

August guild meeting is on preview night. The business meeting will be held in the east hallway then we will get to view the show quilts.


> September speaker— Marian Ann J. Montgomery, Ph.D.

Dr. Montgomery, an independent museum and textile consultant with expertise in guilt history, coordinated Quilt Mania I and Quilt Mania II, collaborative exhibitions bringing together twenty different cultural institutions exhibiting guilts related to their institutional missions. She was Executive **Director of Park Cities Historical Preservation** Society and one-time director of interpretation at the Sixth Floor Museum.

Former board member of the American Quilt Study Group and contributor to the organization's scholarly journal, "Uncoverings," Marian Ann has worked for thirty years in the museum field. Through her work as the curator of fashion and textiles for the Tennessee State Museum, her work on the guilts at the Dallas Museum of Art as well as her involvement with the world of quilting as a quilter, Dr. Montgomery brings a wealth of knowledge of quilts. Her Personal Quilt Tours of the Dallas Quilt Celebration get repeat attendees and she provides an engaging program.

Marian Ann co-edited, "The Quilter's Hall of Fame: 42 Masters Who Have Shaped Our Art." The book honors 42 women and men who were instrumental in the history of guilting. It is a new

edition of a book about the Quilters Hall of Fame, from 2004. The Quilters Hall of Fame located in Marion, Indiana, honors master guilters as well as others who have had a significant influence in the world of quilting. These include influential early 20th century



designers like Marie Webster and Ruby McKim as well as those who spurred the quilt revival in the 1970's such as Jonathan Holstein and Gail Van Der Hoof and those that continue to create beautiful pieces of art today such as Jinny Beyer, Nancy Crow and Michael James.

In September Dr. Montgomery will share information on some honorees you likely know well and those you may not realize have influenced your quilting.

October speaker—

Mickey Depre—www.mdquilts.com

Mickey was introduced to the world of Fiber Arts by her own personal, "grand masters," at the age of four. Grandmothers, Great Aunts, Aunts, and her mother filled her days with cloth, needles, yarn and such. Textiles have always fascinated her from vintage to current and her taste has always been ALL! Sewing in general, mending to garment making were never a chore-but when she pushed beyond traditional quilt making she found the road less traveled was greatly inviting.

Mickey enjoys sharing her love of fiber thru lectures and workshops. Her workshops mix technique instruction with individual creativity and always a giggle or two.

In her October lecture, "Color-riffic Quilts", Mickey will take us thru exercises of fabric selection for projects, teach us to stretch our wings, and see that using colors and patterns we may not have considered before will add "zing" to our next project's palette. This will be followed by a short trunk show and of course, a question and answer period.

Friday October 12th Workshop: Permission to Play—A Non Sewing **Creative Drawing Workshop.**

This is a true "free form" creativity class with no pattern other than "gentle" instruction. The workshop will focus upon each individual student creating their own form fitting drawing and then taking the drawing to the next creative level. Raw-edge and iron applied appliqué will be utilized to keep this workshop at a "NON SEWING" level. Her class will focus more on creativity rather than technique.

Learn how to take the Hexie to a whole new level with Mickey's Pieced Hexies Patterns. She has 7 Fun and Exciting New Samples. You will leave class with three new design samples and your imagination running wild. Some Hexie experience would be helpful but not necessary.

<u>November Speaker</u> Ellen Anne Eddy www.ellenanneeddy.com

Ellen Anne Eddy is an internationally known fiber artist whose wall art goes beyond the traditional concept of quilting. Fish, bugs, birds and frogs are found throughout her art, blending her dreams and vision with the natural world. She uses hand-dyed



fabrics, lames, machine embroidery, cut-away appliqué, and layered sheers to create the illusion of flames, water, and mist in her work.

Lecture: The Visual Path



We explore the elements of design to make nature quilts that move and that move you. The design concepts are easy to understand and so much fun. You'll

see how to build a path through your quilt that feeds the eye and the soul. The lecture focuses on taking geometric forms, translating them to organic shapes, and creating nature quilts that live, move and breathe.

Friday November 9 Workshop: Free Motion Appliqué Mastery

Build fantastic landscapes and natural with Cut-away and direct appliqué techniques. Add

Members were encouraged to go listen to well known speaker/designer/quilter Pam Bono, see some wonderful Guild Raffle Quilts, and have fun. M.J. suggested that we wear our Show Shirt.

A change to the June minutes was reported through email that under "New Business" both . Marie Zakowski and Sharon McGinnis would help at the attendance table in September. The minutes were accepted as changed. The treasurer's report was accepted as written in the newsletter. No further old business was reported.

New Business:

Dee Ann McFarlin, Chair, read the Nominating Committee's recommendations for the slate of officers for the Executive Board for the year 2012-2013. Those officers are: President-M.J. Fielek, VP Community Service—Terri Mendelow, VP Education—Margaret Schafer, VP Guild Activities—JoAnn Hudgins and Kathy Dunigan, VP Media-Mickie Warrington, VP Membership-Kaye Dunn and Dolores Williams, VP Programs—Donna Lobelson, VP Finance—Donna Petrick, Secretary— Julie Schaefer, and Quilt Show Chair—Kemberly Wilshire. Dee Ann thanked all the Committee's members for their work on the 2012-13 slate of Executive Officers and Committee Chairs as well as the members that stepped up and volunteered for the positions.

