There is something very special about delivering our quilts in December. Taking our quilts to the agencies last month made me feel like an Elf! The agencies are so appreciative of our donations. They each wanted me to pass on their heartfelt thanks to our members who piece, quilt, and bind the donations quilts for the clients these agencies serve.

In December I delivered 10 quilts and 3 afghans to the Rape Crisis Center. Another 11 quilts, 2 huggies, and 6 pillowcases were given to the Children's Advocacy Center. Finally, 10 quilts, 2 afghans and 9 pillowcases went to My Friend's House. 333 Christmas Stockings were donated to Soldier's Angels in December. Additional stockings were given to them in November. The Service Learning students have made receiving blankets to give to Parkland Hospital for newborns.

Thank you for your support to Community Service and let's continue our efforts for a successful 2013.

**January Speaker—
Barbara Olson
January 10 Lecture:
“Designing Outside the
Lines”**

Each person came into the world with an innate way of creating. How to find and understand that unique way of creating is the topic of this

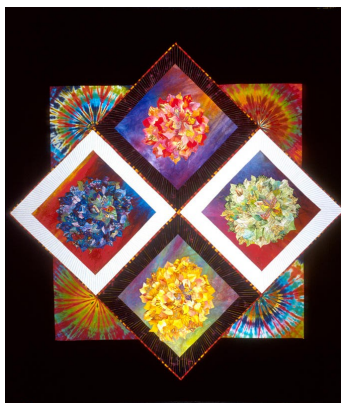
lecture. Great artists bring their full energy and uniqueness to each piece. Creating with joy and purpose manifests wonderful quilts. The frame work that quilting offers is a good place to begin the process, then to go beyond the boundaries and **design outside the lines.**

- **Straight Pins**
- **Small Sharp Pointed Fabric Scissors**
- **Flannel Design Wall** or 22" x 34" foam core board
- **1 Yard Sulky Totally Stable**
- **Fusible Web** 1/4 yard - Steam a seam 2 regular - light weight works best
- **Black Permanent Ink Felt Tip Pen** Sharpie extra fine point is best
- **Re-Positionable or Re-Stickable Glue Stick**
- **Optional:** A low-wattage wand mini iron
- **\$3.00 Lab Fee**

Fabric: Choose a color that you like best for your flower and bring 15 fabrics pieces and/or scraps which are multi colored fabric containing this color. You only need small pieces for the petals (1/4 yard or smaller pieces) Give yourself many choices.

**January 11 Workshop:
“Prismatic Flowers”**

Playing with color, texture, depth and shading: students will manifest a small flower piece filled with light and energy. Choosing from one of Barbara's flower drawings eliminates the drafting and allows students to go right to designing with fabric.



i.e. Red Flower Fabric Requirements - Red fabric with yellow areas, Red with pink areas, Red with green or blue areas, Pink with fuchsia areas, any multi colored fabric containing red.

- **3/4 yard background fabric** - options will be discussed in first class
- **1 yard fusible batting**
- **3/4 yard backing fabric**

PRISMATIC FLOWERS Workshop Description:

The ingredients needed to create a flower filled with light and energy are:

- **A playful spirit.**
- **A wonderful variety of multi colored shaded fabrics.** Batiks, hand dyed, painted or marbled fabric and some novelty flowered fabrics. Solids or calicos do not work.

This is only a beginning. Creating these textual prismatic flowers involves lots of thread and is addictive.

Levels: All levels

Tools & Supplies:

- **Sewing Machine** with zigzag capabilities
- **Invisible Thread**
- **Bobbin Thread** in neutral color

**January 12 Workshop:
“Thread Creates the
Design”**



Most often the quilting plays a supporting role in a quilt. With free hand quilting designs and an array of beautiful threads the quilting takes top billing. This class will

give students the opportunity develop quilt designs and experience stitching the designs with different types and weights of threads. This small example piece from a small project will increase machine quilting and free hand quilting design skill.

Workshop Description:**

Length: One Day Workshop

Tools and Supplies:

- **Sewing Machine** - Machine must be in proper adjustment. Students must be familiar with machine. The machine must have a darning or free motion foot, and the feed dog must have lowering capabilities or a plate that covers it.
- **Marking Tools for Dark Fabric**

Basic Sewing Supplies:

- **Needles - Embroidery, Top Stitch & Jeans Stitch**
- **A Variety of Colors of Decorative Thread** for quilting, variegated & solids, rayon's
- **Lingerie/Bobbin** for bobbin natural color
- **Quilting Gloves**

Students should bring 1 - 26"x26" quilt sandwich, pinned or fused (Black fabric top, batting and backing)

Therefore this night will be the last time that 2012 t-shirts and bags will be available at any meeting. The t-shirts for Quilt Plano 2013 will be ordered in January and available in February 2013. The next Show Committee Meeting will be Sunday January 13th, 2013 at 3:00 pm at Kemberly's home.

Retreat: Janet Plotkin wearing her official fairy regalia announced that there were plenty of openings for the retreat, which will be the weekend of February 21-24. Please get involved so that this special event won't be discontinued.

Membership: Kaye Dunn and Dolores Williams presented various nametags that had been made during past years as ideas for members to think about making for themselves. Kaye also suggested a pocket lanyard with the Guild Logo imprinted on the top for our membership cards and/or nametag with large letters. There were 60 members present along with one new member, Barbara Lee.

TAQG and Door Prizes: Sherry Worley reported that TAQG will be doing a quarterly newsletter available on their website. Door Prizes were obtained from: Lisa Erlandson (Quilt Appraisal), two gifts from Quilters Connection, three gifts from The Quilt Asylum and three from an anonymous donor.

Programs: Donna Lobelson gave a slide show on the upcoming year's programs and activities during the general meeting.

QUILT SHOW 2013 needs you!

Your quilt show committee of 22 members is already busy at work, but we need a few more members to complete our team. The following are open chair positions with a brief description of responsibilities.

Raffle Quilt – responsible for passing out and collecting tickets to/from members at Guild Meetings, coordinating volunteers to man “showings” at public venues to sell tickets, coordinate mailing of raffle tickets to members not picking them up at a guild meeting

Program Advertising – responsible for soliciting advertising for our Show Program to help offset cost of printing

Program Design – responsible for creating the program, must be able to use Microsoft Publisher. Job starts in June and ends with delivery of programs to the show.

Publicity – responsible for “general publicity” by contacting quilt shops to display Show posters and bookmarks, contacting quilt and travel magazines and local newspaper for free advertising of the Show. Excludes responsibility for mailing postcards and for publicity with Senior Centers and

churches, both of which have separate chairs.

Quilt Angels – responsible for signing up volunteers to serve as Quilt Angels during the show, coordinating (and instructing new) volunteers during the show, transporting Quilt Angel aprons and gloves to the show to be handed out in the Hospitality room.

It is welcomed, and encouraged, for 2 people to serve as co-chairs for any area of responsibility. Several existing positions are already filled in that way. This provides for sharing of time commitments and provides for “back-up” in case of unforeseen emergencies. All the people who held these open positions for the 2012 are available for advice and suggestions. The General Show Committee will meet once in January, March, May, June and July. Meetings are on Monday evenings, with the exception of the January meeting on Sunday, 1/13/2013 at 3 p.m. So we hope you will consider joining the Show Committee. It’s work, but rewarding and we do have a lot of fun!
