In January **Trish Stuart** will be our speaker discussing **Color Theory**. There are two workshops available.

Freedom in Motion Workshop

The project is wool appliqué on a linen foundation, backed and bordered with burlap. Learn free motion stitching by machine in this workshop.

The nature of this design actually begs to have those little odd jumps in stitching that happen when you first try to coordinate the movement of your hands, feet and needle speed. You gradually learn to create smoothly beautiful, consistent stitching. Class time is spent learning free motion.

Curves Made Easy Workshop

If you have always thought that curves and long, narrow, sharp points were too difficult to sew, *you need to learn this fabulously simple way to sew perfect curves every single time.*

You won't have to deal with lumps, bubbles, holes where you snipped too far, warping, whether or not you have a perfect 1/4" seam, or grain lines!

In this workshop we begin with a walk through the steps on how to take your own design or favorite photo and translate it into a line drawing suitable for creating your masterpiece in fabric. Then learn this unique method which even allows you to incorporate fabrics other than cotton into your artwork.

Minis are Big Stuff!

When you think of a Mini Quilt you probably think “small”, “tiny”, maybe even “I could never do that” or even worse “not worth my time”. Well I hope to change your point of view before this article is over.

First of all did you know that working on mini quilts will greatly improve your piecing skills on normal size quilts? By necessity you will slow down, use a more consistent seam allowance and become an expert in selecting fabrics that work well together. Pressing seams will become second nature and your creativity will soar. You’ll find yourself searching for interesting borders to complement that orphan block that otherwise might end up languishing in the dark recesses of your closet or, even worse, in the trash.

A Mini Quilt can be an opportunity to try a new technique without committing to a large project. It doesn’t take much fabric and makes packing for retreat or day camp easier. Mini Quilts are always a great gift idea for friends and family for birthdays or holidays. I treasure the ones I have received and think fondly of my quilting sisters each time I look at them.

You have an excellent opportunity to wade into the inviting waters of Mini Quilts. There are 2 (two) events coming in 2017 that covet your generous efforts and offerings. The **Quilt Plano 2017 Show** and the **2017 TAQG Rally Day** each have a Mini Quilt Auction and they depend on you for their success. All hours spent in construction can be counted toward your service hours.

And did you know that the Mini Auction at 2016 Quilt Plano accounted for 17% of the total show income? So don’t dismiss the idea of making one (or more). Minis are good for you. Minis are good for your guild. **Minis are Big Stuff!**

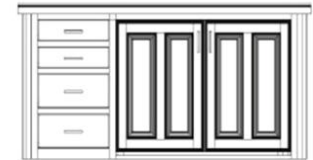

Winter approaches; it's the Holiday season! Dreams of a White Christmas fill our sleep. Yes, we want to see snow! I started to wonder how big a snowflake could get. Leave it to the Guinness Book of World Records to lead me to the answer.

On January 28, 1887, soldiers at Fort Keogh (in the western part of what was then Montana Territory) reported the largest snowflake ever seen. The soldiers reported seeing snowflakes up to **15" wide** and up to **8" thick**.

Giant flakes can be formed when wet snow falls with little wind. Flakes that have a little water on the outside easily stick together and form larger flakes. The same could happen if winds force flakes together and then back up in to the cloud, like in the formation of hail stones.

Personally, if I ever see a 15" x 8" snowflake, I'm moving to Brownsville immediately!
