Pre-purchase Food Concession Tickets for the Quilt Show—Kemberley Wilshire

As many of you know and have heard, we are facing a few obstacles with the show. One is meeting a high minimum for daily concessions on the days of our actual show. Please understand the guild has to prepay the minimum regardless. So, one way we are trying to resolve this is by pre-selling the concession tickets for \$5. We are asking that you commit to either a sandwich or salad on either Friday or Saturday or both if you are going to be there. Now, if you are not going to be there during meal time, that is fine you can still purchase a \$5 ticket and use it for your snack. This will allow us to give the Convention Center a estimate of how many we will need. They will then provide extra for the public. I have attended several events over the last 3-4 months to gage how their concession stand is doing. The quality of their food has gone up considerably from our last show. So, we are going to be giving you the option to buy your concession tickets in increments of \$5. If you want to buy \$20 to cover you for the two days you can. Please note that there is no change given when turning these in.

So, please help us out by buying over the next couple of months your Concession tickets. We will be selling them May, June and July meetings. The July meeting will be the last time you can purchase the tickets.