M.J. reported that many members have mentioned that they would like to have short classes presented by knowledgeable members to learn basic guilt techniques or any new methods. This П idea is under way and the Board will be considering the implementation of this idea.

Committee Reports:

Nine Patch: Debbie Seher reported that a few people had turned in some 9-patch blocks. She encouraged members to go through their stash and i find fabric to make some more blocks. One

hundred of these blocks are given to members that move away so they can make a memory quilt. It's fun to sign your name or a thought on the block before turning it in.

Community Service: Terri Mendelow thanked all that have volunteered their time and skills toward completing so many donation guilts. She reported on the number of quilts she took to our appointed agencies. Family Outreach is having a silent auction on October 27th and they would appreciate items for their auction. The deadline to give it to them is October 1st so there is plenty of time to finish items for their auction. Sit and Sew is always the second Tuesday of every month. This is an opportunity to piece a guilt top for donating with Guild instructions, fabric and pattern. The next Sit and Sew will be August 14th at the Plano Sewing Center, which is on the SE corner of Custer and Spring Creek. If you haven't gone before please email Karen Christoffer that you're coming so that she will be able to have a kit for you. The times involved are 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and you can come and go at your convenience. Basic quilt sewing skills is all you need to have. Such as an ability to sew a straight line, setting your machine up for a proper stitch length and 1/4-inch seam. So bring your traveling sewing machine and basic tools to have fun while sewing with the group.

Education: Margaret Schafer put in a plug for people to sign-up to be a Quilt Angel at Quilt Plano 2012. Although Margaret avowed that being a quilt angel is the most fun of all jobs, there were many other show chairs needing volunteers that disagreed. Being a Quilt Angel is the only position where volunteers get to wear cute aprons. The Legacy 4-H Club representatives were there to show their quilt project during "Show and Tell." Those present were Bethany Woelmer, Catherine and Timothy Finley and their mom, Theresa Finley. International Children's Festival will be coming up and we will need many volunteers to help the children coming to our tables to work with Red Work and Coloring Blocks.

Quilt Plano 2012: Kemberly Wilshire reminded everyone that they needed to sign up for jobs at the Show. Members need at least 4 hours to be awarded a Show Charm for their Guild pin. Go to Hospitality and sign up for something if you're at the Show and have nothing to do. Show volunteers will receive free lunch. Wednesday will get pizza; Thursday will be a box lunch; Friday is the spud bar, and Saturday will be the salad bar.

Thank you all for your continued support for Community Service. In July you turned in 23 quilts, 11 quilt tops, 30 cuddle quilts, 9 flannel huggies, and 3 afghans.

The Stocking Project kick-off at the July meeting was a fun event. We were able to sew 156 stockings. Many people took kits to sew stockings at home. We are off to a good start. The stockings will go to Parkland Hospital and to Soldiers Angles. While we are not seeking donations for stocking stuffers this year, the stocking project will accept any small items that you may have collected or purchased. They will be put into a limited number of stockings for Parkland Hospital.

Last month many quilts, afghans, pillowcases and huggies were donated to our receiving agencies. Collin County Children's Advocacy received 16 quilts, 8 pillowcases, 4 flannel huggies, and 3 afghans. My Friend's House received 10 quilts, 7 pillowcases, and 4 flannel huggies. The Turning Point Rape Crisis Center received 20 quilts and 6 afghans. When you come to our Quilt Show, don't forget to stop by the Community Service and Kids area in the Sunnybrook Room of the Plano Centre. We will be assisting the children with learning Redwork embroidery and with coloring pictures on muslin blocks which will be made into quilts. We will have a few sewing machines for anyone interested in putting together some of these blocks for community service. Also, there will be a display of Community Service Quilts and Afghans that show the type of donations we contribute to our receiving agencies.

The next 2nd Tuesday Sit & Sew will be August 14th at the Plano Sewing Center from 10-2 p.m. Please contact Karen Christoffer at <u>karen.Christoffer@tx.rr.com</u> to let her know you will attend so she can have a kit and a space for you.

When working the Show please park on the far, far west side of the building. (West is toward 75 Expressway and East faces Jupiter and Collin College.) There will be golf carts to take you in. There will also be valet parking (\$5.00) for PATRONS during the show. If you do not want to park far out west you can pay to use the valet as well. M.J. reminded members that Guild Preview Night would be the Thursday evening before the Show (August 9th). There will be a short (30 minute) business meeting for members, starting at 7:00 p.m. in the Hospitality/Windhaven Room on that night. Please enter through the Plano Centre's east door and remember there is no food or drink in the quilt area. You may bring your family with you. Check out the layout of the Show so you'll know where you will be working during the show. Closing time will be 9:00 p.m. that night and don't forget to vote for your favorite quilt prior to leaving, as there is a special ribbon for this award. Preview Night is the <u>only time</u> to vote for "Members Choice" so: "Calling all Members – come to Preview Night."
