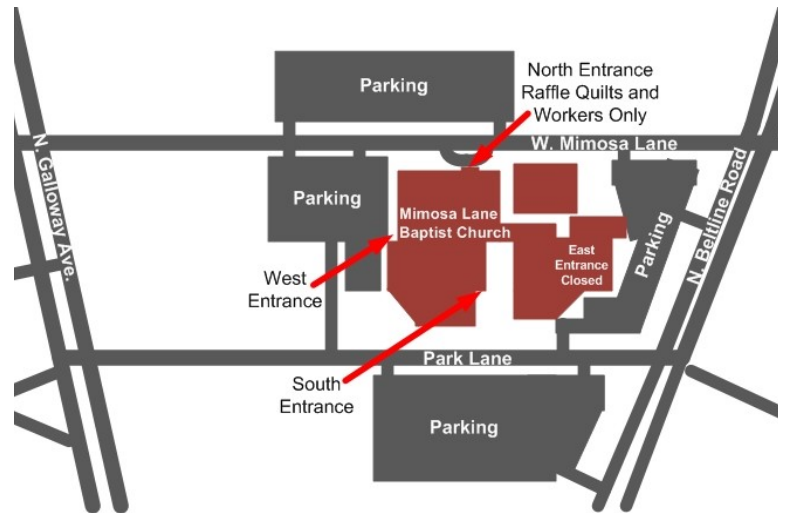
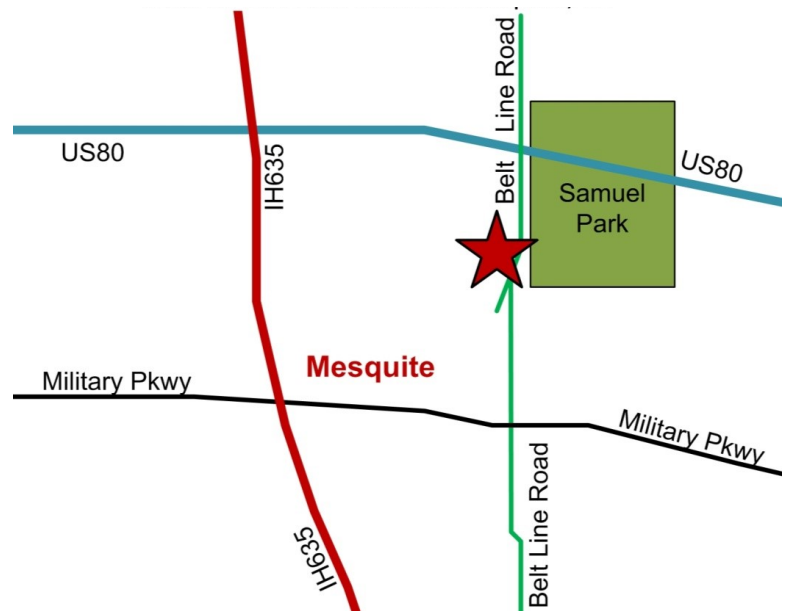

 Plano Centre -- Bucket List Quilts

MJ Fielek has been sewing since she was quite young. She taught sewing and tailoring at Eastfield College and "Sewing with Knits" at Richardson High School. Her love turned to quilting in 1979 when she drafted and made her first quilt. Over the years MJ has made hundreds of quilts. She entered and was accepted in the Houston IQA show and won 2nd place in the 2-person category. She has even traveled to Europe to the International Quilt Expo and taken classes from many European teachers. Her whole house is one big quilting studio!

MJ teaches several classes for Happiness Is...Quilting! She encourages students to take their skill to the next level, teaching intermediate to advanced construction classes. Her motto: "I am your Bucket List Instructor."

**Orphan Blocks**

This class will help you clean your stash of all the leftover blocks, half-square triangles, four-patches, and all the unfinished projects from classes you've taken. You can use embroidered linens, old blocks, etc. You will work with value, not color. This is a good quilt to use all those fabrics that you do not like the color. Points don't matter; if a block does not fit, add a strip or just cut it down in size. When the quilt is finished, quilted and bound, you will then dye it to a color of your choice.



