
# Newsletter of the Quilters Guild of Plano

Piggy-backing on that thought, at the December 9<sup>th</sup> meeting Community Service will only be picking up any quilts, afghans, blankets you are turning in. We will not have any kits, binding or quilting items. The black 3-ring binder for documentation of service hours will be there. This month I delivered 6 quilts and 1 afghan to The Turning Point (Collin County Rape Crises Center) and 8 quilts and 1 fleece blanket to the Children's Advocacy Center. I have 24 cough pillows that Maria Eakin and her mother, Enriqueta Benavides, made. I will probably be taking those over to the Medical Center of Plano prior to Thanksgiving. We could use some more filler for the pillows. We like to use left over high loft batting which we can easily tear apart and stuff the pillows. This makes firmer filler than the soft stuffing which the stores are offering. But we will use what we have. If you decide to make pillows, which we welcome, be sure to stuff them so full and firm that you can barely sew the opening. They also need to be at least a 16" x 10" rectangle.

There will not be a Tuesday sew day in the month of December. The next one will be January 11<sup>th</sup>, 2011. I think we will be making "snakes".



# Sawtooth Sampler Block of the Month

We will be doing a 12" finished Sawtooth Star with a different 6" block in the center. There will be 12 blocks in all, two blocks a month.

For the star you will need: (You can work ahead on the star part if you wish.)

Star points – 1 yd. Background – 1 ½ yd.

The surprise blocks are 6" finished and will fit in the center of the star. They can be done with scraps or fat quarters.


For each star block you will need:

Star points - cut 8 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares Background - cut 4 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares cut 4 (3 ½" x 6 ½") rectangles

On the back of the star point squares, mark a diagonal line. Place a star point square face down at one end of the background rectangle (right sides together). Sew on the diagonal line (Fig. 1). Press, then trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig.2). Press toward point (Fig. 3).

Sew another star point square on the other end of that same rectangle (Fig. 4). Make sure the diagonal line is going in the right direction. Sew on the diagonal line. Press and trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 5). Press toward point (Fig. 6).

Sew a background square to each side of two star points (Fig. 7). Press toward points. Sew a star point to each side of the 6" block (Fig. 8). Press toward points. Sew sections together. Your block should measure 12 ½".

# **Block 9—Weathervane Variation**


Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A
Cut 4 (2" x 2") squares
Cut 5 (1 1/2" x 1 1/2") squares

Fabric B Cut 4 (2" x 3 ½")

**Fabric C**Cut 4 (1 ½" x 1 ½") squares

Fabric D Cut 8 (2" x 2") squares



#### Assembly:

Make flying geese pieces with fabric B and D as shown in Sawtooth Star instructions. Make a 9-patch with fabric A and C. Lay out pieces as shown in diagram and sew together. This block will be inserted in the center of the Sawtooth Star.

# **Block 10—Contrary Wife**

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A


Cut 5 (2 1/2" x 2 1/2") squares

Fabric B

Cut 2 (2 7/8" x 2 7/8") squares in half on diagonal

Fabric C

Cut 2 (2 7/8" x 2 7/8") squares in half on diagonal



#### Assembly:

Make 4 half-square triangles with fabrics B and C. Press to dark. Lay out pieces as shown in diagram and sew together. This block will be inserted in the center of the Sawtooth Star.
