
# The President Says ...

### GUILD ACTIVITIES—LINDA NEAL

Thank you to everyone who brought their center squares and first border to share with the guild. We had so many great examples of pieced borders! If you haven't started or added your first border- it's OK! You can start now and catch up. Instructions are on the guild website to get started.

The 2nd border to be added to the Do-It-Yourself Round Robin Mystery is an Embroidered border. I have listed several different ways you might choose to help you make the 2nd border. Remember: the whole border does not have to be embroidered if YOU don't want to. It could be just the corners or whatever works for you.

- 1. Machine embroidery—for those who like to use their machine instead of handwork
- 2. Hand Embroidery—commercial patterns to trace or iron on, then hand stitch
- 3. Copy a poem or phrase that fits your theme (use your computer to try out different fonts/ sizes)
- 4. Use a fabric in your center block and trace parts of it and stitch
- 5. Trace quilting stencils and hand stitch
- 6. Use your decorative stitches on your machineeither 1 row or a combination of rows
- Recycle some embroidered handkerchief's or doilies
- 8. Take Michelle Watts class on Redwork Machine embroidery and learn a new technique

You have 2 months to complete the second border. Have fun, and bring your projects with you to each guild meeting to share!

Last year, we displayed completed projects from our guild workshops as part of our Special Exhibits. These were very popular with our guests and members. Everyone could see examples of the new and fun things we are doing in

quilting. After seeing workshop projects, we even had several show visitors join the guild and sign up for workshops. There were also some members wishing they had signed up for some of those workshops.

To inspire both guests and members, we want to hang completed workshop projects again. If you attended a workshop during the past year, we need your help. Please complete your project and allow us to display it. Specifically, we are looking for projects from:

Orphan Block quilts—MJ Fielek (July)
Native Texan Star—Let's color team (Oct)
Little Goose, Little Goose—Gail Garber (Nov)
Strip Pieced Lone Star—Winnie Fleming (Jan)
Border Bonanza—Winnie Fleming (Jan)
Backyard Birds—Becky Goldsmith (Feb)
Machine Redwork—J. Michelle Watts (Apr)

We would like to hang at least 4 examples from a workshop. The quilts do not need to be completed until quilt turn-in time (Tuesday, August 11<sup>th</sup>), but we will need to have a count of the committed quilts by July 1<sup>st</sup> in order to lay-out the exhibits. Remember, the quilts hung in special exhibits are not judged. They are hung to inspire our guests and to remember the new techniques we have tried, but not necessarily mastered, during the year.

### PROGRAMS—SHERRY WORLEY AND KAYE DUNN

Michelle Watts is our speaker in April. She will present the Lecture, The Beauty of the Southwest, on April 9<sup>th</sup>. We are very fortunate that she will be offering 3 workshops. The workshops begin on Wednesday April 8<sup>th</sup> with Zentangles. The Friday April 10<sup>th</sup> workshop is a combination of stenciling with Paintsticks and redwork machine embroidery. This is a special workshop developed just for the Quilters Guild of Plano. It is an introduction of the two techniques. In this case the triple stitch embroidery will be used as the quilting stitch. You should be able to come close to completing this small project in class. Triple stitch embroidery looks very much like hand embroidery and when used as quilting adds a nice bold element. The Saturday April 11th class is UFO Projects with Michelle. Be it 9 degree circle wedge, triple stitch redwork, or an appliqué project this is an opportunity to catch up. If you are an advanced beginner and have never tried one of Michelle's 9 degree circle wedge patterns this is your chance.

You may either work on an old project or start a new project with Michelle's guidance.

Join us in May for the excitement of the Quilt Show roll out meeting! This is your chance to get involved. You can support the guild by finding the right job for you. Remember that our Quilt Show is the main fund raiser for the guild. If you like the speakers and classes that we offer you need to participate.

A wonderful workshop is offered on May 16<sup>th</sup>. Mendie Cannon of Bestitched will be teaching a Brazilian Embroidery Class. You may remember Mendie from last year's Quilt Show where she was a popular vendor. There is a \$45.00 kit fee for this class. The kit will include everything you need other than scissors, a hoop or stretcher bars, extra lighting and magnification if you need it. This is a special opportunity to learn a beautiful form of embroidery using several different types of threads

### DAY RETREATS—DONNA PETRICK

I've had several people ask me about the day retreats that are held at the Dallas Gamers location here in Plano, southeast corner of Parker and Alma. I've attended a couple that the Dallas guild has held and a couple that I have held. I brought it up to the board and told them I'm willing to head up a couple of day retreats to see if the guild members are interested. This is not to replace the guild retreat we have in February but to add to the fun. Some people can't get away for 4 days in another area, but maybe can spend some time sewing with a group of us in town. You get to leave your sewing supplies in place and go home to sleep in your own bed.

