These demos will be held in the Northbrook Room both days.

If you are a beginner at quilting on your home machine, please consider joining a special class taught by Sherry Worley and the Community Service Crew. The cost is a mere \$25 and a Community Service kit, ready for

Dolores announced that Have A Cup with the Board will be Thursday, July 17 at LaMadeline at Central Expressway and 15th Street at 10 a.m. She reminded members that children who attend meetings must stay in the meeting room with their parent or be escorted if they are out of the room This rule is for the child's safety.

Dolores presented the President's Lone Star Awards to Kemberly Wilshire, Donna Petrick, Margaret Schaefer and Sherry Worley for their 2013 and 2014 contributions to the guild.

TAQG—Sherry Worley announced that Rally Day is July 12 and that volunteers will be able to enter the event without standing in line. Admission is free.

Community Service—Eleven completed quilts were turned in and Sherry Worley donated a Birthday, UFO Challenge Quilt. August Sit & Sew meeting is cancelled due to preparations for the Quilt Show. September 9 will be the next Sit & Sew meeting at Plano Sewing Center.

A new community service project will assist a non-profit called, "Cradled With Love", to make baby wraps known as "mobies". We will sew the edges of the wraps to secure the pre-cut fabric. We will donate them to PISD School-Age Parent Program.

The Stocking Project will accept any stockings you may still have to finish. Soldiers Angels needs them by the end of October. Three hundred stockings have been turned in so far.

<u>Programs</u>—Kaye Dunn reminded members to sign up for the Orphan Block class that will be taught at the July workshop. Members who take the class may bring their own orphan blocks or complete the project for donation using orphan blocks from Community Service projects.

MJ Fielek announced that Pat Sloan will be speaking at the McKinney Guild on July 15 at Heard-Craig Hall in McKinney.

Sally Martens inspired us with <u>Show and Tell</u> that was also her completed UFO project.

The business meeting concluded at 7:30 p.m. Margaret Schaefer introduced the Skills Night program. Presenters included: Pam Wingate—Melted Crayon Appliqué Demo; Rose Davis—English Paper Piecing and John Worley—Photographing Quilts.

COMMUNITY SERVICE—TERRI MENDELOW

<u>Donation Quilts:</u> 11 quilts, two cuddles, and two afghans were turned in at the July meeting. With quilts turned in the last couple of months, we will have plenty to donate to the agencies receiving our quilts. Thank you so much for helping with community service!

Birthday; Nickel and Linda's UFO Challenge Quilts: Sherry Worley donated a quilt for the Birthday and UFO Challenge. Happy Birthday Sherry and thank you for your quilt for community service!

New Project: A new non-profit organization, Cradled In Love, has asked for help preparing baby wraps ("mobies") for low-income families. We have agreed to assist with this project. All that is required is to stitch the edge of the fabric that is provided by CIL. This can be easily done on a serger, or on a sewing machine with a hem or blanket stitch or decorative stitch. The fabric is knit and it is precut to the size needed so a person of any size can wrap the "mobie" around their body and place the baby inside. It is possible that the wraps sewn by our guild will go to the PISD School-Age Parent Program initially. So, if you don't feel you have the time or interest in sewing a guilt top, quilting, or binding, maybe edging a baby wrap will be right up your alley to help with community service.

Sit & Sew: In August we will not meet for Sit & Sew. Many of our volunteers are going to be working to prepare for the quilt show that week. We will hold our meeting the regular second Tuesday in September, (September 9) from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., at the Plano Sewing Center, on the SE corner of Custer and Springcreek. Please let Karen Christoffer (karen.christoffer@tx.rr.com) know if you would like to attend so she can plan a space for you. Bring your sewing machine and supplies. Precut quilt top kits are made for us to sew.

<u>Service Hours:</u> Service hours for the volunteer time is recorded by the guild to satisfy its non-profit status. Any work you do, including travel time, to assist at a guild

function, or work you do from home is considered service hours. Please record this time in the Log at the Community Service table at guild meetings, or email the hours to Julie Schaefer, (juliescha@sbcglogal.net). You can be eligible for guild recognition and for the Presidential Volunteer Award.

It takes many hours and volunteers to accomplish the work of the guild so that it functions smoothly. Please assist as possible to help make the guild a success, meet friendly folks, and have fun!
