THE PRESIDENT SAYS

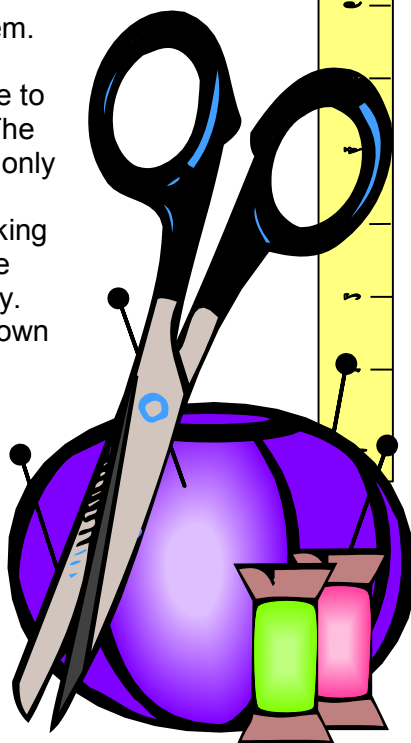

Our May guild meeting is going to be “all about the show”. We are going to focus on what it takes to make our show successful—YOU THE VOLUNTEER. Our newer members can learn details

about the different volunteer jobs—when and what. The show committee will be available to help with information and sign-up. We will have special drawings for those signing up to work the week of the show. T-shirts that were pre-ordered will be distributed.

Volunteers are needed for these areas:

- Quilt turn-in on Tuesday
- Hanging quilts on Wednesday—spotters who don't have to climb ladders are also needed
- Assistants for judges and vendors on Wednesday and Thursday
- Hanging quilt signs on Thursday
- Admissions, Hospitality, Membership, Bag Check, Children's Activities, Mini Auction and Raffle Tickets—sit-down jobs on Friday and Saturday
- Staff/Safety—great jobs for husbands, sons and friends—these Friday and Saturday jobs come with a vest and walkie-talkie
- Quilt Angels—walking around jobs on Friday and Saturday with the added bonus of getting to actually touch the quilts
- Taking down quilts on Saturday after the show
- Quilt give-back on Saturday after the show.

Every member who volunteers for 2 hours on a show activity earns free admission to the show. (Members not working must pay \$3). Every member who volunteers for at least 4 hours earns the special show charm.

MAY PROGRAMS—SHERRY WORLEY AND KAYE DUNN

May will be an exciting meeting. We will get to view and vote on all of the wonderful Spring Fling Challenge Mini Quilts. It is always interesting to see how a varied group of quilters work with the same “challenging” fabrics. The rest of the meeting is dedicated to our upcoming Quilt Show. This is an important night to get a peek behind the scenes. It takes an entire guild to put on a great Quilt Show, and this will be your opportunity to become involved.



MJ Fielek, member and Past President of the Quilters Guild of Plano, is offering a workshop on May 9th, 2014. The subject is “Bindings”. She will teach plain and stuffed bindings, 2 color and bias bindings, bindings with a flange and how to bind minis. MJ will provide quilted material but you will need the following supplies; 2 colors of fabric – each at least ¼ yard,

basic sewing supplies, sewing machine in good working order, rotary cutter, mat and ruler, and marking pen. The cost is \$30.00 for guild members and \$40.00 for non-members, no

discounts will apply. To sign up for this class, use the standard class form, write in the amount paid and mail as usual.

In June, prepare to be entertained by Brenda Perry. She is a professional quilt maker, lecturer and teacher. A self proclaimed “Quiltaholic”. She lives in Sanger, Texas with husband, Don, of 50 years; they have a married daughter and 2 grown grandsons. Her family is her biggest fan.



Brenda says “I learned early on that I loved working with my hands and have tried everything from macramé, tole painting, and fabric crafts to cross stitch. Once I discovered quilting all else went by the wayside. I am a self taught traditional quilter. I dabbled in art quilts just long enough to know that my niche is elsewhere.”

Brenda’s program, “Waste Not—Want Not,” is a way of life passed down from her grandmother and mother and applied to quilting in the form of using fabric scraps.

APRIL GENERAL MEETING MINUTES—LESLIE LEATHERS

Guild President Dolores Williams called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The minutes of the March meeting were approved as written. The treasurer's reports will be filed for audit. The next Have-A-Cup will be on Thursday, April 17, at 10:00 a.m. at La Madeline's.

Committee Reports:

Mickie Warrington gave the dates for 2015 Retreat at Mitchell's RV Park for February 19-22, 2015. Cost is \$278.00 for double occupancy, and \$425.00 for single. "Those members who give a deposit of \$100 prior to 4/15/14, and attend Retreat 2015, will be eligible for a drawing of a \$25.00 gift certificate." *(If they decide not to go they will not be eligible for the drawing)*

Kaye Dunn, VP, Programs: stated there are still spots open for the workshops on Friday and Saturday given by Karen Kay Buckley. M.J. Fielek will hold a workshop in May on bindings. This will be the last workshop until September.

