### MINUTES OF August 2010 - Donna Lobeleon, Secretary

The meeting was called to order by President Sheri Smith at 7:02. She reminded everyone to turn off their cell phones.

#### **Old Business:**

### **COMMUNITY SERVICE - Julie Schaefer**

If you went to the Guild meeting on October 14<sup>th</sup> you know that we were stressed for time and I asked that everyone read my column in the newsletter. There seems like so much to report on and tell you about. At September's meeting so many of you brought in quilts and I thank you for that. I delivered 13 quilts and 5 afghans to The Turning Point – Rape Crisis Center and 20 "child oriented" small quilts to the Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) of Collin County. That is just tremendous. We still need small quilts to give to the CAC at Christmas time. We usually give around 30-40 quilts that are about 36" x 36". I was told that the children receive a basket in December and the quilts are spread on the bottom and then filled with items donated by corporations. We also need 12 quilts for Hope's Door; 6 of them need to be boy oriented and 6 girly. Of each 6 male/female oriented quilts, 3 need to be for younger girls and boys and 3 for those "eventual teenagers" (you know that age where the kids don't know whether they are Martha or Arthur – 11-12). The older kids need larger sized quilts like maybe 46" X whatever. We received a lot of quilts at this last meeting and I am going to keep back some of those for our December donations.

More importantly, Karen Christoffer has made packets of flannel square blocks that have been acucut™ with fringe all around and are so easy to put together that any confident beginner can easily do them. They don't even need batting or quilting as we usually think of it. The blocks are put together with a pair WST stitched to another pair with WST. She would like to use only the flannel quilts for Children's Advocacy Center. Do you remember the donation we received of about 50 plastic tubs about a year ago? Well after washing everything and sorting, we ended up with 2 tubs full of flannel and then others like Helen Wilems donated bolts of flannel from home. Karen and others took days to cut and put together collections that would make a pleasant combination and already we have been sewing blocks together. At the October Tuesday Community Sew Day at the Plano Sewing Center 11 people (Sally Martins, Barbara Collins, Sheri Smith, Helen Wilems Ruth Shriner, Carroll Thune, Sarah Krauss, Madelyn Beachboard, Terri Mendelow, Karen and I) worked on the flannel quilts some more. But, we still need many more. Please consider coming to Community Sew Day in November on the 9<sup>th</sup> to help us out. We meet at The Plano Sewing Center about 10:00 or whenever you can make it between 10:00 and 4:00. The Plano Sewing Center is on the SE corner of Custer and Spring Creek. As a courtesy please contact Karen at 972-365-0383 or Karen.christoffer@tx.rr.com that you will be coming.

Speaking of donations, some of you may remember Monica Rodarmer, a former member who collects items at JCPenny for our stocking project. She was given over 500 Beanie Babies from Glenda Walton, another Penny employee, and is donating them to the Guild to be put in our stockings. As Margaret Schafer wrote, "I know lots of children will have big smiles on their faces this year." A perfect segue to: LaDawn Dalley, committee chair of the stocking project, reports that at the September meeting, 300 completed stockings were turned in and I know that at least another 100 were turned in at the October meeting. Way to go my stocking groupies! You would think that about 1100 stockings would be enough but we are giving 500 to Soldier's Angels and plan on at least 1200 for Parkland Hosp. (If you want to know about these agencies please go to our community service link at the Guild's website.) That means we need another 600 to complete our mission. LaDawn has done a tremendous job this whole year getting the kits cut and packaged and she still has more for us so don't let up now. Also on the agenda for stockings is the serious need for things to put in them. Remember, we are giving them to the women in Parkland in the Maternity Ward so we need: new and unused trial size toiletry items like shampoo, perfume, lotions, deodorants, toothbrushes, toothpaste. The stockings are also given to the children of the mothers in the ward. Those stockings need such things as soft back books that can be rolled to fit, crayons, pencils, notebooks, small coloring books, scissors, erasers, stuffed animals, little toys such as matchbox cars. happy meal toys, card games, toothbrushes, toothpaste and candy. Since there are teenagers also (mothers and children) things like notebooks, hair and nail things, gum, boy teen things, deodorant, toothbrushes and toothpaste. This Saturday Margaret Schafer will be overseeing our Heritage Farmstead Museum Victorian Halloween Festival and Craft Fair from noon to 6:00. We will be reporting on that in the next newsletter.