The quilting room will hold 26 people comfortably, plus have room for a cutting table and a couple of regular ironing boards. There is plenty of light, comfortable plastic chairs (but feel free to bring your own) and a six foot table per person. The facility has several other areas to sit and talk, a small kitchen with a microwave and two refrigerators and a restroom area. Snacks and drinks are available for a small cost. There are plenty of restaurants close by, so you can bring your own food or go out with some of the group.

I'm going to see if we can get a 3 day retreat for a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday for later this year. Then I will try to get a Friday, Saturday and Sunday retreat in late 2016. The weekends fill up fast. None are left for 2015. The cost would be approximately \$25/person for the three weekdays and \$35/person for the weekend days. You would have to pay for the

full 3 days because once again, the guild does not underwrite the cost of retreats and the room has to be paid for regardless. Attendance would be on a first paid basis.

I should be able to give you the dates and information at the April guild meeting.

## QUILT PLANO REGISTRATION— LYNNE FRITSCHE

The quilt show is on its way, and we are accepting entries at guild meetings or by mail. The entry form and registration information is available on the website from the Quilt Show tab. Remember that you must submit a color photo with each entry. The photo must be of your actual top (not the pattern), at least 4"x 6", and must be in color so that we can best decide which quilts should hang next to each other. The photo does <u>not</u> have to be an actual photo print on glossy paper—regular printer paper is fine. If you need help getting a photo, you can bring your quilt (or top) to the May or June meeting and we will take photos for you.





### MARCH BOARD MEETING MINUTES—MARTY CROUCH

Dolores Williams called the meeting to order at 6:45 pm. The minutes of the February meeting were approved as written. The treasurer's report will be filed for review. Dolores announced that the Nominating Committee would be appointed in April to allow sufficient time to recommend the board positions that would be open in 2016.

#### Items discussed:

**Education**—Pam Wingate reported that she had attended the Appliqué Academy event and found it to be a good venue to sell tickets, but could be improved if the guilt was displayed at a different time. She will request volunteers for the next event at the Appliqué Academy. The raffle quilt has been entered at the Tyler guilt show. The Junior Quilter class will have a summer camp this year. MJ Fielek made a motion that we set up a scholarship for the Junior Quilter camp. Pam Wingate seconded the motion. The motion was approved. Tina Connolly suggested that we display a sign with the mini-quilt auction to identify that some of the proceeds will be used for this scholarship. The board concurred with the suggestion.

Membership—Donna Petrick reported that our guild is near 200 members. She reported that the guild retreat had been excellent and that the expenses of the retreat had been covered with a surplus of \$159.11. Donna recommended that the surplus be applied to retreat related supplies. The Board concurred. Donna also recommended that we try having a guild day retreat (Monday-Wednesday) at the facility at Parker and Alma. If the day retreat is totally booked, the cost would be \$35 per person. During discussion, recommendations were made that the reservations be paid in advance to ensure that no guild member would have to cover the cost of cancelled reservation. Donna indicated that she would do further research and present the idea to the guild at the April meeting.

<u>**Programs**</u>—Kaye Dunn provided an update on upcoming programs and workshops.

<u>Community Service</u>—Donna Petrick announced that Sandy Buttine and Mickie Warrington had

offered to organize another community service sit and sew day at the Olde Craft Store in Carrollton on the last Saturday of the month. Pam Walsh made a motion that we support this effort. Pam Wingate seconded the motion. The motion passed.

<u>Guild Activities</u>—Linda Neal will present the instructions for the second border of the round robin quilt at the March meeting.

<u>Media</u>—Lynne Fritsche announced that the pages for Guild Activities, Programs, 9-patch and Bees are now available on the new website. The subscription to the old site will expire in mid-April. Any changes should be submitted to Lynne in the next 10 days.

