Again preparations have been happening all year to make quilt show days run smoothly, but the work is really piling on.



Just to add a little fun to the mixture, we are

also looking at changing our web site. We started looking for a way to put our guild roster on-line and found this great web host (Brian Plotkin) that has an application that will let us have our directory online, do our hours on-line, sign up volunteers, and we be our official web site. This sounds a little too good to be true, but it not only works better than we expected but the cost is only a little more than we pay for our current website.

One of the features of this new program will be that each person can update their own information when it changes. You can even update your photo if you want. The guild will save the cost of printing directories and save us the cost of having an on-line volunteer hour's program developed. The savings will be about \$1000 per year, and we will have a better product.

One of the obstacles was privacy. We were afraid that having our information on-line could lead to all kinds of problems. Well, our new program comes with a built-in security program where everyone will have their own log-on. Another big feature of this program is that once we have it set up, administration will be very easy. Everything will be done through forms on the website, so the administrator will not need to know how to program in order to update information.

By the way, we have an opening for a webmaster for next year. Your job will be easy. Now is the time to get involved so you can learn with us how to run the program.

Guild President Dolores Williams called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The minutes from the last meeting were accepted as published in the newsletter. There were no changes to the treasurer's report. It will be filed for audit.

Dolores announced that, "Have A Cup" with the Board has been moved to Thursday, June 19 at LaMadeline at Central Expressway and 15<sup>th</sup> Street at 10 a.m. Dolores polled the membership on whether the e-mail link or the website was used to read the newsletter. <u>Mini-Quilts</u>—Tina Connolly displayed the mini -quilts donated this month. Mary Francis O'Neill won the drawing provided by Stitched With Love for donating a mini-quilt.

<u>**Guild Activities</u>**—Linda Neal announced that 15 UFO Challenges were turned in this month. Participants were recognized. Kaye Dunn</u> won the UFO Challenge door prize donated by Quilt Country.

**<u>Programs</u>**—MJ Fielek showed examples of the Orphan Block quilt that will be taught at the July workshop. Members who take the class may bring their own orphan blocks or complete the project for donation using orphan blocks from Community Service projects.

**TAQG**—Sherry Worley announced that Rally Day is July 12. Admission is free. There will be two lectures by Pat Speth. Lunch tickets and pre-Rally Day tickets are available. Sherry requested volunteers to work the event.

**Membership**—There were 9 visitors and 2 new members, with 86 in attendance. Donna Petrick distributed 13 door prizes provided by the Guild, one member and the following shops:

The business meeting concluded at 7:35 p.m. Brenda Perry presented the program "Waste Not, Want Not."

## JUNE BOARD MEETING MINUTES-LESLIE LEATHERS

President Dolores Williams called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. The minutes of the last board meeting were accepted as written. The treasurer' report will be filed for audit.

The nominating committee for next year's Board needs to be set up. President asked who plans to keep their current position. Positions that need to be filled are: VP for Community Service, VP for Media, TAQG Representative, Secretary, and Co-Chair with Pam Walsh for Quilt Show. Board member reports are due by the September meeting. A copy goes to the President and a copy to the incoming officer. There is an error on page 35 of the By-Laws, item (3). It needs to be corrected by the secretary.

Pam Wingate reported on Education—The first class of Junior Quilters will be this upcoming weekend. She has two volunteers to help: Elizabeth Dougherty and Mary Bishop. A second class may need to be added. Margaret Schaefer will lead the advanced group. For the Quilt Show, Crayon Blocks and Demo Area are being organized. There will be a History of Quilting with the DAR (Daughters of American Revolution).

Donna Petrick reported on Membership—The antique quilt given to Mindy Myint from the Plano Senior Center will be added to the Guild's collection and will be hung at the show with the other Guild History quilts.

TAQG is July 12<sup>th</sup>. TAQG has had some issues with providing a Tax ID number for the purchase of food for lunch on Rally Day. Donna Petrick made a motion for the Plano Quilt Guild to purchase the food and then be reimbursed by TAQG. The motion was seconded by MJ Fielek. Tickets still available. Mini quilts will be accepted until July 12<sup>th</sup>.

Terri Mendelow reported on Community Service—Sit and Sew will be June 10<sup>th</sup>. The last Sit & Sew panel project was well received. Almost all panels were completed and will be used for a quilting workshop. If we can donate 300 quilts this year, that will equal 8 quilts per month donated to the three primary agencies that we work with: My Friend's House, Children's Advocacy Center, and Rape Crisis Center which are all in Collin County. Discussion followed about the number of quilts a guild can realistically finish. The biggest problem is getting them quilted, not pieced or bound. Linda Neal reported for Guild Activities—Spring Fling went well and the UFO challenge will continue through December. She has planned a Round Robin Do It Yourself and will bring ideas to the September and October meetings. This project will start in January. Hospitality name should state Kathy Hook, not Linda Neal.

MJ Fielek, Treasurer, stated an audit is due. Audits should be done semi-annually. Two people are needed that are not board members to assist MJ and Carol Long. Volunteers will be asked for at the June meeting and the audit will be planned for the July meeting. MJ Fielek also explained to the Board how the orphan block project for an upcoming workshop will work.

Pam Walsh reported on progress of the Quilt Show—Received 97 entries to date. A meeting will be held next week and all committees are on track. Asked if board would accept any and all ads for the programs. Board agreed all are welcome. Security issue discussed. Cost of off duty Police Officer \$40.00 per/hr. and Security Officer \$19.00 p/hr. Pam is concerned about security being scarce. President Dolores Williams suggested one police officer and one security officer. MJ Fielek reminded of the need to keep police officer to escort board members carrying the show money to their cars. Additional Staff/Safety, comprised mostly of husbands are desperately needed. They work two hour shifts.

Media—Mickie Warrington will add a spot on the web site to direct members to the gallery and will update the vendors. Donna Petrick and Kemberly Wilshire began demonstrating the new web site. The web site has huge potential and is very user friendly. A discussion followed regarding safety issues, public and private areas, etc. The Board has already approved to do the Membership Directory and the Volunteer hours on-line. Now we need to approve the web site to be called QGPlano.org. Pam Walsh made motion to go ahead with website, and when it is ready to convert all current programs to the web site. The motion was seconded by Donna Petrick.

Those in attendance were: Dolores Williams, Kaye Dunn, M.J. Fielek, Linda Neal, Pam Wingate, Leslie Leathers, Kemberly Wilshire, Donna Petrick, Lynne Fritsche, Pam Walsh, Terri Mendelow, Tina Connolly, and Mickie Warrington.

# TO BE OR NOT TO BE—KATHY HOOK




I just read an
