Community Service - Julie Schaefer

Boy what a busy month this has been already. Thanks to everyone that made quilts for this giving season. Particularly I want to thank Karen Christoffer who planned and supervised our completing forty-seven (that's 47) flannel quilt kits. She made sure the fabric was matched, cut out with the Accu Cutter®, packaged, sewn, washed and labels put on the completed blankets. Along with her were Terri Mendelow, Donna Petrick, Helen Wilems and the Tuesday Plano Sewing Center group that came in November as well as those that took a kit home. You may have had experience with flannel before and know that flannel is "allergy unfriendly." That is, if you're allergic to the fibers that float through the air and get all over everything, you end up with a sneezing, coughing, red eyed condition. What stalwart friends we have.

The 47 flannel blankets along with 20 small quilts, 2 fleece blankets and 11 crocheted afghans were taken to Children's Advocacy Center of Collin County. Also since we last talked (figuratively speaking), 7 quilts and 3 afghans were taken to The Turning Point Rape Crisis Center of Collin County. Thirteen quilts and 27 stockings were taken to Hope's Door. Tomorrow 35 cough pillows will be delivered to Plano Medical Center Surgical Center. LaDawn Dalley reported at the general meeting where the stockings were delivered and I will be able to give you specifics as soon as she gets all the info. together. You know, that's a lot of work! Both from the standpoint of all the stockings members made, cutting fabric, making kits, putting items into the stockings, packing them up and the biggie = delivering them. You are appreciated LaDawn. Let her know when you see her.






CALLING ALL BLOCK OF THE MONTH, QUILT TOP CONTESTANTS!

We will show our completed block of the month quilt tops at the March meeting. Prizes will be awarded for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and Viewer's Choice. Remember, the rules are simple ...

- You can use just the 6-inch blocks or the entire sawtooth star with the 6-inch block in the center.
- You can use any colors., setting, or number of blocks
- A bonus block was provided at each meeting, so you can use more than the 12 blocks.

Sawtooth Sampler Block of the Month

We will be doing a 12" finished Sawtooth Star with a different 6" block in the center. There will be 12 blocks in all, two blocks a month.

For the star you will need: (You can work ahead on the star part if you wish.)

Star points – 1 yd. Background – 1 ½ yd.

The surprise blocks are 6" finished and will fit in the center of the star. They can be done with scraps or fat quarters.


For each star block you will need:

```
Star points - cut 8 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares
Background - cut 4 (3 ½" x 3 ½") squares
cut 4 (3 ½" x 6 ½") rectangles
```

On the back of the star point squares, mark a diagonal line. Place a star point square face down at one end of the background rectangle (right sides together). Sew on the diagonal line (Fig. 1). Press, then trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig.2). Press toward point (Fig. 3).

Sew another star point square on the other end of that same rectangle (Fig. 4). Make sure the diagonal line is going in the right direction. Sew on the diagonal line. Press and trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 5). Press toward point (Fig. 6).

Sew a background square to each side of two star points (Fig. 7). Press toward points. Sew a star point to each side of the 6" block (Fig. 8). Press toward points. Sew sections together. Your block should measure 12 ½".

BLOCK OF THE MONTH, January 2011 blocks— Connie Litfin

Block 11—Anvil


Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A

Cut 2 (2" x 2") squares Cut 5 (2 3/8" x 2 3/8") squares in half on diagonal Cut 1 (3 1/2" x 3 1/2") square

Fabric B

Cut 5 (2 3/8" x 2 3/8") squares in half on diagonal



Assembly:

Make 10 half-square triangles; press to dark. Lay out pieces as shown in diagram and sew together. This block will be inserted in the center of the Sawtooth Star.

Block 12— Friendship Star Variation

Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A

Cut 2 (2 7/8" x 2 7/8") squares in half on diagonal Cut 1 (1 1/2" x 12")

Fabric B


Cut 1 (2 ½" x 2 ½") square Cut 1 (1 1/2" x 12")

Fabric C—Star points

Cut 2 (2 7/8" x 2 7/8") squares in half on diagonal

Assembly:

With rights sides together, sew the two 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 12" strips together. Press to dark side. Cut into 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " sections and make 4 (4-patches). Make 4



half-square triangles with fabrics A and C and press to dark side. Lay out pieces as shown in diagram and sew together. This block will be inserted in the center of the Sawtooth Star.

This is the last block of the series. In March 2011, we will have a show and tell of the completed quilt tops.

The Quilters Guild of Plano will be holding Quilt Camp March 14 - 18 at Liberty Recreation Center through the Plano Parks and Recreation Department. This is a wonderful opportunity for us to introduce the art of quilting to youngsters ages 10 to 12. We will have a maximum of 8 students. We expect to fill the class, and this means we will need four teaching assistants for each of the five days. All you need to do is use a rotary cutter (the students will not be cutting), help them assemble their blocks, and give other assistance as they machine stitch their projects. This will really be a fun time, so plan to participate. If you can help at Quilt Camp one or more days from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on these dates, please contact Margaret Schafer and pick your day now. We will take a 30 minute lunch break each day which will give us a great opportunity to get to know the students and to further discuss the art of quilting with them. Be sure to sign your daughters and granddaughters up for the class. You certainly will want to be a part of this exciting educational activity by the Guild.
