PROGRAMS-IT'S CHRISTMAS IN JULY-DONNA LOBELSON

For the last few years in July, we have kicked off our Christmas stocking project. The guild provides kits, irons and extension cords. You bring your machines and basic sewing supplies. The following history is from Wikipedia, as you can see making stockings for military is a tradition.

History

While there are no written records of the origin of the Christmas Stocking, there are popular legends that attempt to tell the history of this Christmas tradition. One such legend has several variations, but the following is a good example:

Very long ago, there lived a poor man and his three very beautiful daughters. He had no money to get his daughters married, and he was worried what would happen to them after his death.

Saint Nicholas was passing through when he heard the villagers talking about the girls. St. Nicholas wanted to help, but knew that the old man wouldn't accept charity. He decided to help in secret. He waited until it was night and crept through the chimney. He had three bags of gold coins with him, one for each girl. As he was looking for a place to keep those three bags, he noticed stockings of the three girls that were hung over the mantelpiece for drying. He put one bag in each stocking and off he went. When the girls and their father woke up the next morning, they found the bags of gold coins and were of course, overjoyed. The girls were able to get married and live happily ever after.

This led to the custom of children hanging stockings or putting out shoes, eagerly awaiting gifts from Saint Nicholas. Sometimes the story is told with gold balls instead of bags of gold. That is why three gold balls, sometimes represented as oranges, are one of the symbols for St. Nicholas. And so, St. Nicholas is a gift-giver.

A tradition that began in a European country originally, children simply used one of their everyday <u>socks</u>, but eventually special Christmas stockings were created for this purpose. The Christmas stocking custom is derived from the Germanic/ Scandinavian figure <u>Odin</u>. According to Phyllis Siefker, children would place their boots, filled with <u>carrots</u>, <u>straw</u> or <u>sugar</u>, near the chimney for Odin's flying horse, Sleipnir, to eat. Odin would reward those children for their kindness by replacing Sleipnir's food with gifts or candy. This practice, she claims, survived in <u>Germany</u>, <u>Belgium</u> and the <u>Netherlands</u> after the adoption of Christianity and became associated with Saint Nicholas as a result of the process of <u>Christianization</u>. Today, stores carry a large variety of styles and sizes of Christmas stockings, and Christmas stockings are also a popular homemade craft. This claim is disputed though as there is no records of stocking filling practices related to Odin until there is a merging of St. Nicholas with Odin. St. Nicholas had an earlier merging with the Grandmother cult in Bari, Italy where the grandmother would put gifts in stockings. This merge of St. Nicholas would later travel north and merge with the Odin cults.

Many families create their own Christmas stockings with each family member's name applied to the stocking so that Santa will know which stocking belongs to which family member. A 'Square Stocking' is a box sent by the charity <u>Uk4u-Thanks!</u> to UK servicemen who are overseas or injured at Christmas.

TAQG Rally Day 2013 is scheduled for Saturday, July 13, 2013, starting at 9:00 a.m. at Mimosa Lane Baptist Church, 1233 Belt Line Road in Mesquite, TX, Workshops are scheduled at the church on Thursday, July 11, 2013 and Friday, July 12, 2013.

Rally Day admission is free with your guild membership card. If you forget your card, you will have to go through another line where they will have your guild roster to check off your name. Anyone may attend, but if you are not a current member of a TAQG Member Guild, the admission is \$25.00.

SKILLS DEMOS FOR QUILT PLANO 2013-MARGARET SCHAFER

As I reminded you earlier this spring, we will be doing demos again this year. Thank you again for all your hard work in making our skills demos such a great success last year, and we expect another excellent turnout for Quilt Plano 2013. We took all your comments and the critiques from the attendees to incorporate them into the plans for this year. One of the things we had differences on was that some preferred a shorter time, while others preferred a longer time. In one case, we are fixing that by adding another short related skill to the demo.

This memo is long, but it will take you much less time to read it than it would be to go to a meeting, so I hope this works well for you. All I ask is that you read all of it, and respond with the information I am requesting. Having said that, it is now time to finalize our plans for the skills demonstrations on Friday and Saturday, August 9 and 10, during the quilt show. As you know we had such an overwhelming response to the demos last year that we are adding the extra day on Friday to accommodate all our guests. This means that each of you will probably be doing demos on both days. We will not be starting until 10:00 o'clock which was suggested by several of you since the 9:00 o'clock classes had a lower attendance. The last demo will begin at 3 o'clock each afternoon.

All of the demos will be allocated an hour which includes getting people out and people in for the next demo. The length of the demos will still be 30 minutes. That gives you 15 minutes to get everyone in, get them seated and ready with handouts, supplies, etc. The next 30 minutes will be the demo itself, and the last 15 minutes will be for completing a very short critique, then getting them out the door so we can be ready for the next group.

We are adding several demos including one on the different ways to make flying geese, and

perhaps several on the techniques used in the art quilts. I am waiting to hear back from some of these to finalize the list of instructors, the demos to be presented each day, and the time for the demos.

In the meantime, I need some input from you. As you know, I did not try to add meetings to your already busy schedules this year since most of you have already done this and you are already real pros at it. We tried to accommodate all your requests last year for supplies and/or equipment, but I think we were lacking a couple. I do apologize for that and I promise to do better this year. However, as always, you came through and everything proceeded as scheduled.

Here is the information I need from you:

- (1) A list of any and all supplies you need [I will do my best to get them]
- (2) Do you prefer a round table or an oblong table? Some people started out with one or the other, then decided they liked the other set up better. If you have a preference, be sure to let me know and we will do our best to accommodate you.
- (3) Do you require any special hookups [electricity for sewing machine, pot for hot water, etc.]
- (4) Do you wish to make any changes to your handouts this year? If so, let me know by July 15, so I can make the changes and get everything printed. Just e-mail them to me.
- (5) Anything else I have forgotten.

All my contact information is below. Thank you again for all your support, and I look forward to working with you again this year. You are just the best!


