

Please join us at our November Guild Meeting, on Thursday, Nov. 10th. Lori Lee Triplett, Lori Lee Triplett, Business Manager for Quilt and Textile Collections, will present - *Celebrating the Blues: Africa to America*

Explore Africa's use of indigo and the impact on America. Learn about the variety of indigo resist techniques, and expand your knowledge about indigo's impact on quilting.

There will be one workshop in November on Friday, November 11th, Lori Lee will teach *Adire: African Indigo Resist* and *Dye Workshop*

Learn more about the history of African indigo resist and the road to America. Explore and learn three different indigo resist techniques: Oniko (wrap), Alabera (stitch), and Elecko (painted). Each attendee will prepare one yard of fabric using the resist techniques of their choice. The class will then dye the fabric ready to take home and make into a



quilt. There are still openings so contact Programs to sign up.

Our December guild meeting will include a game with everyone going home with some goodies. Please bring a total of 20 strips of fabric 2.5 inches by 20 inches. Have half the strips neutrals, or backgrounds, and half any color or style. We will be playing Trader's Dice Game. Also please bring a snack type food item. We will socialize; munch on good food, and play.

As you all know our Quilt Show Planning and Roll-out can't be done without your help. Planning for Quilt Plano 2017 has already started. The attendance at the October meeting was 64 members including 2 new members and 5 guests. (See minutes for names.)





General Meeting Minutes

October 13, 2016

President Pam Wingate called the meeting to order at 6:45 pm. The minutes were approved as distributed. There being no corrections to the Treasurer's Report, it also is approved as published.

Pam explained that as President of QGP, she is allowed to present the "Lone Star Award" to individuals who have given extraordinary service to our organization. With that explanation, Pam presented the award to the members of our sewing bee, Best Fabric Friends. They are Monica Hendewerk, Martha Diehl, Jane Schwarz, Jeanne Vogel, Fran Levy and Diana Florence. This group of ladies organized and hosted the recent Quilting for Others sew day where guild members pieced and quilted all day for charity.

Rose Davis was also awarded the "Lone Star Award" from Pam for her excellent work as the chairman of "2016 Quilt Plano". Thanks to her and her committee we had a wonderful quilt show in August showcasing our work, and boosted our treasury.

Pam introduced our visiting guild, the Land O'Lakes Guild from Lewisville. They displayed their Irish Chain quilt for which they sold raffle tickets. Pam also pointed out our 2017 raffle quilt which was brought by Rose Davis.

Pam announced that our guild has two tickets for the Houston Quilt show. Everyone planning to attend placed their names in a box and the winning name drawn was Martha Jones.

Pam announced that there is only one junior (8-12 year olds) quilter who has signed up for the monthly lessons. Applications are still available. These students will have their quilts shown in the August 2017 Quilt Plano Show.

Pam called on the vice presidents for their reports. LaDawn Dalley, VP of Community Service said today starts a new year for QGP. During our previous year we donated 287 quilts, 21 afghans, 17 receiving blankets, 731 stockings, 24 taggies and hundreds of cuddle quilts. It was suggested that instructions for the flannel receiving blankets be put on our web site. LaDawn reminded us that next month is the time to turn in items that can be used by newborns.

Rose Davis, Chairperson of the Quilt Show reported that she is in need of a member to work with her for next year's show and then step up as chair for the 2018 show. Rose reported that a contract has been signed with Plano Centre for our 2017 Show. The facility has been undergoing renovation and upgrading. Of course this also came with an increase in fees.

Kay Dunn and Valerie Salter reminded us to start our mini quilts and showed the first one for our new year. These mini quilts can be 24 inches or less per side. Each quilt needs to have a sleeve for hanging at our 2017 Quilt show and a label. The mini quilts will be sold via a Silent Auction at the show. This is a major source of revenue for our guild, so all need to participate, and there is a gift for your first mini quilt that you turn in.

Aggie Meszaros reported she delivered 100 cuddle quilts last month. Fifty-two were from the Sew & Sew group. These are approximately 18 by 22 inches. She reported she makes deliveries every month or two. These go to children who are having surgery.

VP of Activities, Janet Plotkin showed a handmade Christmas ornament. She challenged each of us to make an ornament for our December exchange. Each ornament should be under 6 inches, with no visible Styrofoam. It should be packaged with no other additions.

Donna Petrick announced she is accepting money for the February Retreat. She also reminded all members to log their hours in our website for the time members spend for our volunteer activities on behalf of our guild. Making mini quilts, cuddle blankets, Christmas stockings, working at our annual quilt show, etc are all beneficial for our goals. With 30 hours logged, individuals will receive a year bar to add to their club pin. She reported we have logged over 8,000 hours. The logging of these hours is very important since this helps prove our non-profit status. John Worley offered to assist anyone who needs help entering their hours.

Debbie Seher, Chairperson of the Nine-Patch, is still collecting nine-patch blocks. They should be made from 2.5 inch squares. She asked that the blocks be made with white or light beige and a darker fabric that would read as a solid. These blocks are collected and then given to guild members who move away so they have a memento from all of us.

Co-VP of Membership, Jeanne Vogel reminded us of the "New Member Tea" on the 22nd of October. Invitations have been sent and RSVP is requested. She introduced our two new members, Jessica Huerta and Terry Cardona. Our four visitors tonight were Jackie Galubenski, Susan Brooks, Amy O'Neal and Corinne Mayborn. We have 64 members present tonight. Jeanne thanked Happiness is Quilting, Quilt Country, Not Your Mother's Quilt Shop and Quilt Asylum for the door prizes. She then ask Pam to draw for the ten door prizes.

After Show & Tell, VP of Programs, Peggy Burrell reminded us that next month our guest speaker will be Lori Lee Triplett. She will speak on "The Poos Collection Celebrating the Blues: Africa to America". There is still available space for our November workshop. She then mentioned there are still a few spaces available at this Friday and Saturday workshops with tonight's speaker, Lynn Roddy Brown. After a brief introduction Peggy turned the meeting over to our speaker for an enjoyable, enlightening program on scrap quilts.


Next meeting will be November 7 at Tinos's.
