
Method 1:




The first method requires that you have set Adobe View menu to Show/Hide the Tool Pane. Just click on the <-> (minus) icon to resize it.



Method 2:




The second method requires that you use the Adobe **View** menu to **Zoom** to **Fit Height**.



Quilt Plano 2016

This will be my last pre-show article. Everything is in place to have a great Quilt Plano 2016, but there is still a lot to do before the doors open on August 12th!

For those of you at our July meeting, you heard that we are changing how our volunteers enter the show. We are asking that all our volunteers park on the west side of Plano Centre. Instead of entering the west entrance, please go in front of the building (there is a covered walkway), continue past the north entrance and turn right into the center's courtyard. You then can enter into the east door of the Hospitality Room. If you have someone driving you to the center, there is a drop-off area at the center north entrance. Signs will point the right direction.



When you enter the Hospitality Room, you can check your carry-ins, sign-in and be ready to work. If there is anyone that has not already signed up for a specific area, there will be a dryerase board located in that area with a list of needed tasks.

PLEASE NOTE THIS DOES NOT APPLY TO QUILT TURN-IN ON TUESDAY, AUG. 9TH. As in previous years, both volunteers and

individuals dropping off their quilts, will park and enter on the <u>east side of the Centre</u>. Tables will be set up at that entrance so you have easy access for drop off.

For those of you who are interested in having your quilts appraised during the show, Valerie Salter will be there to help you through that process.

There is one more change that we are going to try this year regarding our "Member's Choice" award. In the past we have voted and awarded that ribbon on Preview Night (Thursday), however attendance at Preview Night doesn't necessarily represent the entire guild. All members attending Preview Night will still have an opportunity to vote on their favorite quilt, however we will not close the voting until noon on Saturday. All member volunteers entering on both Friday and Saturday will be able to pick-up a Member's Choice ballot and turn them in before they leave. PLEASE, ONE VOTE PER MEMBER ONLY! As everything this will be done on an honor basis.

Here is a to-do list for every member:

- 1. Raffle Quilt: turn in your ticket stubs and payments for tickets you picked up at previous meetings. You still have time to purchase tickets at the show drawing will be held at the Plano Centre at 3:30 on Saturday.
- 2. If you have signed up to work at the show, please make sure you arrive on time and wear your show shirt if you have one.
- 3. If you have forgotten what time you signed up to work, the entire volunteer sign-up sheet will be posted on our website.
- Make sure you bring your purchased lunch tickets remember there are no returns or exchanges on Show Days.

On Friday September 9, she will teach a workshop on "Silk-Screening the Easy Way" as described on her website: "I love painting, but found a great way to transfer imagery that is amazing. I wil demo how to make your own screens".

Come One, Come All......Community Service – Quilt for Others Tuesday, September 20th, 9 am – 5 pm

There are two Community Sew groups that, together, generate over 20 completed quilt tops a month. We now have over 350 quilt tops that need to be made into finished quilts. The BFFs (Best Fabric Friends) small group has organized a day to help whittle that number down by a significant amount. **AND WE NEED YOUR HELP.**

We are looking for volunteers for the following activities:

(1) Quilting: Sew quilt sandwiches (the top, batting, and backing will already be basted, sewers just need to sew!). Use your walking foot or free motion foot. All of the quilts are crib-size to child lap-size. Nothing larger. Very easy to quilt on a domestic home machine.

- (2) <u>Spray Basting:</u> Backing and batting will be cut and matched to quilt tops ahead of time. Basters will work INSIDE with non-toxic spray. If you've never "Spray Spritzed" a quilt or want to learn a new wonderful, inexpensive way to do it, now's your chance!
- (3) Other: Pick where you'd like to help "I'll do anything", ironing, trimming to prepare for binding, binding, help with set-up (8 a.m. 9 a.m.) or clean-up (5 p.m. 6 p.m.)

Memories by John Worley

The other night, I went to do a few chores. After picking some green beans, squash, zucchini, and pulling a few potatoes for supper, I check on the peppers, tomatoes, cantaloupe, and

blackberries. I harvest some oregano and rosemary, as Sherry instructed. It's getting late; I tell the bees to fly home, but they don't listen.



I take some seed to the birdfeeder. Where have the blue jays gone? They haven't been around lately.

The wild rabbits don't even hop away anymore. (Did I say wild?)

I go to the carport to feed the butterflies. (What do I feed butterflies? Purina Butterfly Chow? No.) In addition to lots of native perennials and lantana

and catnip, they seem to like banana peel. I like my butterflies. They must like me; they swarm over me and about a dozen land on my chest and arms. (Maybe it's the butterfly chow?)

I decide to walk down the hill to the back of my property to check on the beaver pond. I wonder if the dam is still holding up. The only part of tonight's supper that I didn't grow is the beef. And it was Angus, raised on my father-in-law's place. (Ol' #93. Boy has he been a good one!) After supper I put on Maynard Ferguson and Clifford Brown CDs while I finish reading Rocket Boys and Sherry works on another quilt.

Finally to bed, but first I must feed the dog and cat. (They raise such a fuss when I forget!) Good night all.
