

## **PROGRAMS**—**DONNA LOBELSON**

#### September Guest Speaker— Harriet Hargrave

Harriet started quilting seriously in 1974, working alongside her mom. Her early quilting career included producing baby quilts for craft shows and teaching adult education classes. In 1981, Harriet opened her quilt shop, Harriet's Treadle Arts. Her



specialties at the time were free-motion embroidery, machine arts, and machine guilting. In 1982, Harriet attended one of Mary Ellen Hopkins's seminars. Mary Ellen's streamlined techniques and innovative design ideas led Harriet to a new way of thinking, which caused her to give up the machine arts and to teach only quilting. Today, she is world renowned for being a true "mover and shaker" in the quilt world. In the late 1990s, she was voted one of the "88 Leaders of the Quilt World." Harriet created and inspired a whole new generation of machine guilters with her bestselling book Heirloom Machine Quilting, which has enjoyed 22 continuous years in print. She is also the author of Mastering Machine Appliqué and From Fiber to Fabric, and co-author of "The Art of Classic Quiltmaking". She is responsible for a myriad of products pertaining to machine guilting, and she has developed batting with Hobbs Bonded Fibers and designed fabric for P&B Textiles. ## QUILT PLANO 2013 MINIATURE SILENT AUCTION REPORT— CYNTHIA WEISZ & TINA CONNOLLY

Thank you, thank you, thank you for the great minis that you donated to the silent auction. We reached our goal of \$55 per mini and passed it!! The average price paid was \$56.71. There were 79 minis, including the two donated by Sherrill Lewis of the Bead Ranch and J Michelle Watts. All were sold. Your minis brought the guild \$4480! The 36 mini makers should be very proud of that total which reflects a 27.6% increase over the 2012 show. Our small group had so much fun this year watching and listening to our guests as they looked at your handiwork. Over and over, we heard about the variety and quality of your work. Many said your minis were the best display they had ever seen. We agree.

You will be receiving a thank you note with the total sales price of your donated work. That note can be used for tax purposes. As always, the public generally doesn't understand the amount of time you put into your work. One 12 x 12 quilt with 720 pieces in it went for less than \$100. Do not be discouraged because when you do your best work you will feel a personal satisfaction no matter what price your quilt brings.

The show judges also judged the minis. First place went to Ileana Salzer for her triangle beauty. Second place went to Cynthia Weisz for her tiny wool hand done jewel. And third place went to Paula Washler for her hot cups of coffee. Honorable Mention was awarded to Rose-Clair Fletcher for her fairy art quilt. New member Pam Wingate's LOVE quilt was sold for the highest price of \$200.The first three places received gift cards to the Texas Quilter.

the third Saturday of the month at the Texas Quilter. We meet on Saturday, August 17, and this month's class will be on fusible appliqué as they make ice cream cones for their monthly quilt block. The children are really having fun with this class, and they are learning lots of quilting-related skills. It was so nice to see several of our Junior Quilters at the Quilt Show. We are building future quilters to enter quilts into the show and new talent for organizing and running the quilt show. Congratulations to junior quilter, Victoria Wilshire, for her blue-ribbon in this year's show. We have to have many entries from our junior quilters in next year's show.

Education's next big event will be the annual Plano International Festival on Saturday, October 5 from 11:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. in Haggard Park in downtown Plano. We will have our children's booth, and we will need volunteers to help with this big event. The children will once again be making crayon blocks and doing redwork squares.

Also, remember our Sew Happy Group of senior quilters who meet the first and second Thursday of every month from 1:00 to 5:00 at the Plano Senior Center. After the quilting sessions on the second Thursday, a group of the quilters grab a quick meal together then go to the monthly Quilters Guild of Plano meeting. All seniors are welcome to attend these enjoyable quilting sessions.

## TAQG—SHERRY WORLEY