Pam Wingate, VP Education: told of the successful day at Isaac's Early Childhood School during a lesson on shapes. On April 26th she will need help at the Heard Museum doing a crayon block lesson. Margaret Schafer reminded us that the Jr. Quilt Group begins in June and will need a leader for the beginner group. She will continue teaching the advanced group. These free classes are offered on the 3rd Saturday monthly from 10-12 a.m. at Texas Quilters.

Pam Walsh, Show Chair: The forms for Quilt Show entries are ready. June will be the last month to register your quilts. You only need to have the top finished to enter. At the May general meeting members will be asked to sign up for volunteer work at the Show. Non-members are very welcome to volunteer. She will need men to "staff" as the eyes and ears for the security people. She will also need Quilt Angels to handle the quilts on display. There will be several special exhibits this year. She would like at least 5-6 entries for each small group doing an exhibit.

Donna Petrick, VP Membership: Tonight members are asked to complete the ballots to

vote on the Membership Directory being put on-line. This will be a secure password protected program with individuals having their own passwords. There are 84 members present tonight and 4 new members.

Thirteen door prizes were given out. Door prizes this month were donated from: Alford Inn Quilt Shoppe in Van Alstyne, Blue Ribbon Quilt Shoppe in Wylie, Happiness is...Quilting, The Quilt Asylum, and Stitched with Love, in McKinney, Minding My P's & Q's in Denton, Quilters Connection and Sew Let's Quilt It in Dallas, Quilt Country in Lewisville, Threads That Bind & Needleworks, Quilt Ideas, and Quilters Guild of Plano in Plano and an anonymous member.

Linda Neal, Guild Activities: There were 31 UFO's presented tonight and the winner for this month is Kathi Gibson. There are 21 members participating in the Spring Fling Challenge. The entries will be given numbers and be an unjudged exhibit in the Show.

Tina Connolly: The Christmas tree blocks for the 2015 raffle quilt must be turned in by the May meeting. The mini quilts donated for the Quilt Show were shown, and many more are needed.

Terri Mendelow, VP Community Service: Always needs donations of fabric for the community service quilts, and the Christmas stockings. There were 3 birthday quilts turned in for April. She thanked everyone for their continuous work completing these quilts.

Donna Petrick announced that the ballots had been collected and counted. The result is the new directory will be on-line.

Sherry Worley, TAQG Representative: Volunteers are needed for Rally Day. There were three quilts turned in for the TAQG auction. Show and Share Quilts were shown by Martha O'Grady, Marty Crouch, Sally Martens, and Ileana Salzer.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:41 p.m. Guest Speaker Karen Kay Buckley was introduced.

APRIL BOARD MEETING MINUTES—MARTY CROUCH

Dolores Williams called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. The Treasurer's report was approved to be filed for audit. The March Board minutes were approved as published in the newsletter.

Items discussed:

1. **Donna Petrick** presented information on a proposed web-hosting application developed by Brian Plotkin that would allow the guild to create a web site and electronic membership directory, send e-mails with user friendly menus, and possibly process money transactions using PayPal (depending on rules for non-profits). The application does not require any programming knowledge and allows each member to have a private password to control their personal information. The cost of the website is around \$250 per year. There may be additional charges for set up and maintenance, but would not exceed \$150 per year. We currently pay \$186 to host our website and have budgeted \$750 for the membership directory. A motion was made by MJ Fielek to move towards implementing the system in stages beginning with the membership directory. The motion was seconded by Terri Mendelow. The motion passed.
2. **Sherry Worley** reported on tax rules that were discussed at TAQG.
 - a. Our two tax free days need to be recorded in the Board minutes. It was established that our tax free days for 2014 would be August 15 and 16.

- b. Our Bylaws need to state how long we will retain tax records. Texas state law requires 4 years. Dolores and Donna will research Federal requirements.

3. **The Spring Fling challenge** is due at the May guild meeting. Finished quilts will be hung for display.
4. **Community Service** has delivered 100 quilts in 2014 .
5. Newsletter articles are due by Thursday, April 17.
6. **The Karen Kay Buckley classes** are not full.
7. **Signup sheets** to work TAQG Rally Day will be available at the April guild meeting.
8. Quilt show T-shirts and bags are in production.

The next Board meeting will be held **April 28, 2014** at Tinos Two, 2205 Ave K, Plano. Dinner is at 5:30 and the meeting starts at 6:30 p.m.

The meeting adjourned at 7:30 p.m.

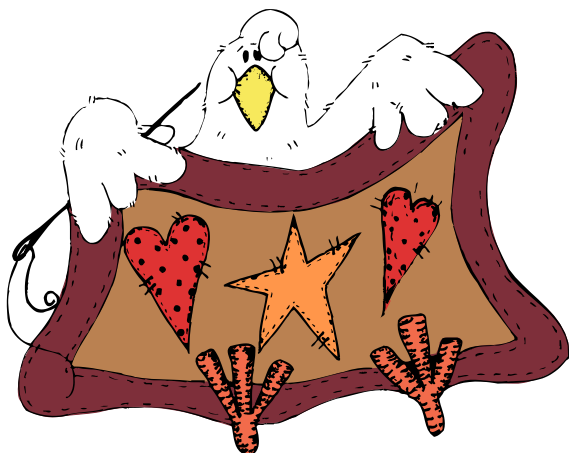
UFO Challenge
