Many thanks go to LaDawn for her work and also to Shirley Weaver, Debbie Skorepa, and Suzy Boyle for their roles as Education Committee Chairpersons. Unfortunately Shirley has moved out of state and Debbie has resigned due to work schedule conflicts, so we are looking for new chairperson in those areas. It is my sincere hope that you will continue your support to our new Vice President of Education, Lyn Jennings, and that our educational programs within the guild will continue to grow and develop. I would love to see us gain the reputation of the best educational guild in our area. Our free quilting-related demonstrations at Quilt Plano 2012 and 2013 certainly helped to boost that image.

Program reminders for this month are the Junior Quilting Group's meeting on Saturday, September 21 at 10 o'clock at the Texas Quilter, and the Plano International Festival on Saturday, October 5. Education: Margaret Schafer reported on upcoming events. September 19th there will be a workshop from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. to prepare blocks for Plano's annual International Festival. The Festival will be on October 5th at Haggard Park. A sign-up sheet for helping children color blocks and learn how to do red work on this day was passed around. Margaret was happy to report that the Jr. Quilt Group was full of members.

<u>Community Service:</u> MJ reminded members to go to the Community Service tables after the presentation to get kits and rolls of quilts to be quilted and/or bound. LaDawn Dalley reported the general meeting in November was the final date for bringing in any Christmas Stockings.


QUILT PLANO 2013 FINANCIALS— DONNA PETRICK

The monthly cash flow statement shows you how much money came in and went out for the month of August. But it really doesn't give you a good idea of what the show actually made and cost. I'm very happy to tell you that this show is what we wanted when we decided to go to an annual show. The total revenue for the show was \$48,599.31 with expenses of \$32,450.44, leaving us a profit of \$16,148.87. This was \$4,000.00 more than we had budgeted to profit from the show. Congratulations to all of you who worked so hard this year to make the show so successful and especially to Kemberly Wilshire for her dedication for several years to get the quilt show to this level.
