October – Lynn Roddy Brown

At our October meeting we will welcome Lynn Roddy Brown. Lynn will present a lecture “Scrap Quilts: An Acquired Taste” which will include approximately 20 quilts.

Lynn Roddy Brown is a sixth generation Texan who has always loved to sew. In the early 1970s, she began tearing pictures of quilts from magazines and did some patchwork with templates, but it was not until 1989 when she lived in Rochester, New York, that she began to quilt seriously.

For the past nine years, she has been a member of a bee that trades blocks for scrap quilts. She loves scrap quilts because it gives her the opportunity to use many different fabrics. She has had three of her quilts hung in the IQA juried show in Houston, two of which were scrap quilts.

There will be 2 workshops offered. Friday, October 14th, will be Texas Two-Step. The class will cover scrap quilt theory, designing on a wall and precise piecing. Because the Texas Two-Step block has a diagonal line there will be many setting options. Saturday, October 15th, will be Triangles: Endless Possibilities. Lynn will cover scrap quilt theory, designing on a wall and her method for precise piecing of half-square triangle, quarter-square triangle and three-in-a-square triangle units. Students will use the triangle units created in class to make five different blocks suitable for use in scrap quilts.

November – Lori Lee Triplett, The Poos Collection

At our November Guild Meeting - Thursday, November 10th, we will welcome Lori Lee Triplett. The topic will be “The Poos Collection - Celebrating the Blues: Africa to America”.

There will be one workshop on November 11th. It will cover Adire: African Indigo Resist Scarves where you will learn 4 different resist dyeing techniques, create your own dye samples and leave with 2 dyed scarves.

Also 6 little crocheted blankets. That is usually what I get over a three or four month period, not in one evening! Thank you, thank you, thank you!

I am really excited about our upcoming sew day also. Probably by the time you read this, it will be over and I will have a lot more quilts to deliver!

Please keep working! These organizations can always use more. Children are often removed from their homes with nothing but what they are wearing. A quilt added to the toiletry items they are given may help them feel a little less frightened. A sexual abuse victim has everything she or he is wearing taken from them at the hospital. A quilt wrapped around the sterile hospital gown may help her or him feel a little better. And even though you may never get to see the effects of your work, there is no better feeling than that of knowing you have done something to help another human being. When I was young and feeling sorry for myself, my mother always told me to find some service I could do for someone else. It's the best antidote for "the blues" that there is!

If you want to help but are unsure how, please give me a call, text, or email. I will help you find the perfect fit. Or, you can go to one of our community sew groups. We have two; one meets one Tuesday a month at the Plano Sewing Center, and the other meets one Saturday a month at Not Your Mama's Quilt Shop. Check the website for details.

