(For those of you who really plan ahead, Quilt Plano 2015 is already on the calendar for August 14—15, 2015.)


COMMUNITY SERVICE— TERRI MENDELOW

End of Year Report: From October, 2012 through September, 2013, Community Service was able to deliver the following donations to our community agencies: 206 Quilts, 48 Afghans, 56 Flannel Huggies, 92 Cuddle Quilts, 23 Pillow Cases, 980 Christmas Stockings, and 12 Fleece Baby Blankets. The grand total of donations was 1,417 items made by our membership. Let's keep up the great work for Community Service. In fact, let's see if we can increase our quilt donations in this new year.

Stocking Project: November is the deadline for Christmas Stockings. LaDawn will need to deliver stockings to Soldiers Angels so they can prepare them for distribution in December. Sadly, this will be LaDawn's last year to serve as the Chair for Christmas Stockings. We are so sorry to lose her. LaDawn and her daughters have done an amazing job over the years! LaDawn will stay with the Education Committee supervising the Service Learning students and they will continue to make flannel baby receiving blankets for Community Service.

Please let me know if there are any members who are interested in taking the Chair position so the Stocking Project can continue. A small bee or group could fulfill this position. This job involves collecting and keeping Christmas/Holiday fabric, cutting stockings and cuffs with the die cut machine and bagging them for the members to take to sew, collecting sewn stockings and distributing them to Soldiers Angels. Sit & Sew: The 2nd Tuesday Community Service Sit & Sew will meet on November12, from 10-3 at the Plano Sewing Center in the southeast shopping center at Custer and Spring Creek Parkway. We sew quilt tops from pre-cut kits which will become the donation quilts for our agencies. This is a great way to meet members. 

GENERAL MEETING MINUTES—OCTOBER 10—LESLIE LEATHERS

Guild President Dolores Williams called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m. She began the meeting by inviting Guild members to the monthly Board of Directors meetings which are held at Fabric Fanatics on the first Monday of the month at 1:30 p.m. Any member wishing to discuss a topic should contact Dolores so that she can have it added to the Agenda. As new president she plans to keep the general meetings very short as most information that members need to know is published in the monthly newsletter. The minutes and treasurer' reports from the meeting of September 12, 2013 were approved as published in the September newsletter.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Education:

A new V.P. for Education is needed. The Committee Chairs are filled. Julie Schaefer offered to help with this position until a permanent Vice President is found. LaDawn Dalley stated this is the last month to complete Christmas stockings for Soldiers Angels. As of last month the guild had competed 600-650 stockings. Items are needed to fill stockings, like toiletries, old cell phones with chargers, calling cards, etc. LaDawn will not be able to continue as Chair for the Christmas Stockings Project and needs someone to take over. She will continue to chair the Service Learning Projects for high school and college students.

Community Service:

Terri Mendelow reported a total of 1,325 items were completed by guild members. This includes 206 quilts, 48 afghans, 56 flannel huggies, 92 cuddle quilts, and 980 Christmas stockings. Anyone who is not sure if their hours for working the Quilt Show are correct should check to see their hours in the Members' hours log book.

Membership:

Fifteen door prizes were distributed. Sherry noted that most came from the usual donors, as well as two from TAQG and two from the Quilt Guild of Plano. She showed a Block of the Month quilt, "America the Beautiful", from the shop, "Minding your P's and & Q's" on Hwy. 380. Attendance this evening are 75 members and 5 visitors.

Guild Activities:

<u>Debbie Seher</u> requested members turn in 9- patches which will be sent to Shirley Weaver who moved to Georgia. Instructions for making these are in the Guild Directory and on the Guild website.

<u>Linda Neal</u> asked for anyone who finished the Block of Month. Only one was finished. She wants to start a challenge quilt and would welcome ideas for this year.

<u>Tina Connolly</u> requested members to start making mini quilts for next year's show which is in ten months. She informed members that Rhonda Kuntz is having a garage sale of quilting fabrics and quilting items this Saturday.

The February, 2014 retreat deadline for registration is coming up. A deposit of \$100.00 is required to hold your spot.

<u>Dee Ann McFarlin</u> asked for Show & Tell. Three quilts were shown by Ikana Salzer, and one was shown by Kay Burnett.

NINE-PATCH—DEBBIE SEHER