**Leftovers**

For this quilt we use only strips, squares, or small units that you have cut for other quilts. We just sew all strip sizes together in a unit and slash into sections at angles and add a small strip of color or black and white. This is designed to use all the strips that we cut after each project intending to make a quilt out of them. This is a great quilt with some strips of novelty fabrics that we buy and never use. Black and white calms the other colors, brings the whole together, and makes a quilt that has a modern feel.

## Quilting Tips & Tuts #8 – Quick Piecing Flying Geese

*Oh those Geese!*

This is the eighth of our Quilting Tips & Tuts! It has also been posted on the Plano Quilters Guild Website under 'How To' on the Resources Tab for easy referral.

This is a favorite quick piecing method that yields 4 Flying Geese blocks with no waste! In quilting terms, the 'geese' are the large, centered triangles in the unit. The outer triangles are called the 'sky'.

Now, for the math. Yes ladies, we use math all the time in quilting. Typically Flying Geese blocks are twice as wide as they are tall. But the formula is simple:

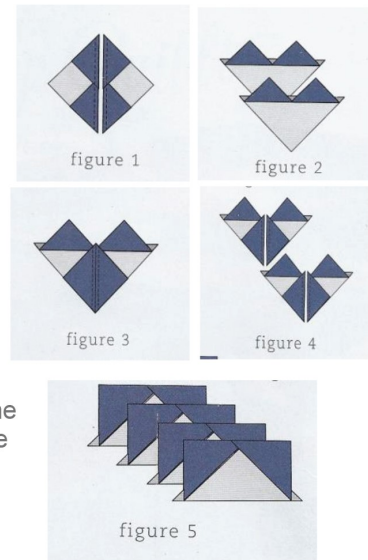
**Sky Fabric:** Cut 4 squares equal to the **finished height** of the flying geese **plus 7/8"**  
**Goose Fabric:** Cut 1 square equal to the **finished width** of the flying geese **plus 1-1/4"**.

Always press towards the 'sky' fabric.

- Start with the light fabric. Determine what size you want your finished flying geese unit and add  $1 \frac{1}{4}$ ". We are making a  $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " finished flying geese unit.  $4 \frac{1}{2} + 1 \frac{1}{4} = 5 \frac{3}{4}$ " square of the light fabric. Cut one of these to yield 4 flying geese units.
- Now the dark fabric. Determine the finished height of your flying geese unit and add  $\frac{7}{8}$ ". Our finished height is  $2 \frac{1}{4}$ ", so  $2 \frac{1}{4} + \frac{7}{8} = 3 \frac{1}{8}$ " squares. Cut four of these to yield four flying geese units.

**Hint:** Before cutting out all the fabric and pieces that you have determined you will need, start by making up one set of 4 flying geese to be sure the size is what you're wanting.

- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 2 sky squares  $3 \frac{1}{8}$ " x  $3 \frac{1}{8}$ ". Place 1 square on a  $5 \frac{3}{4}$ " piece of geese fabric, right sides together. Place the second sky square in the opposite corner as shown. Align the raw edges in the corners. The tips of the squares will overlap in the center. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the drawn line on both sides of the line. Cut on the marked line. **(figure 1)**
- Press the sky away from the geese. **(figure 2)** You now have 2 partial units.
- Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the remaining 2 sky squares. Working with 1 partial unit at a time, place 1 square with the drawn line perpendicular to the sewn seam, right sides together. Align the raw edges in the corner. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the drawn line on both sides of the line. **(figure 3)**
- Cut along the drawn line. **(figure 4)**
- Press the sky away from the geese.
- Repeat with the second partial unit. Voila, 4 Flying Geese! **(figure 5)**



## JUNE GENERAL MEETING MINUTES—MARTY CROUCH

### GENERAL MEETING MINUTES – June 9, 2016

Guild President Pam Wingate called the meeting to order at 6:45 pm. Pam asked if there were any changes to the minutes of the March meeting or the Treasurer's report. Since there were no changes, the minutes were approved as written and the Treasurer's report was approved as published.

