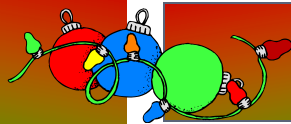


Taking classes in Houston reminded me how lucky we are to have guild-sponsored classes from our speakers at such affordable prices.

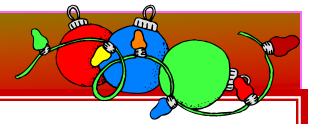
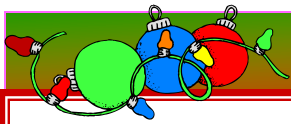

Precut kits for quilt tops are ready for us to sew. This is a fun group and a great way to meet new people while helping our mission of Community Service.

Stitch up your own snow storm! Learn how to thread sketch delicate flakes and swirls, then embellish with paint. This is a good workshop for those who already have basic machine free-motion experience who want to expand their skills and do more with thread on the surface of a quilt. There is a \$3.00 kit fee for this class.

Class descriptions are available on the Quilters Guild of Plano website.

Guild President Dolores Williams called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. She began the meeting by recognizing the members of the Allen Quilt Guild who were displaying their raffle quilt. The drawing will be held on December 7. Dolores announced that the next Board Meeting will be held on December 2, 2014 at 1:30 p.m. in the classroom at Fabric Fanatics. The Minutes from the October 10 meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter. The Treasurer's report was approved as submitted and will be filed for audit. Dolores also announced that the Guild is collecting 9 patches to be given to Shirley Weaver.

Committee Reports-

Community Service—Terri Mendelow recognized the Nifty Needlers who volunteered to chair the Christmas stocking project. The December community service, Sit and Sew group, will be a party for regular members of the group. Sewing will resume at the January Sit and Sew. Terri reminded members to record their service hours on the log sheet that is available on the Community Service table at each guild meeting. Julie Schaefer stated that service hours could also be sent directly to her at her e-mail address in the Membership Directory.

Education—Dolores and Julie Schaefer requested a volunteer to take over the VP Education position. The next project is scheduled for March, so work will not begin until February.

Guild Activities—Linda Neal announced that the Guild will begin a UFO challenge. Each member is to bring a list of 12 projects to be completed over the next year. Forms will be collected in December and January and completed projects are to be brought to Show and Tell. The member who completes the most projects will be declared the "Queen of the Court" for the challenge. By show of hands, the membership decided to charge a \$1 fee for every participant, with the pot to be given to the winner. Linda also announced an Ugly Fat Quarter challenge will begin in the spring, with the completed projects to be exhibited at the Quilt Show. Kaye Dunn announced that the Block of the Month pattern includes 3 more blocks that

can be accessed through the link to Debbie Mumm's website on the guild webpage.

Programs—Kaye Dunn announced there were 4 spots left for the Friday workshop and one spot left for the Saturday workshop, and the signup sheet was available for the January workshop. Kaye requested input from members on the program to be offered by Gail Garber next fall. She wants to know whether members are more interested in attending 2 one day classes, or one 2 day class.

NOVEMBER BOARD MEETING MINUTES—MARTY CROUCH

Dolores Williams, guild president, called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m. at The Texas Quilter.

Items discussed:

1. We still need a volunteer for VP—Education. The next education activity is scheduled in March.
2. There are 158 paid members. Membership cards will be distributed in the November meeting.
3. The Board affirmed decisions made by the Quilt Show Committee:
 - a. The ticket price will increase to \$8 for general admission, \$7 for seniors and advance purchase.
 - b. The senior age will remain at 62.
 - c. \$50 cash prizes will be given to all blue ribbon winners. The cash prizes will be funded through sponsorships, if possible. If sponsorships are not available, the prizes will be funded out of profit.
4. The Nifty Needlers volunteered to coordinate Christmas Stockings. The budget was adjusted to add the \$200 expense back for the stockings.
5. Insurance requires that assets be itemized.

Major assets that would require repurchase will be scheduled. Fabric will not be insured, as most of it was donated.

6. Activities planned for the year:
 - a. UFO Challenge—sign up in November, \$1 registration fee will be placed in a pot. The member who completes the most will win the pot.
 - b. Fat Quarter Challenge—begins in March.
7. Board members were encouraged to submit items for publishing in accordance with a schedule to be determined by Mickie Warrington. This request is to eliminate duplicate messages to Mickie.

The **next board meeting** will be held on **Monday, December 2, 2013** at 1:30 p.m. in the classroom at **Fabric Fanatics**.

The meeting adjourned at 2:40 p.m.