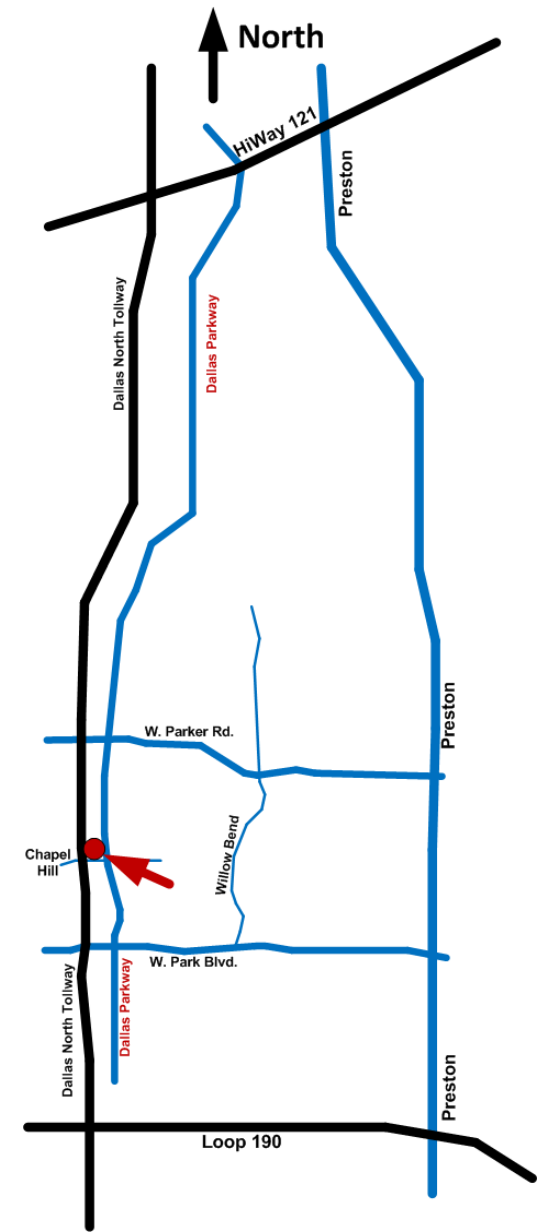
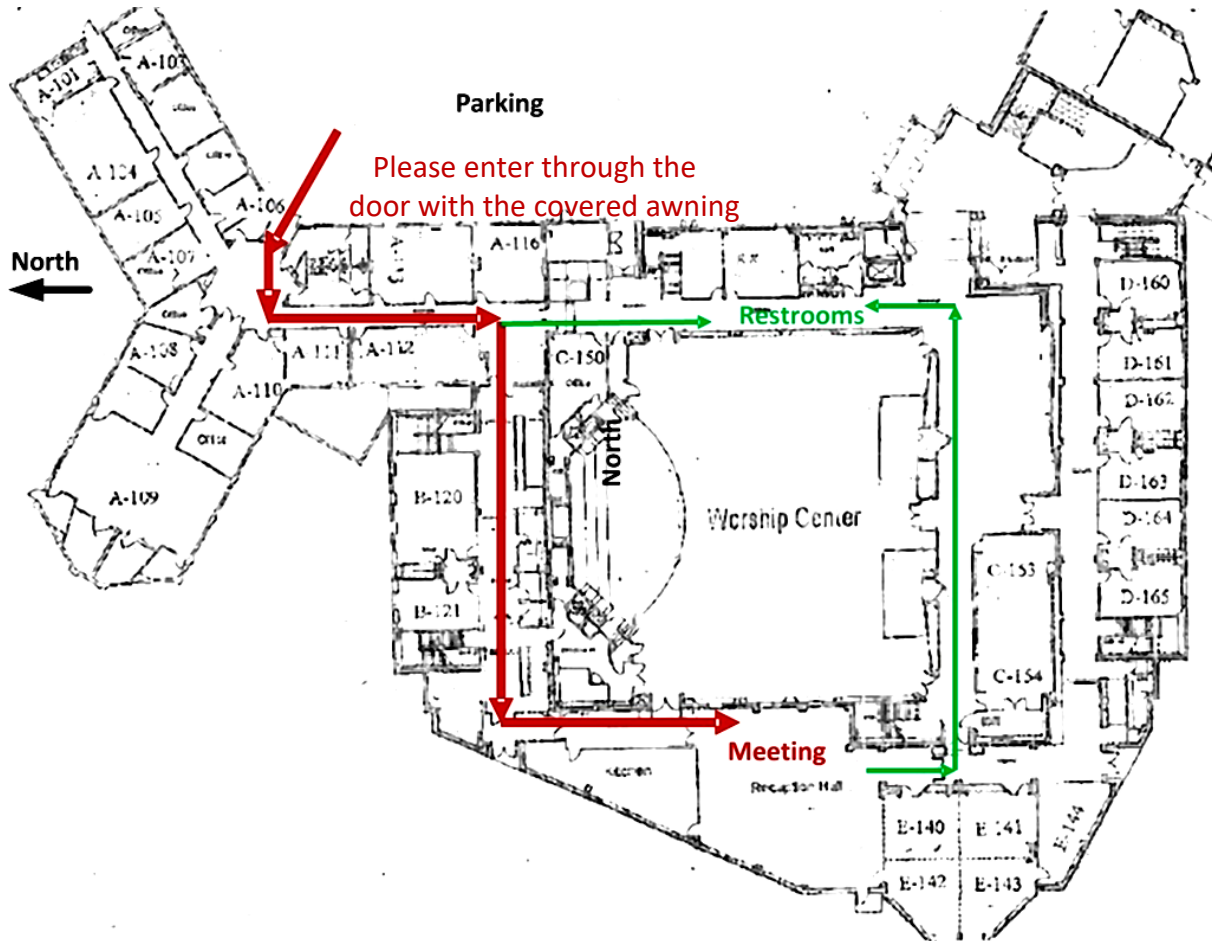

In Attendance: 73 members welcomed 6 guests

Pam Wingate called meeting to order @ 7pm.

Minutes - approved & accept as written.

Treasure report - approved & accept as written.

Hours for quilt show need to be turned in ASAP to avoid missing the wrap up party.

A request was made by Pam for a small group to take over the 35th anniversary quilt. Please contact Pam if your group is interested.

Junior Quilters is looking for help with teaching. If you would like to volunteer, please contact Pam Wingate. We are looking for quilters, &/or aspiring quilters age 8-12. Sign up forms for the upcoming sessions are available at the meeting and online.

New slate of officers - hopeful members were looking to take over spots for Secretary, backup Secretary, VP of Media, VP of membership (2 members requested), Treasurer, & VP of guild activities. Rather than taking paper ballots, Aurora Chancy made a motion to vote with a show of hands for the new board members. Carol Thune seconded the motion - approved. The vote was had and all members are approved.

Quilt show - Several items were found during the show. Please contact Pam Wingate if you are missing anything lost at the show.

Show raised over \$22k and they are currently looking for 2017 chair positions for raffle quilt, volunteer organization, and co-chair of 2017.

Raffle Quilt raised over \$4k in sales and the 2017 quilt will be unveiled first at the wrap up party, then at the October QPG meeting.

