
Letter from the President

The Five things that must be on a Raffle Ticket

Sec. 2002.055. TICKET DISCLOSURES. The following information must be printed on each raffle ticket sold or offered for sale:

- (1) the name of the organization conducting the raffle;
- (2) the address of the organization or of a named officer of the organization;
- (3) the ticket price;
- (4) a general description of each prize having a value of more than \$10 to be awarded in the raffle: and
- (5) the date on which the raffle prize or prizes will be awarded. Acts 1999, 76th Leg., ch. 388, Sec. 1, eff. Sept. 1, 1999. Amended by Acts 2003, 78th Leg., ch. 597, Sec. 2, eff. Sept. 1. 2003. Taken directly from the Texas Raffle Code

Quilt Republic has fabrics from the far reaching areas of the globe. For instance, Australian Aboriginal art fabrics, Batiks from Indonesia and Hand Painted fabrics from Malaysia. Studios, Kona Bay, TransPacific Polynesian fabrics, Pendleton woolens, as well as, P & B basics and Lecien brights.

In a recent trip to Hawaii to visit her Navy Submariner son, Geri discovered Polynesian Tribal Art and has recreated it in several pieces hanging in her shop today. The simple designs in reverse appliqué represent a life closely related to the ocean and island life. Geri teaches these simple forms and allows the quilt artist to interpret their own creation.



"Each sea creature has characteristics that link closely to us," explains Mrs. Campbell, " and we identify with each symbol used to invoke our story or feelings through this art form."

The secondary meeting in September was all about attracting younger people to our guilds. Here is the definition of Modern Quilting shared by Michelle Kitto of Urban Spools.

- Modern Quilting is:
- Primarily Functional quilts are made to be used
- Has lots of negative space
- Strong use of true solids (not tone-on-tone)
- Asymmetry in the blocks
- Relies less on repetition of the blocks
- May contain traditional block styles re-worked with a twist
- Often use grey or white as neutrals
- Frequently uses improvisational piecing no pattern
- Colors are bright and bold
