TAQG Rally Day Sherry Worley



Community Service—Terri Mendelow

I was so surprised and excited at the May guild meeting! The Community Service table was a blur of activity with quilts being turned in and kits being picked up by members. Members turned in 21 completed quilts; 7 pillowcases; 6 cuddle quilts (5 from Mickie Warrington); 11 quilt tops; and 10 flannel huggies made by the Service Learning Students. Some lovely knitted Christmas Stockings were donated by a member. Three beautiful afghans were given by June Austin. In addition there were donations of fabric, batting, and Hobbs labels. Your generosity and dedication makes Community Service a great success!

The Service Learning Program has been quite busy since taking off in late September, 2011. The students have assisted Community Service with the Stocking Project and with donation quilts, such as the flannel huggies. Eight participating students have volunteered 187.25 hours while carrying a dual load of studies at college or in their high school. One of the students has donated 70 hours to service learning. LaDawn Dalley's efforts in taking on this project is greatly appreciated!

Speaking of the Stocking Project, we are now collecting fabrics for this year's stockings. We

appreciate any colorful Christmas or Holiday themed fabrics you can donate. This includes kids prints or the patriotic themes which we use for stockings for the Soldier's Angels program which provides stuffed stockings for the troops. If you have fabric to donate, please bring it to the June guild meeting. In July, the guild program will be "Christmas In July" when we make stockings together. This is always a fun event!

This will be our first show to have cash prizes and would love to see everyone in attendance.

We are LOOKING FOR 6 PEOPLE for

each **TWO HOUR** shift to work as a staff support position to assist the Plano Police Department. You will have a designated area, wear staff vests, and have a walkie-talkie to communicate with the Officer on premises as we assist our vendors in watching the crowds for sticky finger people. You will not be required to engage in any way with the public. The two hour shifts will begin at 9:00 am each day of the show till 5:00 pm. I will have a sign up sheet at the next guild meeting or you can email me with your time requests starting right away. If you sign up before the next meeting, your name will be included for the drawing. I look forward to working with you as we move forward in providing support for our vendors and members.

She listed the number of quilts and afghans that she took for donations from the Guild to My Friends Place. This is an agency that assists and inspires homeless youth to build selfsufficient lives. Terri also reported that the eight Service Learning Students had accumulated over 187 service hours making cuddles, rag guilts and receiving blankets. These students are: Razia Saleem, Afreen Ahmed, Haley Rogers, Elaine Dalley, Cassidy Hoang, Fatima Hameed, Jorden Mooneyhan and Jamika Mackey. Afreen Ahmed alone gathered a total of 70 service hours. LaDawn Dalley (our "stocking lady") is the organizer for the

students enrolled in the Service Learning Program where they learn to understand themselves and others while being a service to others.

7-Emily Armstrong reported that there were 71 members present with 3 guests and 2 new members, Patricia Cole and Ranson Carpenter. Door prizes were awarded from Happiness is Quilting, The Old Craft Store, The Quilt Asylum, Quilter's Connection, Quilt Country, Bernina Sewing Center of Plano, Piece Keepers and members of the Guild.

The business portion of the meeting adjourned at 7:50.

Karen Hawkins assisted in Show and Tell and Donna Petrick introduced our speakers: Su and Dwayne Bunch who are owners of Piece Keepers and spoke on "Blended Quilts."

QGP upcoming Speakers & Workshops—Donna Lobelson



Our June program will be a trunk show by Darcy Ashton. Darcy lives in Oklahoma and runs a one woman publishing company. If you are a quilter in Texas you have seen Darcy's distinctive books featuring remarkably realistic-looking animals done up with buttonhole stitching. Amazingly, most

of them are made up of only one piece of fabric Her resume includes such titles as Grandma's Bunnies, Claire's Cats, Butterfly Dance, Aquatic Creatures, Darling Little Dogs, and Beautiful Big Dogs.



Darcy had worked in graphics at several companies. When she learned her employer was closing and she'd be out of a job. Darcy purchased her computer workstation from her former employer and settled at home to raise her kids.

Darcy was given an unfinished quilt top that
was started by Grandma. It had been set aside and waited nearly 60 years for her to work on it.
One of the blocks had a rusted needle in it where Grandma had put it down and never picked it back up.

That UFO changed Darcy's life. It had appliquéd bunnies with embroidered details. Darcy finished Grandma's bunnies and put it up on her wall. Soon she was re-drawing the bunnies and making a quilt of her own.

Having worked for years, Darcy felt the
desire to have something to think about and work
other than taking care of her children. She took her
bunny quilt to her local quilt shop and asked the
owners if she could teach a class, they wanted the
patterns.

Darcy realized that with all of her graphic arts and publishing experience she could create a book of patterns, and published her first book **Grandma's Bunnies in 2001.** The book was very popular.

Next Darcy published **Claire's Cats** (named for her daughter) and she hasn't stopped.

Darcy has designed and published many appliqué pattern books that are ideal for "Appliqué in the Hoop" technique. Darcy's Claire's Cats Volume 2 was the first book to have a set of Cat designs to be translated from hand appliqué to embroidery machine appliqué.

On Friday June 15, 2012 Darcy will teach an "Introduction to Appliqué" workshop. This is a beginner's class. While creating an adorable one piece animal block that may be sewn into a quilt or pillow, you will learn many tips and tricks for producing flawless hand appliqué. Choose your favorite animal from an Ashton Publications book. The class will teach you how to do needle turn appliqué as well as many embroidery stitches including the outline stitch, French knots, and Darcy's unique "stay where you put it" buttonhole stitch. But the best part is learning how to create those eyes that will melt your heart.
