UPCOMING PROGRAMS—PEGGY BURRELL, DENA SMITH & LISA OWNBY



Our speaker for June is Grace Errea. A fiber artist, designer, quilter, and author, Grace J. Errea, began quilting in 2000.

Her art focuses on the depiction of inspiring scenes in a *value based* contemporary-realistic manner. She feels very fortunate to have many of her first quilts become exhibited in juried shows and be recognized for their innovation in technique and depiction of nature and people.

Grace designs quilt patterns for *Hoffman of California Fabrics* in Mission Viejo, CA. Her patterns can be found in prestigious catalogs such as *Keepsake Quilting, Nancy's Notions, and Hancock of Paducah*. She is the author of the C&T book entitled: *Impressionist Appliqué and Exploring Value and Design to Create Artistic Quilts.*

She will give a lecture on **The Value of "Value"** at our meeting. There will be two workshops with Grace—**Cut Away Appliqué** workshop on June 10 and on June 11 **Creative Threadwork—Drawing and Painting with Thread**. For July we have MJ Fielek with her **Bucket List Quilts** presentation at the meeting and also on July 14 (before the meeting) her Workshop on **Orphan Block and Leftovers Quilts**.

Membership Name Badges

Presented to you by The Best Fabric Friends Quilt Bee Group Pattern & Instructions by Jane Schwarz

Supplies:

1/4 yard Rip Stop Nylon or the fabric of your choice, we used black

1/4 yard Craftex, or vinyl or any other fabric that you want to use to display your name, we used a camel color

1/4 yard Heavy Interfacing, I do not recommend fusing this, just sew it in

1/4 yard Medium to Heavy Clear Vinyl

1 pkg 1" wide Twill Tape in the color of your choice, or 1" wide Bias Tape (finishes the edges of the vinyl)

1 pkg 3/4" wide Twill Tape in the color, or 3/4" wide Bias Tape (finishes the edges of the badges)

2 3/4" D rings

2 clips to attach your strap to the badge holder

1 7" zipper, we used the Fashion Zippers that have a nice, lace edge

1 Bumble Bee Charm in a natural Brass, we used Vintaj, these can be ordered online

1 Jump Ring, for attaching the Bumble Bee Charm

Cut 4 pieces of Rip Stop 6" X 9" (front, back and interior Badge holder)

Cut 1 piece of Rip Stop 6" X 4" (pen or pencil pocket)

Cut 2 pieces of Heavy Interfacing 6" X 9" (adds body to the Badge Holder)


Cut 1 piece of clear vinyl 6" X 8" (front pocket)

Cut 1 piece of clear vinyl 6" X 4" (back pocket)

Front of Badge:

Sew 2 pieces of Rip Stop together with 1 piece of the interfacing sandwiched in between the two layers using a 1/8" seam. I stitched all 4 edges separately. The sides were stitched top to bottom, then the bottom edge from side to side and then the top edge from side to side. By stitching each edge individually, the fabric tends to stay flat better.

Sew Twill tape across one 6" edge of the 6" X 8" clear vinyl piece, this is now the top of your clear vinyl pocket. Using tissue paper between the vinyl and the sewing machine, sew the 6" X 8" piece of clear vinyl to the front part of the badge using a 1/8" seam. Match the bottom of the clear vinyl edge with the rip stop fabric, the clear vinyl should be about 1" shorter than the rip stop at the top edge. This completes the front of the badge.

Back of Badge:

Sew 2 pieces of Rip Stop together with 1 piece of the interfacing sandwiched in between two layers of Rip Stop using a 1/8" seam

Sew a strip of Twill tape across one 6" edge of the 6" X 4" clear vinyl piece, this becomes the top of your clear vinyl pocket that will hold your membership card(s).

Take the 6" X 4" piece of rip stop and fold in half so that it is 6" tall by 2" wide. Draw a line down the middle of the fold. Open this out and sew to the clear vinyl. Stitch a second time 1/8" closer to the side of the vinyl

Sew the pocket to the bottom of the back rip stop section, this forms a clear vinyl pocket and a pocket for a pen or pencil. Stitch both sides of the pen/pencil pocket.

Finish the top edges of the rip stop, I just folded a piece of 3/4" twill tape around the top edge so that it's finished nicely on the inside. Open the two pieces flat, if you are using a lace-edged zipper, the pieces should be face up. Attach the zipper to the top edge. The zipper will be longer than the width of the badge holder, be sure to leave enough of the zipper to tuck into the twill tape that will go around the outside and finish the edges.

Using tissue paper as necessary, bind the edges of the badge holder, finishing the top edges nicely. Attach the D rings through the twill tape.

Create your strap, attach the clips and attach to your badge holder. Using the jump ring, attach your Bumble Bee charm to the zipper pull.

Create an interior insert for the front of your badge holder. It is designed so that you may have as many different inserts as you wish to make. Our group machine embroidered inserts on Craftex, this is the same material that Levi uses to create the labels on their jeans. You could also piece an insert, or anything you wish. It is your badge holder!