Co-Chair position will help Rose in 2017, and then take over show with their own co-chair in 2018. It is a 2 year commitment, but you will never have all responsibility as there will be help in a co-chair position.

Plano Centre is having renovations done, so contracts are delayed. A cost increase is expected for 2017 due to the renovations.

Mini quilt auctions - 38 members donated 75 quilts to the show for a total raised \$3782. 4 quilts sold for \$100 each and 2 drawings were done for a prize. Chris Cessnun won a \$200 quilting credit from Richard Larson. Kaye Dunn won a tin of quilting accessories.

Community Service - Stockings are due in October. 16 quilts, 12 receiving, & 29 taggies were donated by members this month. Carrollton community service is switching to Not Your Mama's Quilt Shop in Plano, starting 9/24, from 10-2pm

Cuddle quilts - 44 cuddle quilts were donated this month to Plano Children's Hospital. At the meeting, 34 cuddle quilts were made by Jeanne Vogel. 25 were turned in by Sew n Sew. 4 cuddle quilts were given by a new member, Alma Cone. A cuddle quilt is 2 fat quarters sewn together with a request for kid style fabrics. A fat quarter is 18"x22"

Community Service Quilt Top Project – Monica Hendewerk is hosting a day for quilting unfinished donated tops Sept 20th with 8-9am arrival to help with setup. Anyone that would like to sew or quilt is asked to arrive between 9-5 at Dallas Games Marathon located at the corner of Parker & Alma. TX Wednesday Girls make kits, so you can sew them together during the event. It's completely FREE to attend this gathering.

Membership - 20 new members joined at the show - 3 were family members. Renewals for the upcoming year have started for only \$25 a member. Please bring a check or cash to the meeting or mail your renewal fees to the club address.

VP of Guild Activities - spots are still available for the February Retreat. The club thanked outgoing VP of Activities, Donna Petrick, for her continued service for our guild.

6:39pm - meeting called to order.

No changes to minutes, accept as written. No changes to treasurer's report, accept as written.

Pam Wingate asked if we should ask small groups to do the anniversary quilt. Design should have something to do with guild + have anniversary year featured. Anniversary quilt will be brought up at meeting and ask for volunteers from small group.

Voting for the turnover of board will be done @ Sept meeting. Next board meeting is Sept 26th, 5:30dinner/6:30 meeting start. September will be used for explaining process of duties and making sure everything is turned over to the new board - email will be sent to all current board members. New board will run October meeting.

First secretary position is vacant. Nominating committee will be contacted to find someone to take the spot. Lizzie Bailey said she will take the first if no one is willing to take first position. Pam will contact committee.

Treasurer's Report: Needs budgets in as early in October as possible. Guideline reports will be given during transition meeting in October.

Membership: Jane reported 19 new members, 3 of whom were family members, plus 5 returning members. Awards were brought up and it was decided it would now fall under membership.

John Worley asked what committee handles door prizes. That committee reports to Membership. It was requested door prize lists be given to newsletter for better promotion. There is a checklist of vendors to make things easier for door prizes.

Programs/workshops: All workshop classes are assigned for 2017. No workshop in July due to TAGQ. A community service project will take its place for members. Sept is not full, so an email will be sent in promotion.

Community service: Project Linus acquired a huge stash of fabric. Donna was able to get 24 4 yard pieces for backs. Long arm quilters are asking for more backs, so we will use stash to help accommodate them. John Worley asked for dates of all community service projects and where meetings are

held. There are 2 community service days and an article will be written featuring them as well as their projects for the newsletter.

Quilting Sisters of Color are requesting quilt stands for their upcoming show. Several have been volunteered and members will be asked at the meeting for the stands.

Education: Kena has many new ideas for education. Jr. Quilter's block of the month will bring a sign up sheet to the Sept meeting. Traditional quilts featured with the same blocks only variant in fabrics. It will make learning easier for the kids attending, plus put together a lot faster. Bento box is very popular with kids and will be explored.

Copies of feedback sheets from the show will be sent to demo teachers in the coming month once it's sorted.

Guild activities: Mug rug challenge completes at the September meeting.

Media: Testing will be done on the guild website all week, so expect a few errors here or there.

Quilt Show: Rockin Bobbin's suite # was wrong in the show program, so a free ad will be given in the newsletter. Wrap up party is Sept 24th and hours must be entered Sept 10th to be eligible for an invite. Mini quilt time spent creating qualifies for hours. Computers will be brought to Sept meeting to help members enter show hours.

John Worley is working on a new way to hang show quilts and will submit for approval. New ways to hang placement ribbons and do not touch signs were discussed, but not finalized. Will be discussed at a future meeting.

TAQG: Plano QG info was dropped temporarily due to website issues, but Sherry is working on it. The 27th is a meeting on membership and Jane Schwarz will attend. 11/15 is a meeting for potential workshop teachers, so Dena will attend to find more workshop teachers.