Pam thanked members for volunteering to work at the Quilt Show and advised us that there was still a need for more volunteers. Pam also asked for a volunteer to do the newsletter.

Community Service - LaDawn Dalley announced that quilts had been delivered to our sponsored charities and that kits for Christmas stockings were available. She reminded members of the community service work days held on the second Tuesday of the month in Plano and the fourth Saturday of the month in Carrollton. Aggie Meszaros announced that 35 cuddle quilts were delivered this month.

Nine patches - Debbie Seher reminded members that nine patch blocks are collected to be sent to former members when they move away.

Retreats - Donna Petrick informed members that payments for the February retreat should be submitted to her. Donna also reminded members that a Day Retreat will be held in June at the Dallas Games Marathon in Plano.

Guild Activities - Donna Petrick announced a Mug Rug challenge. Members who wish to participate should make a mug rug approximately 4 inches by 8 inches in one of three categories: Hot Drink, Cold Drink or Adult Drink. The rugs and a drink container should be placed in a bag to be exchanged at our September guild meeting. The total price limit of the challenge is \$20.

Quilt Show - Rose Davis announced that the deadline to submit quilt entries would be extended for one week. She reminded us that members must volunteer at least 4 hours to receive free admission to the quilt show. Mary Jo Ferril and Dee Ann McFarlin won the door prizes for volunteering.


TAQG - Sherry Worley reminded us that Rally Day will be July 9 and this was the last opportunity to purchase lunch tickets and raffle tickets.

Beekeeper - Martha Diehl asked that members to contact her or Monica Hendewerk if they are interested in joining a small group.

Membership - Mary Shannon announced that 86 members and guests were in attendance. She awarded door prizes.

Mini-Quilts - Valerie Salter and Kaye Dunn displayed mini-quilts that were donated this month.

Show and Tell - 5 members displayed completed projects to inspire us.

## JUNE BOARD MEETING MINUTES—LADAWN DALLEY

### Board meeting June 6, 2016

In attendance: Jane Schwarz, Donna Petrick, Dena Smith, Carrol Long, Pam Wingate, Rose Davis, LaDawn Dalley, Lynne Fritsche, Sherry Worley, Mary Shannon, Lisa Ownby, Tina Connolly

Meeting called to order at 6:29 pm.  
Minutes from the previous meeting were approved

Treasurer's Report: Carol will get the audit done this month.

Membership: Mary reported that new member "goody bags " are ready to be handed out to anyone that joins the guild at the show. There was some discussion as to ideas of what things could be added to the bags.

Programs: Dena reminded us that the July meeting would be held at the Plano Center, with MJ Fielek doing a workshop earlier in the day. There was some discussion for ideas for next year's summer programs.

Community Service had nothing new to report.

Guild Activities: Donna discussed the need to reserve next year's dates with the Game Center. She reported that the Game Center has lost their lease and is looking for a new location, so some of the dates may depend on where they end up locating. However, since there is no penalty for canceling, it is still worth our while to reserve.

Donna also introduced an idea for a September activity, and it was approved. We will be making and exchanging "mug rugs" and gift bags, white elephant style.

Media had nothing new to report.

Quilt Show: Rose reported back the results of the investigation into whether we need to be paying taxes on our Raffle quilts. And, yes, we should. We can either let the winner know that they must pay the taxes, or we, as a guild can pay. It was decided that, at least for this year, the guild will go ahead and pre-pay the taxes. Donna Petrick

made a motion to approve this decision, Jane seconded the motion, and it was approved unanimously.

Quilt Show Wrap Party: Pam suggested Macaroni Grill as a location for the wrap party with appetizers paid for by the guild. It would be held in September and would be open to all those that put in more than 20 hours on the show.