MAY GENERAL MEETING MINUTES—PAM CARROLL

General Meeting—May 12, 2016

President Pam Wingate called the meeting to order at 6:45PM. She asked if there were any changes to the minutes. There were none; they were approved as submitted. She asked if there were any changes to the financial report. There were none; it was approved as submitted.

Committee reports were as follows:

LaDawn Dalley reported that the Carrolton community service sew day for this month is May 21 from 10-2 at The Old Craft Store. In June it will be on the 25th, and August will be on the 27th. Contact Sandy Buttine for more info. There will be stocking kits available soon. LaDawn has six afghans and three quilts for the rape crisis center. Donations will be delivered for the PISD program graduation party on the 18th.

We have a lot of finished quilt tops. Since October we have donated 88 finished quilts. Monica Hendewerk reported there will be a Day Retreat at the Game Center in September to quilt as many as possible. The goal is to finish fifty. Date to be determined.

Donna Petrick said that the Dallas Guild was present with their raffle quilt and that they had tickets for sale. She also announced that there will be a Day Retreat in June on the Friday, Saturday and Sunday of the second weekend.

Peggy Burrell said this Friday's workshop had been cancelled, but there were openings for the Saturday one. She gave information on upcoming workshops.

Aggie Meszaros reported she had turned in 55 donated cuddle quilts to Children's Hospital, but we need more volunteers to make them.

Pat Wiant announced TAQG Rally Day is July 9, and Kimberly Einmo is the speaker. Pam Wingate showed her quilt made from one of Kimberly's patterns.

Jeanne Smith talked about Special Exhibits at the show. She requested anyone who has made a quilt for a workshop, a Round Robin Challenge, or an Art Quilters of Plano project enter them in Special Exhibits. The forms must be in by June 9 and the items turned in the Tuesday before the show.

Mary Shannon said we had seventy-five members, three guests, and one new member in attendance.

Valerie Salter thanked everyone for the mini-quilts turned in and showed them.

Pam Wingate said we are required to select a nominating committee at the May meeting. Those who volunteer for the committee cannot take a board position. Monica Hendewerk, Ginny Cherry, MJ Fielek, Mary Skoritowski, and Denise Green volunteered. Jeanne Vogel and Karen Bethel will be alternates.

The President adjourned the meeting at 7:30PM and introduced our Show Chair, Rose Davis, who did the roll-out for the Quilt Plano Show August 12 -13, 2016. She announced we will have over 300 guilts displayed and urged everyone to participate. She reviewed the schedule for the week of the show and discussed the need for members to sign up as the entire show is done by volunteers. Preview night is Thursday, August 11, and only members and their immediate family will be admitted. The show will include a Children's Project Room, a Project Linus room, a mini-auction and several demos done by members. She urged all to do minis as this is a big fundraiser. The biggest source of funds is the raffle guilt, and each member is asked to sell tickets

Show shirts are available to order. Lunch tickets are available and must be prepaid. Pam Wingate said there will be a wrap-up party after the show and anyone who does twenty or more volunteer hours can attend. Date and place to be announced later.

Rose Davis then announced that Kena Leszcynski will be the new VP-Education. Kena discussed the demos that will be offered at the Show and introduced Pam Wingate, Rose-Clair Fletcher, and Monica Hendewerk who then gave their demonstrations for the guild.

APRIL BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES—PAM CARROLL

President:

Pam Wingate called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

Those present were Pam Wingate, LaDawn Dalley, Dena Smith, Donna Petrick, Lynne Fritsche, Rose Davis, Pam Carroll, Peggy Burrell, Jane Schwarz, Lisa Ownby and Tina Connolly.

The minutes and treasurer's report were approved without changes.

Pam Wingate said our Guild's 35th anniversary is coming up in 2017, and we will need to get volunteers to make a quilt to commemorate it. It was decided that some of the previous anniversary quilts will be brought to a meeting so the members can see them.

Membership:

Jane Schwarz said that she will assume this position in October.

Programs:

Donna Petrick said that the TAQG database now shows what speakers are available.

Dena Smith said that if we have a speaker who provides two half-day workshops, she will only charge half the price of a full day workshop for *one* half-day workshop. Two half-day workshops will be the price of a full day workshop.

Community Service:

LaDawn Dalley reported that donations are needed for the PISD graduation program in May. Many Christmas stockings were made at the day retreat in April.

Guild Activities:

Donna Petrick asked the board to approve a quilting day at the Game Center to work on quilting the prepared community service tops. The cost would be \$150. It was approved.

Quilt Show:

Rose Davis talked about the Face Book page for the show. Tee shirts are now on sale for \$13 with an additional cost of \$10 to add the bling. Volunteers will have to work four hours in order to get into the show free. Rose said she will need a shadow next year to be able to take over as show chair in 2018. Lunch tickets for the show will be available at the meeting in May at \$7 each paid in advance.

Pam Wingate discussed plans for a wrap-up party after the show. Invitations will be to the Show Committee, the Board of Directors and high-hour volunteers (hours to be determined).

Other business:

No other business was brought forward.

The president adjourned the meeting at 8:10PM.
