February Guild Meeting - Thursday, February 9th

Suzi Parron - Barn Quilts & the American Quilt Trail Movement

Suzi discovered barn quilts on a trip through Kentucky in 2008. She documented over one thousand barn quilts in the process of writing her 2012 book *Barn Quilts and the American Quilt Trail Movement*; her second book, *Following the Barn Quilt Trail*, was published in May 2016.



In her talk, Suzi will take us on a journey along the quilt trail. You will hear stories of some of the individuals who have painted quilt blocks

There will be one workshop on Saturday February 11th at Collin Creek Mall. Workshop - Suzi Parron - Barn Quilt Painting

Join the barn quilt movement by creating your own painted quilt block. You will begin with a pre-primed board and go through each step - drafting, taping, and painting, with careful attention to detail. The workshop lasts about 4 hours. You will leave with a finished quilt block or with one last color (which will be provided) to add at home. Ready for show and tell at your next meeting! The finished product will be 2-by-2 feet and is the perfect size for mounting on smaller buildings.



In March we will welcome Lisa Erlandson, and her topic will be *Making Your Best Quilt*

What does a judge see when they look at a quilt? How does an appraiser determine the value of your quilt? Lisa has an extensive collection of antique quilts that she shares during her lectures. She has spoken internationally and teaches and lectures at venues from small local guilds to national quilt shows. She also judges quilt shows ranging from county fairs to statewide shows. She is a past president of the American Quilt Study Group.

The Frisco Quilt Guild was visiting with their raffle quilt. **Minutes** were approved as written. The **Treasurers report** was also approved as written.

This coming year we will invite the non-profit groups that we support to speak with us and learn what donations are needed and how our quilts are being used. Tonight Isabel Garcia from **Isabel's Community Outreach** explained how she started her program and the uses found for the sewing machines, materials etc. and how these items have helped the individuals with whom she works to learn life skills.

Rose informed the membership that the **Show committee** is hard at work and is proud to announce a new co-chair, Pam Crocker! The Raffle tickets will be available in February. Board of Directors Meeting Minutes

January 9, 2016

Called to order by President Pam Wingate. In attendance were: Pam Wingate, Jane Schwarz, Dena Smith, Jeanne Vogel, LaDawn Dalley, Janet Plotkin, Diana Florence, Denise Green, Sherry Worley, Rose Davis, and Tina Connolly.

Pam ask for corrections or additions to the **minutes**. There being none, the minutes were approved. Rose reported the Secretary's book was in the storage unit that needs to go to Denise, in addition to her keeping a hard copy of all of the minutes in a notebook for easy reference for QGP.

There was discussion about the costs of operating annually, the amount to insure continual operations, and if any overage that would allow cash donations to other non-profit groups. The **Treasurer's report** was approved as presented. The Executive Board gave Jane a big "Thank you" for her careful attention to detail as our Financial officer. Jane is going to set up an Amazon Smile account for QGP that would allow the guild to receive a small portion of Amazon Smile sales.

Membership co-chairs, Jeanne & Diana reported about 75 new members and approximately 75 members that did not renew annually, so we have no growth in members, maintaining at 200 members. New name badges for our officers are in the plans. New yard signs will be posted at our new meeting location.

Program co-chair, Dena Smith reported there would be no hotel fees this month. Setup at Collin Creek Mall will be at 8:30 with workshops starting at 9 am. There will be signs and brochures at the mall to answer "who we are " for passersby. Dena reported she and Peggy Burrell are already working on 2018 programs and will work with two members that want to shadow before taking over the 2018 term of officers.

Community Service, LaDawn reported receiving some fabric which she sorted and passed it along to groups that might be able to use it. She ordered 2,000 labels (\$150.) to be attached to our donated quilts which along with our name, includes our website and mailing address. Our Guild projects are: **Soldiers' Angels** (Christmas stockings), **Children's Medical Center of Plano** (cuddle quilts), **Collin County Children's Advocacy Center**

(small quilts), **My Friend's House** (medium quilts), **The Turning Point: Rape Crisis Center of Collin County** (largest quilt), **Plano Children's Medical Center** (flannel receiving blankets), **Isabel's Community Outreach** (fabric & sewing supplies), **Plano Animal Shelter** and **My Possibilities** (both using scraps to make dog beds). We deleted Plano School-age Parent Program and Cuddled with Love.

We discussed adding garment or duffle bags for veterans to carry their clothes in when they leave treatment centers.

Guild Activities, Janet reports she will have a charm to award to each member who brings a friend to Thursday's meeting. It is a good time to contact quilters and invite them to join us at our new, convenient location and start a new year together

Media, Tina reports continual work on our Facebook page, with a new setup.

It will cover the quilt show and retreats.

Quilt Show, Rose reports the raffle tickets and business cards will be ready Thursday. Her Show committee is working hard and there is still a need for a co-chair. It was suggested that the show committee add at least a couple more people to relieve the amount of work involved on the chairperson.


Newsletter, Sherry asked each officer and committee chair to please be aware of the deadline for submitting all information for our newspaper by the third Thursday of each month.