I wanted to tell you about my experience at the fundraiser which helps support The Turning Point Rape Crisis Center. On the 9<sup>th</sup> of October my husband and I went to the "Casino Royale Gala" which was held at the Renaissance Center - who knew about it— across Spring Creek from Collin County College. The food was wonderful and party setup great. Members of my small group had made a quilt which was donated for the live auction. It was a beautiful quilt. I was confused during the bidding – my, those auctioneers talk faster than a teenager – and I didn't follow what he said. My husband said that the final bid was for \$400. I thought that was really good. It was really fun and since my husband loves to compete in bidding wars, we came home with 3 items. Next year join with me, have your small group make a quilt and let's have a bidding war.

What fun!

## BOARD MEETING, October 2010 Donna Lobelseon, Secretary

Guild President Sheri Smith called the meeting to order at Tino's Restaurant at 7:00 pm

- Shirley Weaver presented the Treasurer's report.
   Quilt show and Guild budgets were reviewed.
- Donna Petrick addressed the issue of allowing additional discount for the two day class being offered in January. After discussion it was decided that existing discounts were more than adequate. The advance registration discount combined with the additional discount for taking both classes offered by a speaker would bring the fee to \$65 for the two day class.
- Rose-Clair Fletcher showed the newly printed bookmarks, postcards, business cards, and stationary.
   She also arranged for distribution of bookmarks and postcards to area shops and libraries..
- Julie Schaefer said the Collin County Children's Advocacy Center would like 30 to 40 small quilts for Christmas. She will ask members to attend another sew-a-thon. She reported on the Turning Point (Rape Crisis Center of Collin County) Gala.
- Kimberly Wilshire reported that vendor response to the 2011 quilt show is very positive. There is a maximum of 40 vendors and 30 vendors have committed. Admissions and signs are the only open committee positions.
- Ways of recruiting additional member participation in guild activities were discussed. Communication and recognition were identified as needed. In addition to the service pins and bars which recognize all guild community service hours an additional member recognition program will be started this month. The name of every member who has contributed time to a community outreach guild activity during the past month will be entered into a separate door prize drawing. The member must be present at the meeting to win a prize.
- The option to vote again on the proposed by-law change to allow annual quilt shows was discussed. It was decided that due to the number of members who requested a re-vote, it would be placed on the October agenda.
- Guild support of the National Quilt Museum was addressed and tabled until next year.
- Meeting adjourned 8:28.

### Sawtooth Sampler Block of the Month

We will be doing a 12" finished Sawtooth Star with a different 6" block in the center. There will be 12 blocks in all, two blocks a month.

For the star you will need: (You can work ahead on the star part if you wish.)

Star points – 1 yd. Background – 1 ½ yd.

The surprise blocks are 6" finished and will fit in the center of the star. They can be done with scraps or fat quarters.


For each star block you will need:

Star points – cut 8 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares Background – cut 4 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares cut 4 (3 ½" x 6 ½") rectangles

On the back of the star point squares, mark a diagonal line. Place a star point square face down at one end of the background rectangle (right sides together). Sew on the diagonal line (Fig. 1). Press, then trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig.2). Press toward point (Fig. 3).

Sew another star point square on the other end of that same rectangle (Fig. 4). Make sure the diagonal line is going in the right direction. Sew on the diagonal line. Press and trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 5). Press toward point (Fig. 6).

Sew a background square to each side of two star points (Fig. 7). Press toward points. Sew a star point to each side of the 6" block (Fig. 8). Press toward points. Sew sections together. Your block should measure 12 ½".

### **BLOCK OF THE MONTH, October 2010 blocks— Connie Litfin**

### Block 7—Crosses and Losses


Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A – Background
Cut 4 (2" x 2") squares
Cut 2 (2 3/8" x 2 3/8") squares in half on diagonal
Cut 1 (3 7/8" x 3 7/8") square on diagonal

Fabric B — Cut 2 (2 3/8" x 2 3/8") squares in half on diagonal Cut 1 (3 7/8" x 3 7/8") square on diagonal

### Assembly:

Make half-square triangles and press to dark. Lay out pieces as shown in diagram and sew together. This block will be inserted in the center of the Sawtooth Star.



### Block 8=Whirlygig

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A - Background Cut 4 (2" x 3 ½") rectangles Cut 4 (2" X 2") squares


Fabric B ~ 2nd Color Cut 4 (2" x 3 ½") rectangles

Fabric C—3rd Color Cut 4 (2" X 2") squares

### Assembly:

Make flying geese as shown for Sawtooth Star bloc, using one Fabric B and one Fabric C as

shown. Lay out pieces as shown in diagram and sew together. This block will be inserted in the center of the Sawtooth Star.
