I, as president of TAQG, had to inform the 450 people that our speaker would not be doing her programs. I told them that we had a substitute program. I expected some complaints because some people come from a long distance to hear our speaker. But all I heard was condolences for our original speaker and praise for the great job Sharon was doing. People kept stopping by our table at lunch to thank her for stepping in and saving the day.

I think any group other than quilters would have moaned and groaned about not having the speaker that was advertised. They would have found fault with the speaker we found at the last second. They would have found plenty to complain about—I did not get one complaint.

MEMBERSHIP CHANGE— DOLORES WILLIAMS

We changed standing rule 9 in our by laws to include family membership. There have been a lot of requests to have family memberships. The board voted to make the changes starting with the new membership year beginning in October. One reason to have a non-quilting family member is that they would be able to log their own hours and not have to send them in. Another reason is to encourage children to join and have a feeling of belonging to the guild which may encourage them to do more quilting.

The current rule is:

Membership dues are \$30.00. Dues will be discounted by \$5.00 if paid before January 1. Membership dues for a **new member** joining after April 1 of the current year will be eligible for a prorated \$15.00 membership. A new member is defined as a person that has not previously joined the guild.

The new rule is below, with the additions added in red:

Membership dues are \$30.00. Dues will be discounted by \$5.00 if paid before January 1. Membership dues for a **new member** joining after April 1 of the current year will be eligible for a prorated \$15.00 membership. A new member is defined as a person that has not previously joined the guild. Family membership is \$10 per additional family member. Family members are defined as a second adult in a household, any children under 18 in the household, and all grand-children under 18.

Do It Yourself Round Robin Mystery—Linda Neal

It is time for border #4 to be revealed......you knew it was coming sometime! Appliqué! I can already hear the excitement and the groans!

Your appliqué border can be done in any technique you wish. Machine appliqué, hand appliqué, or for those of you who like to use your embroidery machine: machine embroidery appliqué. As always, you can put as little or as much appliqué on you border as you desire. It's your quilt! Look through your patterns/books or draft an original pattern to get started. Or what about broderie perse?

Broderie Perse is an appliqué technique that has been around since the 1800's. Simply fussy cut a motif out of a fabric that matches your quilt. You can either use a fusible and your machine to sew around it, or you can needle turn the edges without using a fusible. It is a fun and simple way of adding appliqué for those of you who don't like the "A" word.

Please continue to bring your work in progress to guild each month. It is fun to see everyone's progress!


Too BEE OR NOT TO BEE— KATHY HOOK

JULY GENERAL MEETING MINUTES—MARTY CROUCH

Guild President Dolores Williams called the meeting to order at 6:45 p.m. The minutes of the June meeting were approved as written. The treasurer's report will be filed for review. Dolores shared the message on a thank you card from Cynthia Weisz.

<u>Lone Star Awards</u> – Dolores presented Lone Star Awards to Lynne Fritsche, Kaye Dunn and MJ Fielek for their outstanding work as board members.

Bylaws – Dolores announced that the February 13, 2014 change to the Standing Rules regarding dues had been updated on the website and that the Board had voted to recommend a further update of Rule 9 to offer family memberships at a discounted price of \$10 for each spouse, child or grandchild of a guild member. The specific language of the change will be posted in the newsletter and a vote of the guild will be scheduled in the future.

New Logo – Dolores displayed the new logo that was adopted by the Board.

Meeting Location – Dolores announced that Parkway Hills Baptist Church will change its policy on meeting times, requiring the guild to vacate the building by 8:30 p.m. Dolores shared that our options included starting the meeting at 6:15 p.m, shortening the meeting, or finding a new location and perhaps changing the meeting date. Sherry Worley led a discussion about our needs and potential meeting places. Sherry asked guild members to assist by contacting their churches to determine willingness to host our meetings.

Dolores recognized members of the Denton Quilt Guild who were displaying their raffle guilt.

<u>Programs</u> – Kaye Dunn announced speakers for the coming months. Members need to sign up for the September English paper piecing class to be taught by Linda Neal by August 7. Kaye emphasized that registration for October and November classes received by August 26 would qualify for the current price and that registrations received after that date would be subject to the price increase.

Membership – Donna Petrick recognized the 64 members in attendance and awarded 10 door prizes. She also announced that a service award would be presented to John Worley.

<u>Guild Activities</u> – Donna Petrick announced that the fourth border of the round robin quilt is any type of appliqué.

<u>Community Service</u> – Sherry Worley announced that our inventory of quilt tops includes 19 large quilts and 294 small quilts. She encouraged members to help by taking quilt tops for quilting.

<u>Mini-quilts</u> – Tina Connolly displayed mini-quilts and awarded the door prize to Cindy Walker.

Quilt Show – Pam Walsh announced that there is a critical need for volunteers to take admissions on Saturday morning. She asked members to spread the word that the scissor sharpener will be at the show and attendees would need to bring their scissors, knives and rotary blades for sharpening. Pam awarded the door prizes for show volunteers to Marty Crouch and Lisa Ownby.

<u>Show and Tell</u> – Ileana Salzer displayed two completed projects.

The meeting adjourned at 7:30 p.m.