Quilt Show—Pam Walsh reported that the recommendation to purchase quilt hanging supplies from the Dallas guild and to seek larger storage facilities had been approved by the board in an e-mail vote. The additional supplies will require professional movers in March and ongoing at the beginning and end of each show. Pam recommended that we lease a new storage facility located at Avenue K and Legacy. It will cost \$160 per month for a 10 by 30 foot space with an overhead door. The current cost is \$130 per month for a 10 by 10 foot space. We can take possession of the storage facility by the end of the Dallas guilt show. The ongoing expense for movers will need to be added to the budget under the Quilt Show and there will be an overage in this year's budget. Linda Neal made a motion that we approve signing a contract for \$160 per month and that the storage facility be budgeted (as it is currently) under Administrative Expenses. Kaye Dunn seconded the motion. The motion passed. Marty Crouch made a motion that Pam Walsh get three bids from movers and accept the best bid. Donna Petrick seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The meeting adjourned at 7:50 pm.

### MARCH GENERAL MEETING MINUTES—MARTY CROUCH

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Guild President Dolores Williams called the meeting to order at 6:45 pm. The minutes of the February meeting were approved as written. The treasurer's report will be filed for review. Dolores announced that the Nominating Committee would need to begin working in May to replace all but three officers. She requested volunteers and indicated that the committee will be appointed at the April meeting. The July meeting will be held at Plano Centre since the church is not available. Workshops will be held on the meeting day in July.

**TAQG**—Rally Day will be July 11 with appliqué workshops presented by Kathy Dunigan. Lunch tickets, raffle tickets and pins are available for purchase at guild meetings.

**Programs**—Kaye Dunn announced speakers for the coming months. Michelle Watts will present three workshops in April: Zentangles, Paint Stick Stenciling, Redwork Machine Embroidery, and a UFO workshop. The May workshop will be presented by Mendie Cannon on Brazilian embroidery. June, July and September workshops have been developed based on results of the guild survey. MJ Fielek will teach bindings in June. Workshops on machine quilting and 3 methods of machine appliqué will be held on Thursday, July 9 at the Plano Centre. Quilt tops from Community Service will be provided for the machine quilting class. Linda Neal will teach English paper piecing in September.

Quilt Show—Pam Walsh displayed mini-quilts donated this month and announced that some of the proceeds from mini-quilts will be used to underwrite scholarships for Junior Quilters. Emily Armstrong won the door prize for donating a mini-quilt. Pam reminded members that orders could be placed for show t-shirts by contacting Kemberly Wilshire. She also asked for volunteers to take bundles of bookmarks and deliver them to local businesses and guilds. Members volunteered to take bookmarks to Garland, Allen, Greenville and McKinney guilds.

Guild Activities—Members who have completed the first round displayed their quilts. Linda Neal announced instructions and showed samples for the second border of the DIY round robin quilt. The second border should include hand or machine embroidery or decorative stitches. Linda recommended the Michelle Watts red work triple stitch workshop offered in April. Linda will provide full instructions on the website. Members may also use any other type border if they prefer it to embroidery. Debbie Skorepa offered to help any members with hand embroidery.

<u>Community Service</u>—LaDawn Dalley announced that there will be a weekend Sit and Sew Day for community service held on the last Saturday of each month at the Olde Craft Shop in Carrollton.

Since I've written my first article on day retreats, the board has had a chance to meet to discuss having the day retreats. We decided to try it for a couple of times to see if you, the members, are receptive to this sewing time. Kevin, who is the originator of the Dallas Gamers Group, has moved one of the groups using the facility on the second Friday to another day. However, there is still a group that meets there on Friday nights. Hence, the need to leave on Fridays by 4:30 pm.

So currently, we have two times to use the day retreat. First, we are moving the April Friday (10<sup>th</sup>) and Saturday (11<sup>th</sup>) workshops to the Gamers Bldg. This will allow us to have more time to spend with our speaker and not be so rushed to have to leave the building by 2:00 pm. If you are taking the workshop on Friday and/or Saturday, we have special pricing for you. If you take the Friday workshop, you may come back to sew on Saturday and Sunday for a cost of \$25.00 for the two days. If you are taking the Saturday workshop, you may come back to sew on Sunday for \$12.00. If you want to sew Friday and Sunday, but are just taking the Saturday workshop, you will pay \$25.00. Hours for open sew time are 8:00 am to 4:30 pm for Friday, 8:00 am to 9:30 pm on Saturday and 10:00 am to 5:00 pm on Sunday. We have room in the second room for 14 or 15 people who can come sew all three days. The cost for three days will be \$35.00. The main room with the workshops will hold 28 people comfortably. But this room cannot be used by other members until the workshops are over for the day.

The second date we are trying is July 20<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup>, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The price for these three days is \$35.00 per person. You need to pay for the three days, but you may come and go as you wish. We can take a total of 28 people in the main room and 14 or 15 in the secondary room.
