. 6).

Sew a background square to each side of two star points (Fig. 7). Press toward points. Sew a star point to each side of the 6" block (Fig. 8). Press toward points. Sew sections together. Your block should measure 12 ½".

BLOCK OF THE MONTH, October 2010 blocks— Connie Litfin

Block Five—Spool

Fabric Requirements:


Fabric A – Background Cut 4 (2-3/8" X2-2/8") squares in half on diagonal Cut 4 (2" X 2") squares

Fabric B – Cut 3 (2-3/8" X 2-3/8" squares in half on diagonal

Fabric C – Spool Color Cut 1 (3-7/8" X 3-7/8") square in half on diagonal Cut 1 (2-3/8" X 2-3/8" square in half on diagonal

Assembly:

Make 4 fabrics A and B half square triangles and 2 fabrics B and C half square triangles, pressing to dark. Use block diagram for placement and sew block together. This block will be inserted in the center of the Sawtooth Star.



Block Four-Sawtooth Sampler

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A -Cut 2 (3-1/2" x 3-1/2") squares Cut 4 (2" X 2") squares

Fabric B ~ 2nd Color Cut 1 (1-1/4" X 10)


Fabric C—3rd Color

Cut 1 (1-1/4" by 10)

Assembly:

With right sides together sew the two 1 ¼" x 10" pieces together. Press to dark. Cut into 1

 $\frac{1}{4}$ " sections and make 4 four-patches. Lay out pieces as shown and sew together. This block will be inserted in the center of Sawtooth Star.
