COMMUNITY SERVICE—TERRI MENDELOW

Community Service made a donation of 15 quilts to West, Texas in July for the victims of the terrible fertilizer plant explosion. After tracking the donation site, my husband and I drove down to take the quilts to the West Long Term Recovery Center. It was a good feeling to know some of our quilts will assist some of the people of West.

A delivery was also made to My Friend's House, where I met the two volunteers who had made the guilt top for their silent auction and fund raiser being held on September 7, for their founding agency, City House. Our guild had agreed to assist them with backing, batting and quilting. Because the quilt top was made with micro-suede and beaded trimmings, it required special handling. Fortune was with me, as I had seen Richard Larsen in an appliqué class. I asked him about the guilting needed for the top. Richard advised me to contact him if there were any problems. After some discussions with another generous guilter, we decided we needed Richard. He was very gracious in accepting this task for the guild and for City House. Thank you, Richard!

At the July meeting there were 18 quilts, 5 tops, and 2 cuddles turned in. The meeting was the Christmas in July program and members sewed Christmas stockings for the Soldiers Angels program. There will be more stockings available at the Community Service

table between now and November. We need all stockings back by the November meeting so they can be distributed to Soldiers Angels and out to our service men, women and families by Christmas. Thank you all for your participation. Also, thank you to Julie Schaefer for filling in for me while I was out of town.

The next Community Service Sit & Sew will be on August 13, from 10-3 p.m.

This will be the Tuesday after the Quilt Plano show. Please join us and bring your sewing machine and supplies. Pre-cut kits will be available for us to sew a quilt top. 


