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OPPORTUNITY TO WORK FROM HOME—MICKIE WARRINGTON

Your Show Committee has been working hard behind the scenes planning for Quilt Plano to be held Friday and Saturday, August 15th and 16th.

- Show t-shirts have been designed and we will begin taking orders and payments at the January meeting
- The 2014 Raffle Quilt will be displayed (along with its 3 ribbons) at the January meeting, and raffle tickets will be given out
- Registration rules and forms for entering quilts are being updated and will be available on our website by the end of January
- Design plans are under way for the 2015 Raffle Quilt
- Volunteers are working on updating our mailing and publicity databases
- Vendors and Sponsors are being signed up

The annual Quilt Show is the guild's major source of revenue to pay for future speakers and workshops. Because major speakers must be booked years in advance of the actual meeting date, funds raised at Quilt Plano 2014 will be used to plan and pay for our speakers in 2015 and 2016 and beyond. Ways to support the show now:

- Make a mini auction quilt (the auction raised over \$4,000 last year)

DECEMBER BOARD MEETING MINUTES—MARTY CROUCH

MJ Fielek called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm.

Items discussed:


- An error was discovered in transcribing the financials for the 2013 Quilt Show as reported in the Newsletter. The errors will be corrected as soon as possible and the financials will be reposted.
- 2. We still need a VP Education.
- There were 3 new members at the November meeting. Updates to the Directory are in the process of being printed.
- 4. Notifications need to be sent to members regarding:
 - a. Membership prices—Only those who have never been a member of the guild are able to join at the prorated rate. Quilt show participants should be reminded that they will be responsible for a full year's membership fee, even if they renew later in the year.
 - b. Gift certificates sold for 2013
 programs expire in December 2013.
 Members will be requested to notify
 Kaye Dunn or Sherry Worley if they
 are still holding gift certificates
 purchased for 2013 programs.
- The December meeting will be a Make and Take program. Officers will be requested to bring snacks. Donna will send a reminder email to the Board members.
- 6. The draft of the UFO Challenge rules and participation form was reviewed. The forms will be placed on the website.
- Board members were requested to send all communication for the newsletter to the newsletter@quiltersguildofplano.org address so all individuals who work on communications have access to the information.
- 8. The schedule for newsletter submissions needs more clarification since the current

- deadline (the Monday after the guild meeting) is a fluctuating date. Specific date deadlines were suggested for both board members and advertisers. (For example, everything due by the 15th of the month).
- An assistant is needed for the VP Media.
 Mickie will be requested to define the responsibilities and skills needed for the assistant.
- 10. In reviewing the itemization of assets for insurance purposes, it was determined that our assets are stored in multiple locations which are unlikely to be destroyed at the same time. Also, most assets were donated and have negligible value. Instead of itemizing each piece of equipment, an umbrella policy will be purchased for the guild that will cover liability and car insurance for those who drive on guild business.
- 11. An inventory will be conducted in January to document items that are stored in storage facilities or individual homes. Serial numbers of any equipment owned by the guild need to be submitted by February.
- Donna Petrick made a motion that the residual value of the printer be given to Kemberly Wilshire. The motion was seconded by Pam Walsh and approved.
- 13. A suggestion was made that we create a guild shirt separate from the quilt show shirt. MJ will determine if the guild logo can be digitized, and contact vendors who might be willing to embroider the shirts. The membership will be asked to vote on shirt color and style.

The next Board meeting will be held **December 30, 2013**, location to be determined.
