Karen Eckmeier – Happy Villages and Accidental Landscapes

Since she was a little girl Karen has always felt the need to create. She considers herself a serious "doodler"—pencil in hand, she loves making lines and patterns. Color had always intimidated her, because she didn't enjoy the mess of mixing paints and didn't have the color confidence to select the right colors. Fabric was a welcome relief to her dilemma—colors came already "pre-mixed"—no color charts, no mess, no fuss AND she could work with them anywhere in the house. She does love painting on fabric now, which she happily cuts up and uses in her fabric art.



The sewing machine didn't enter her life until she was 30 years old. She had purchased one as a young mother feeling it was her duty to own one. The sewing machine sat in a closet till the day she saw her first quilt. Having drawn and taken art lessons since she was 6 years old, she figured that if she could draw it, she could figure out how to sew it. Even though her first projects were far from perfect, she loved working with fabric and couldn't wait to get to the quilting stage to add the wonderful texture to the surface.

She pursued German and Russian languages in college, thinking she would pursue a career as a translator, but spent time in a German commercial bank instead, then switched to doing pen & ink renderings of houses for real estate companies and homeowners so that she could be home with her children. Next she dabbled in real estate as a sales agent, however, when she realized that she was *drawing* more houses than selling them, she finally listened to the artist within and pursued a career in art.

In 1996 she started making art quilts, which were very well received in national and international

shows. The awards encouraged her to move forward in her new direction. Her hobby officially became her business in 2002 when she opened her business, "The Quilted Lizard." For 8 years she taught at a local quilt store and in 2002 began teaching her technique "Layered Curves" and "Accidental Landscapes™" nationwide. Karen feels teaching gives her the opportunity to share her passion for playing with fabric with others.

Community Service needs your support in order to carry out the guild's commitments to the agencies we donate to in our Plano community.

Please remember to cut the **Hobbs bar-code labels** from your bags of Hobbs batting and donate them to Community Service. These labels help us purchase large rolls of Hobbs batting at a discount to use for our community service quilts.

We also are able to use some of the more generous pieces of batting that membership donates to us. They are useful for our 18" by 21" cuddle quilts which go to Children's Medical Center at Legacy.

Flannel scraps can also be used for our small receiving blankets for Parkland Newborn Nursery and for the flannel rag quilts we also donate. Our Service Learning students earn service hours learning to make these small, easy quilts.

Community Service currently has a large supply of **quilts to be quilted.** These are available at the Community Service table at the guild meetings. These are smaller quilts that can be easily quilted on home machines using simple, allover quilting. Please donate a couple hours time to help Community Service get these quilts ready for donation.



At the end of April, I will be donating **baby quilts** to the **PISD School-Age Parent Program** for students graduating from High School. The students can "purchase" these quilts and other baby items from the program's "baby store" having earned points with their class attendance and participation in the Parent Program. Please turn in any finished baby quilts at the **April** guild meeting, so I can make this donation.

Changes in the minutes and treasurers report were called for. Both reports were accepted as published without changes.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Membership: Dolores Williams spoke to the issue of streamlining the business portion of the meetings. 
